If you get a little satisfaction out of running through the gears off the line at a traffic light or taking those S-curves just a little fast on your way home from work, you'll appreciate the thrills and spills every Friday night at Southside Speedway. Three classes of cars put on a real exciting display of driving skills and sportsmanship that can't be beat for \$7 per person. When you approach the main gate the sounds of racing engines fill your ears and the odor of burning rubber fills the air. Cooler and refreshments (including beer) are permitted; your cooler is inspected for the only prohibited item...glass containers. When the gates open at 6 P.M. each of the three classes get the track for practice rounds. Practice or not, these drivers are serious.

At 8 P.M. the racing action begins. First the "heats" to determine the lineups for the features. At least three features are run. The 1st feature is 15 laps for mini-stocks: Mustang II's, Capris', Arrows, Colts, Pintos', Lynx', and Rabbits etc. The 2nd feature usually run 25 laps for modified street cars (regular production cars with roll bars and racing modifications are limited); primarily mid-sized type cars like Mustangs, Chevell's, Malibu's, and Mayricks etc. The 3rd class of cars, late-model class usually run 50 laps. They're specifically built for racing; tube frames, non-production parts are permitted and the sheet metal is applied last, it must match the type late-model engine under the hood; be it Mustang, Camaro or Thunderbird etc.

Have you ever wanted to slow down the onslaught of rust? Proper cleaning will go a long way to heading rust off. This issue I will concentrate on protecting the fenders only. Tips on the rest of the car will appear in upcoming issues. Dirt will accumulate and clog factory drain holes located in the lower edge of the fenders and at the upper cowl area (the grille area near the bottom of the windshield).

First, run water into the upper cowl grille openings on either side. Let the water run for a couple of minutes. This will usually clean the openings. You can tell when it is clean when water is coming out at the bottom of both fenders. If water is coming out under the dash inside the car you will need to have the cowl panel repaired.

Once the upper cowl panel drains are clear, the next step is to clear the drains at the bottom of the fenders. Begin by removing the bolts at the very bottom of the fenders. Be careful not to break these off; penetrating oil will help to loosen them. Once the bolts are out, use a flash light to look at the fenders inside. You will need to turn your front tires in to get a good look. Use plenty of water with a nozzle to flush the dirt out from around the inside bracing. A coat hanger or any pointed object will help. Once dirt is flushed away and the fender has dried, use a can of spray paint to spray the inside of the fenders (silver is best). A couple of good heavy coats are recommended. Bolt fenders back in place and wa-la the fenders will last another 20 yrs.

Whenever you wash the car always run water in the upper cowl grille on either side to help keep these passages clear.


FUN AT ALL FORD DAY





Eric volunteered to finance the project and said caps would be available at the next meeting. The car show has been set for Saturday Sept. 6th at the AJD parking lot off Jeff-Davis Hwy. CYMC PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

The following items are proposed changes to the current Club By-Laws to be voted on at the August 6th meeting.

- 1. ARTICLE 1-Section 1: The general purpose of the Central Virginia Mustang Club-is-as an incorporated, non-profit society, and hereinafter called the Club, shall be to promote the safe and enjoyable use of our vehicles all Mustangs, and to preserve and authentically maintain Mustang and Shelby automobiles, and to serve as a regional source of information concerning these motor cars for the benefit of its members as well as the general public.
- 2. ARTICLE 1-Section 2: In order to facilitate the general purposes, Club automobiles shall be classified as Mustangs. This classification shall include any vehicle utilizing a Mustang chassis manufactured by the Ford Motor Company, and incorporated ing a body which was of unique design, outstanding features, or unusual factory custom styling.
- 3. ARTICLE II—Section 2: The official emblem of the Club shall consist of an outline of the State of Virginia with a facsimile of the Mustang emblem with "Central Virginia<u>l" arched over the state with "</u>Mustang Club" inscribed just under the outline of the State.
- 4. ARTICLE Y-Section 2: Election of officers shall be held at the first meeting in December November with installation of new officers at the beginning of the November Manuary.
- 5. ARTICLE V-Section 3: All elected officers shall serve for a term of one (1) year subject to re-election. The office of President shall be limited to two (2) consecutive years.
- 6. ARTICLE VII—Section 4: In the event of the Central Virginia Mustang Club disbanding, all monies on hand will be donated to the Mustang Club of America to a local charity as voted by the Board of Directors].
- 7. ARTICLE VIII—Section 3: Dues shall be paid upon entry into the Club and then annually at the rate of \$10.00 per member (which includes voting spouse) on January 1. Anniversary dues date will appear on the member newsletter mailing label. Members more than sixty (60) days delinquent in their dues will be automatically dropped from membership in the Club.

- 8. ARTICLE IX—Section 2: Expenditures up to fifty dellars (\$50.00) [five hundred dollars \$500.00] may be authorized with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- 9. ARTICLE IX-Section 3: Expenditures over fifty dellars (\$50.00) [five hundred dollars \$500.00] must go before the membership with 51% approval of the members present.
- 10. ARTICLE XI-Section 3: Voting shall be by a show of hands and accurate count to be taken by the Secretary if necessary.
- 11. ARTICLE XII—Section 1: Any proposed amendments shall be mailed to each member fifteen (15) days [in the Newsletter] prior to the meeting at which time the said amendments shall be voted upon.
- 12. ARTICLE XII—Section 4: The By—Laws will be reviewed once every two (2) years by the membership in the month of Nevember June of every even year with a thirty (30) day grace period.
- 13. ARTICLE XIII—Section 2: The following Committees shall be appointed at the first regular business meeting or as indicated at the commencement of the newly elected officers:
- A. Membership (Vice President)
- B. Activities & Fundraising (Picnics, Cruises & Parades)
- C. Publicity & Newsletter
- D. Sponsors
- E. Judging
- F. Awards & Trophies
- G. Refreshments/Entertainment
- 14. ARTICLE XIII—Section 3: Other committees may be appointed as the President deems necessary. The Auditing Committee shall be appointed in September [prior to a new Treasurer taking office]. The Nominations Committee shall be apointed in Nevember [October].
