

### Rick's tips

#### Repro Floor Pans...

**Almost all Mustang magazines list reproduction floor pans fit 65 - 70 Mustangs. I have found this to be untrue.**

**The 64 1/2 cars have deeper pans than 65 - 66 cars and the floor pans must be reshaped to fit the deeper floor. The 64 1/2 cars have floors about 1/2" lower.**

**The 65 -66 cars have the same floor pans and the reproduction floors do fit best in these years. Convertible pieces such as torque boxes, and inner rockers are approximately off one to two inches and must trimmed to fit.**

**Alot of people feel the 67 - 68 Mustang floor is the same as the 65 - 66. This is not true. A close inspection will show differences at the rear spring plate and behind front rails.**

**The 69 - 70 Mustang floors are close but again differences are there. The front floor pans in the 69 -70 cars do not have drain holes like the 65 - 68 cars. This area must be cut out of the repro floors and reconstructed to duplicate the original.**

**Before replacing a section of floor, acomparision of the repro floor and the original floor is needed to determine irregularities.**

FOR THE RACING COLLECTOR-MAXX UPDATE

The 1992 MAXX race cards sets are beginning to show up on the market. MAXX'S offering this year can be a little confusing. This is MAXX's 5th anniversary. This year MAXX is releasing three sets in honor of their anniversary.

The 5th Anniversary Deluxe Set or known as the "black set" can only be purchased directly from the MAXX mail order division. In my opinion this is the best buy for MAXX 1992. The "black set" includes 300 gold stamped cards with "black" borders, a 5th anniversary edition album with pages to hold a complete set, and a gold stamped storage unit. These sets are numbered and are limited to a production of 92,092. As a bonus, also included, is a 10 card set illustrated by Sam Bass. The Sam Bass set will be sent to you in the summer by MAXX. This 10 card set is only available with a purchase of the "black set" directly from MAXX. These items are only available as a set and directly from MAXX. These items will not be sold wholesale to any retail outlets. In other words, your local retailer will have to purchase these Deluxe Sets at the same retail price as you pay. You will see these sets in retail outlets at inflated prices. Get yours directly from MAXX. In my opinion this "black set" will be the best MAXX investment since the 1988 1st printing and the 1989 "tool box" set.

The mass market, retailers such as Wal-Mart and your local memorbrilla shops will carry the MAXX "red" card sets. This set includes the same photos as the "black set", however, with red borders instead of black, and with no gold stamping. These cards will be available in the 300 card sets and 14 card wax packs.

MAXX has also authorized several trading card shops to offer a very limited number of the "black" sets. These sets are boxed differently from the Deluxe "black" set, unnumbered and do not include the Sam Bass cards. If you want this set, look around, prices will probably vary quite a bit from dealer to dealer. This set may also become a good investment.

Also, the 14 card wax packs will contain randomly inserted MAXX cards from 1988 to 1991. You may be lucky enough to come across MAXX'S most wanted from 1988, Phil Parsons-no Marcia. This could be an extra incentive to purchase the 1992 wax packs for those of you who started collecting after the much desired cards of 1988-1989 were released.

Also, released in January was 25,000 Bill Elliott 1992 sample, 2 card sets. These sets went to MAXX club members. This 2 card set includes the Bill Elliott '92 card in red and black with the words "sample" indicated. This two card set retails for around \$75.00. No!!! My set is not for sale.

I'll update you next month on other card sets and memobrilla that are available. New items are being released every day.

# Cleaning up: State road volunteers rank No. 2 in U.S.

Maybe it's civic pride. Possibly effective advertising. Whatever it is, in less than four years Virginia has developed the nation's second-largest voluntary program of its kind for roadside cleanups.

Those little blue signs bearing the names of individuals and civic groups that have volunteered to keep Virginia roadsides clean have multiplied dramatically, according to state transportation officials.

More than 90,000 bags were filled with litter picked up along Virginia roadsides in 1991 as part of the state's Adopt-a-Highway program.

Since the program was started by the state Department of Transportation in 1988, the voluntary work of individuals and organizations has saved the state more than \$1.5 million in highway maintenance costs allocated for litter pickup.

More than 5,200 individuals, families, civic groups and businesses of all kinds have volunteered to clear litter along 12,270 miles of state-maintained highways. Only North Carolina has a larger volunteer program, with 7,000 people involved.

The department asks volunteers to make a two-year commitment to pick up litter on certain stretches of road at least four times yearly. Volunteers receive safety

vests and bags to pick up trash, and the Transportation Department erects signs along the highway with the names of the organizations or individuals who have volunteered to keep it litter free.

The program, far from leveling off since it began, is still growing. It jumped by 50 percent from 1990 to 1991, said Andy Farmer, department spokesman for the Richmond district.

Farmer said he believed that participation was spurred by the signs naming the organizations and individuals who volunteered to pick up litter.

Most groups volunteer to clean up a 2-mile section of highway, but one group in Hanover County has adopted a 6-mile stretch, he said.

In the 14-county Richmond highway district, 696 groups and 35 individuals have signed up to clean 1,729 miles of roads and five interstate highway interchanges.

Chesterfield County leads the district with 122 organizations and five individuals cleaning up 338 miles of highway and three interchanges, while Hanover is second with 101 groups and four individuals keeping 246 miles clean.

Henrico County has 46 organizations picking up litter on 97 miles of state highways. The county maintains most of its own roads and conducts its own litter cleanup program with civic groups.
