The May meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order by President Kenny Fischer at 7:35 PM. Birthday greetings were extended to those with celebrations in the month of May. We have had a request from Richmond Ford to please park to the rear of the building and leave the front spaces for customers.

Second Vice-president Susan Morris reported 62 paid members. National Director Paul Oliver was not present. Treasurer George Cosier reported a beginning balance of \$1631.72 minus \$101.05 (printing newsletter & show flyers) minus \$23.31 (phone) plus \$338.50 (RIR tickets & dues) for a final balance of \$1845.86.
