## CYMC CAR SHOW BENEFITS HOMELESS

The most popular Club event of the year is only weeks away. To avoid the threat of unpredictable weather, the show is being held August 13th this year. A secondary benefit to the change of date will be the inclusion of our college members who will still be home for summer.

There are several changes in principle to the show. As a community contribution, the Club has decided to ask for a \$2 donation at the gate or the contribution of household, clothing or office items for admission to benefit RICHMOND'S FREEDOM HOUSE for the homeless and dislocated.

The most needed items are men's underwear, socks and shoes. In the kitchen they need pots and pans, small baggies, trash bags, plastic and stainless forks and spoons, foil, paper products and cleaning products. They also have need of bathroom and laundry items such as bleach, disposable razors, towels & washcloths, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, cologne, Q-tips, lotion and shampoo. The office needs postage stamps, white-out, legal pads, bus tickets, masking tape, glue sticks...and the list goes on and on. Just remember this is like running a huge home, anything that is used in a home is needed for the Freedom House.

The Freedom House serves between 150 and 200 needy people on a daily basis by providing meals, shower facilities, laundry, and clothing. If you are interested in further information or donating your personal time, call Tina Fritz.



## Rick's Tips

#### Volume 13 PART IV: FINDING THE MONEY ACOUIRING THAT SPECIAL CAR

Banks will sometimes lend money on the car itself. You must have an appraisal on the car. The Club has people who do appraise cars both for insurance and purchasing (Carroll Lipscombe comes to mind). Banks usually require 20% down.

If you are fortunate enough to own a home, a second mortgage can be used to get money. Some banks will loan money if you put up another car you own. This worked for me. Still other banks will loan money if you can come up with a co-signer who has collateral. Parents are a good source.

Cash is the best way. Interest raises the purchase price. I would suggest making a list of things you can sell. Ask a low selling price for each and start running ads, yard sales, swap meetings, flea markets, etc.

The last way and probably the worst way to get the the money is to take a partner. Family members seem to work. If you go halves with a friend you are asking for trouble. Usually after a purchase, problems occur with the car and friendships go sour. I did know 2 men who over a 15 year period purchased over 40 cars together. They remained friends until the older of the two passed away. I do feel that the friendship was strained.

The final issue of purchasing a car will deal with the actual purchase and some tips on exchanging the money for the car.


