CANNONBALL SPEC's

As promised, here are some must's and must not's of the C/B Rally:
ELIGIBILITY: 21 Yrs Old w/ U S Drivers License. Minimin 2- Max. 3-Man Crews. **ENTRY FEE:** \$1,000.
ROUTE: 8,000 Miles, one layover May 7th (the only stop in the event).
VEHICLE: Must pass safety inspection, have restraints and legal tires w/full tread. Operable lighting, extra OK. Carry Event-Sponsor ID but NO advertisements, trademarks, service or product recognition (unless exempted). Carry survival gear: water, flashlights, temporary shelter, signaling devices, knife, food. Must have flairs & fire extinguisher and regualr operable equipment. All items must be secured. NO: auxiliary fuel tanks, undersized wheels or tires. No support vehicles and/or personnel.
PERMITTED: Extra instruments, interior lighting, modified seats, roll bars, harnesses, rally computer, etc.
INSURANCE: \$250,000 minimum liability.
EVENT FORMAT: 3 Segments; Average Speed Leg (A/S) with exact routes and speeds and secret checkpoints; Transit Leg (T/L) with exact routes but no specific speeds and exact beginning and ending checkpoints; and Free Leg (F/L) without selected routes or speeds and early arrival permitted.
PENALTIES: A/S, 1 Point Early or Late. T/L 60 points/minute or fraction early or late. F/L 60 points/minute early or late with adjustmt request for early.
TIMING: US Bureau of Stds. at prevailling local times, involving 4 time zones using military time.
SCORING: Points will determine finishing positions. Points=Seconds. 3600/Hour.
INSTRUCTIONS: Written in plain English. No tricks.
TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS may cause disqualification.
WINNING is by the least accumulation of penalty points and awarded \$25,000.

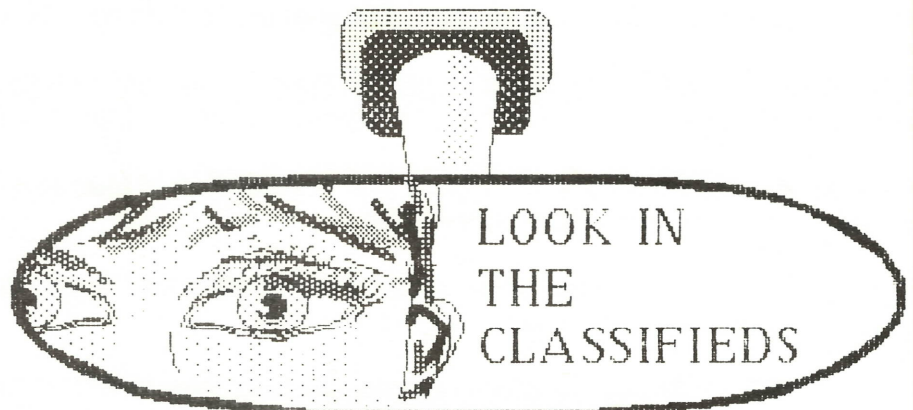

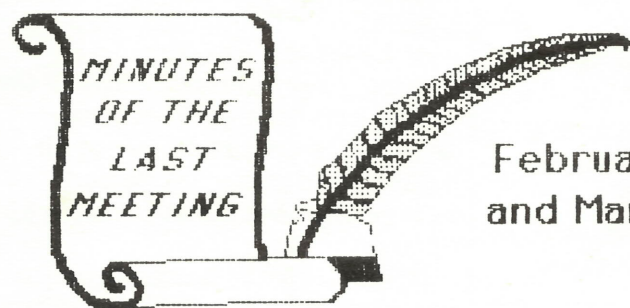

Treasurer's Report was given by Bob Leipertz. As of 1/31/86 the total is \$1,794.44. Our membership is up to 128 and dues are now being taken for the current year membership. Committee Reports were next. Chesterfield Mall show, chaired by Leroy Lilly, reported the show is February 22 and 23 and he needed to get the names, phone numbers and cars that are participating. Sponsors: Everyone is encouraged to let us know if there is any company willing to help out Club members by honoring discounts, etc. Refreshments: Connie Callahan said door prizes have run out—please donate. Judging: Carroll Lipscomb, "in the works". Membership: Bob Leipertz, 128 members to date. Publicity & Newsletter: Tina Fritz, "Thanks" to the people who contributed to the last newsletter. All contributions are urged. Working on Federal Tax ID number in order to qualify as a Tax Exempt Corporation. Then we can get the postal permit but we must have at least 200 members for a bulk mailing. NOTE: "Special Thanks" to all helpers at the Stars and Cars Show. It brought in \$220 to the Club treasury. Also "Special Thanks" to Kent Callahan for handling the Club

