Barbara Hobgood is the original owner of a '66 daily driver, Wayne Myers owns a '66 coupe and a '67 coupe, and Scott Atwater owns a '66 coupe in which he was driven home from the hospital when he was born that was originally owned by his grandfather and a '93 5.0. Birthday greetings were extended to those members born in the month of June.

Guest speaker Nancy Jackson of Country Seasons Flag Designs in Mechanicsville described her work and what she could make for club members. 
Technical Questions: Regarding '67 289 2V heating problem-- suggest a 6-blade fan, fan shroud, and a 180° thermostat.

Summit Point continued

One of the nicest times I had at Summit Point was the rides that were given at lunch time. The cost to go once around the track was five dollars. I rode the first time in Penske's 1968 Lola T-70 which is a mid engine Chevrolet powered Car-Am car. To say the least it was fast even if it had a chevy 350 in it. I did notice the webber carbs on the car they were 58mm side drafts- these are about two thousand dollars a peice, there were 4 on the car.

The second car I rode in was a 427 SC Cobra and though the Lola was faster the cobra a street car was no slouch.

There were six Shelbys & Trans-Am Mustangs giving rides out there and they didn't hold back a bit. Among the mustangs giving rides were two Gt350 Race models a 1965 Shelby, a 1965 1/2 Shelby, and three 65-66 Trans-Am nochbacks. These guys were doing 4 wheel drifts into the corners and 250 people were waiting in line for rides. The money collected during the lunch time rides are donated to charity. The Blue & Grey Challenge takes place in September.

FINISHES FOURTH AT LIME ROCK**

**Three-Car Effort Planned for Road America
As Tim Allen Readies For High-Speed Action**

LAKEVILLE, CT -- (June 1, 1995) Legendary racer Bob Bondurant earned a fourth-place finish for the Saleen/Allen "RRR" Speedlab team at the SCCA World Challenge Series' latest stop: the New England Dodge Dealers' 250 at Lime Rock Park, Connecticut.

Starting sixth in a high-performance Saleen Mustang SR, Bondurant recorded a fastest lap of 90.419 mph average for the 1.53-mile course.

"Bob's performance was especially significant for our new team," said Saleen/Allen "RRR" Speedlab President Steve Saleen. "This gives us real momentum for the balance of the year."

The first two venues for the Speedlab team of Saleen and Bondurant were at Phoenix International Raceway and Mosport Park in Ontario, Canada. Saleen finished seventh and Bondurant retired with a fuel leak at Phoenix. Mosport Park found Saleen and Bondurant in third and seventh positions, respectively, when both vehicles, in separate incidents, were forced out of competition in on-track collisions with four laps to go. Extensive repairs for Saleen's vehicle precluded his ability to compete at Lime Rock.

With those problems resolved and repairs well underway, Saleen is confident that his team will generate strong results in the months ahead. "Given the quality of these vehicles and the proficiencies of our driving team, I'm excited about our chances for the rest of the series," he stated.

On July 8, Saleen, #55, and Bondurant, #65, will be joined at Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin's Road America Raceway by "Home Improvement" star Tim Allen, #75, who will make his debut in the SCCA series.
