RICK'S TIPS: Most members keep their cars lubed (or greased) to protect suspension components from wear and premature failure. However, a few areas of concern involve door hinges and trunk hinges that are often neglected. Some people feel that the best way to keep these in good working order is to use grease. Once smeared or sprayed however, grease will collect dirt and form a small or large dirt clog. Oil on the other hand will not collect dirt as easily and can be kept in just those areas as is needed. To determine what parts need oiling, move the door back and forth to determine what moves. Oil everything that moves in the hinges. Another area of the door that requires oiling is the latch mechanism at the end of the door. Squirt oil in this area and wipe off excess with a rag. Trunk hinges should also be oiled. To oil these, open up the trunk and move the lid up and down. This will show you the areas where metal rubs and where oil should be applied. Questions? Call 8-5 at 222-8481.
