



As many of you are aware, MCA's bylaws have been under review for eighteen (plus) months. In some of my newsletters, I have asked you, the Regional Directors if you would read through the present bylaws and send me your questions, ideas and responses. Once I got some of your thoughts, I then came back to you for some of your honest inputs and suggestions to your ideas. I must say, I was overwhelmed with the concern and thought that many of you put in your research. We took your ideas to MCA's Bylaws Committee along with inputs from National Directors and began our work.

Once everything was laid out on the table, we asked the Executive Committee if we could in essence do what would be considered a rewrite so we could make grammatical corrections, additions and deletions throughout the document, as suggested by professors in parliamentary law and MCA's legal consultant.

Once completed, the whole package was to be presented to the Board of Directors requesting further ideas and concerns prior to taking a final vote on the changes before sending them to all clubs to review and vote on.

We took the existing bylaws and did a line-by-line analysis. Lots of teleconferences; lots of professor and lawyer questions/comments and loads of e-mails between committee members. I appreciate the hard work that they all put forth reading a document several times, looking for better wording, less wording where needed, streamlining, etc. It was, for lack of better wording, an experience!

After consulting with several members on the National Board of Directors and officers, the whole packet was e-mailed to the full board in the last week of August and then at the past National Meeting, we discussed what our findings were, made some more changes/deletions and presented a final product. It was a great meeting with the Board, lots of high spirited and informative questions, comments and concerns. That also mattered a lot in the final product.

This week, I will send an advance copy of the finished product along with a sheet explaining the changes to you via e-mail. You will soon get it in the mail with a proxy ballot to vote on it. It will be an accept/reject vote for the whole package and this will give you time to ask any questions before the deadline to mail it in. I realize sometimes when we read things, it doesn't sound clear or may even sound different than what we think it's intention is, so I will want time to go ahead and field your questions and concerns so you can be an informed voter.

Remember, if your club has a new President or Regional Director; please let me know so I can update your MCA web page links!

News From The CCCCVa

Let's think back to 10 years ago, before this council was formed. Antique vehicles could only be driven to and from shows and to take in for repairs. The only antique license plate was the big black one with white letters. Localities could tax vehicles registered as antiques if they wished. Vehicles in Northern Virginia had to be smog tested even if they were 25 or more years old. If you stored parts or future project vehicles hidden in your own back yard you could be fined and the vehicles could even be removed and destroyed.

Now let's look at how things are today. You have a choice of two different antique plates (the old black and white and the new orange plate that is sized for more modern vehicles and there is one for motorcycles) and can use vintage plates for cars up to 1974. You are allowed 250 miles of pleasure driving each day even if your vehicle is registered as an antique. There is no mileage limit if you are going to or from an event. Localities can no longer tax any vehicle registered as an antique. Vehicles 25 years old and older do not have to go through smog testing. It took three tries in the General Assembly but we now can store parts and future project cars hidden in our own backyards.

Also consider that antique vehicle registration is a one-time fee and there are no annual fees as some states have. You also can purchase antique full coverage insurance at a much lower rate than for daily drivers. Safety inspections for vehicles registered as antiques is optional.

Ten years ago if you wanted to find a car show to attend you looked in the "Antiques and Classics" section of the classifieds for the Richmond newspaper. Now anyone can go to the council website and find several shows within driving distance on nearly any weekend. There are now several cruise-ins to select from on Friday, Saturday and even Sunday evenings.

Communications between the car clubs have improved greatly since the formation of the councils in this state. Last year's Polar Bear Run was attended by over 90 hobbyists from about a dozen clubs. Ten years ago clubs didn't join together to participate in events like they do today.

The formation of the car councils had definitely had a big positive impact on the hobby in this state. Why bring this up now? Because the officers of the councils can't do it all by ourselves. We need your participation in the October 25th legislative forum.

Hobbyists need to thank Senator Quayle and the members of the general Assembly for fighting for the rights we want. This is your opportunity to show that when the officers of the council say hundreds or even thousands of hobbyists are behind us there really are lots of hobbyists. We can't have a successful forum and keep the legislators watching out for us without your attendance at the forum.

Please mark your calendar now for Monday October 25th. I know it's easier to sit on the sofa with a remote control in your hand than it is to get in the car and drive to the forum. But think back at how things would be if no council were ever formed in Virginia. Do you think things would be as they are now?
