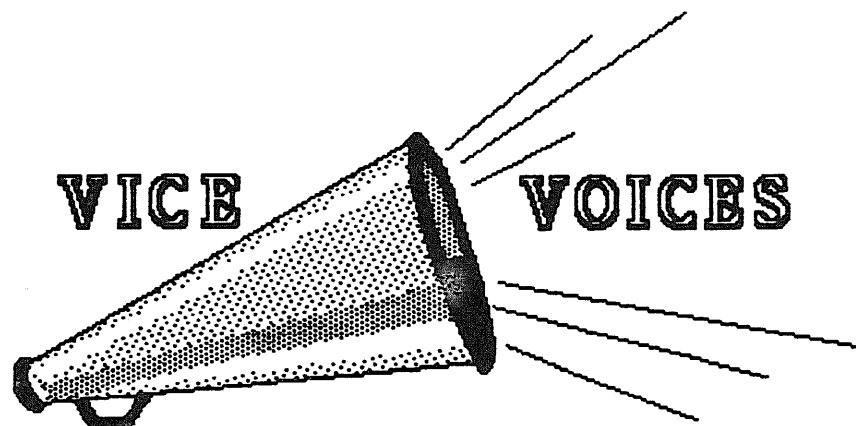

Reproduction Sheet Metal -VS- Ford Sheet Metal

It seems there are many articles now days on the reproduction sheet metal that is available to the Mustang enthusiast. Having read a number of these articles I decided to purchase a couple of pieces to investigate the information in the articles. Some of what I learned was not reported in the articles.

Both reproductions sheet metal and Ford sheet metal are similar in thickness. However if you pick-up a Ford fender verses a reproduction fender there is a difference in weight. It is slight, but it is there. The Ford is heavier.

Ford sheet metal when compared to the reproduction pieces have sharper definition in the creases with lines more pronounced. When placed side by side, the Ford piece just looks better.

One thing about Ford sheet metal is it fits. It just fits. It doesn't almost fit. It fits. The reproduction sheet metal can be a bit hard to fit. It is not unusual to have to enlarge a hole with a drill to get the piece to go where it is supposed to.

Having been a claims adjuster for a couple of years it was not unusual to hear a body shop complain of reproduction sheet metal not fitting and the shop refusing to ever use anymore of it again. . . ever. If you do use reproduction sheet metal, it will take more time to mount the piece in most cases. Reproduction pieces are not always the same. One may fit better than the one before it.

The reproduction sheet metal is softer than Ford sheet metal and premature rusting often occurs. The question here is what's premature failure and why does it apply to the reproduction sheet metal. Well, since the metal is softer it will rust quicker. It will dent easier and in the advent of an accident, it will be damaged more. This is due to its tensile strength: it's ability to pop back out after being dented. The reproduction sheet metal must be hammered back out; where as Ford's sheet metal will often times pop back out except when badly creased. (Bodyman Wallace Cox was consulted on the above comparisons). Even so, some suppliers guarantee against premature failure of their panels in their sales promotion.

I have saved the most noticeable comparison for last. Ford sells its 1965-66 quarter panels for \$250 approximately. The reproduction quarter panels are around \$150. All reproduction pieces are so much lower priced than Ford's that the price itself is the greatest difference between the two.

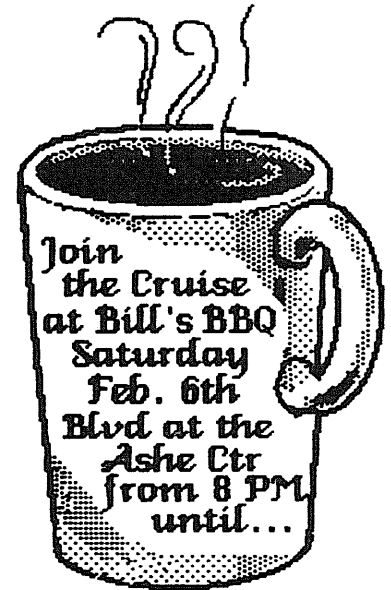
Upcoming events were discussed. It was noted that there was a car show at the Va. Beach Convention Center Jan. 15, 16, 17, & 18, 1988.

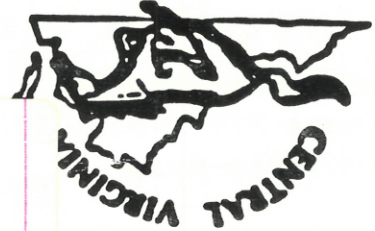