jackets. Old Business: We now have a Corporate Seal. New Business: Membership goal is 200. Applications can be obtained from Bob Leipertz, Terry Wagner or Tina Fritz. Membership cards and Club stationary are at the printers. The NASCAR folks at Martinsville only want Pontiac's for their race day parade (ha!). The drawing held for the oil filters were won by Allen Brough and Kenny Fischer. The guest speaker was Jim Gladson. He gave a very interesting talk on a "Real Cannonball" cross country race that he's entered. Uniroyal and B F Goodrich are sponsoring this time + distance event of stars starting in Detroit May 3 thru 11. It will run 8,000 miles and will end up at the starting line. The entry fee is \$1,000/car. Numerous factory sponsors have helped the participants. At this time there are 110 entrants. Jim will be

participating and will be back afterwards to let the Club know "how is goes". NBC will air a one-hour special on Sunday, May 25 at 3:00 p.m. and on April 27 the "New York Times" will have a special supplement on the event. The winner will receive \$25,000. Mr. Gladson will return to future meetings to keep us updated and let us know when and where the race will be passing through Virginia, so if possible, we can be there with banners, jackets, shirts and anything else to show him our support. Scott Gresham advised us that the Early Ford V-8 Club will have All Ford Day Get-Together on Saturday, June 7th at Ingleside Farm in the Old Church area. A flyer with all of the information will be out next week (see Calendar for details). Tina made a plea for members to submit material to the newsletter. BREAK at 8:05. Meeting called back to order at 8:25. Tina asked for our new Club members to stand up and be recognized. Carroll Lipscombe had a short "Show and Tell" about the popularity of the '64 1/2 Mustang. When it was

GOOD ADVICE FROM OUR MARCH SPEAKER!

The Guest Speaker at our March 5th meeting was Rick Nohta, owner and operator of "RICK'S RESTORATIONS, INC." in the Sandston, Virginia area. Expert services are offered such as body and paint work, sandblasting, glass beading and most important - free advice for the do-it-your-selfers. Rick spoke about how to determine the value of your car. It's most important to establish the value of your car before it is questioned due to accident, theft or sales transaction. In the case of an accident, you must be prepared to prove your claimed value in a court of law for reimbursement.

There are many resources at your fingertips to help in determining the value of your Mustang. Locate classified advertisements from local papers such as the "Trading Post", "Trading Times" or "Richmond Times Dispatch" or "Richmond News Leader". If you have a rare model car, the "Hemmings Motor News" or "Mustang Buyers Guide" can be helpful.

Each and every receipt for maintenance and parts should be retained. Even the time spent repairing, cleaning and maintaining the car should be well documented.

Photographs are extremely important. Take clear photos of the front, back and both sides as

well as the interior, trunk and engine.

All of this documentation is also helpful when trying to insure your "classic". Speak to the Claims Manager of your insurance company to get an established value on paper before that accident (God forbid) occurs.

IN SUMMARY, keep accurate records and keep it clean. (Dirt seals in problems.) If you're involved in an accident and you have printed proof of the market value of your car with accurate, supporting documentation, pursue your case in court. The courts usually side with the policyholder where proof is presented. Donna M. Seay

FORD FUN FACTS

Did you know that funds were approved for the production of the Mustang Sept. 10, 1962. Press introduction came on April 13, 1964 and was officially introduced to the general public on April 17, 1964. One day after it's introduction, a Mustang was used as a Pace Car in Huntsville, Alabama for a stock car race--enticing nine thousand fans to jump the fence to see this new automobile. More than 22,000 orders were taken nationally in the very first week. Within 4 months after the Mustang introduction, over 100,000 had been sold. A legend is born and still going strong 20 years later.
