### Ford Shelby GR-1 Hints At The Future Execs May Look To Build Second Supercar

[Ford Motor Co.](#)'s storied relationship with racing legend Carroll Shelby has inspired the development of a third high-performance concept car in two years — the Ford Shelby GR-1.

Unveiled at the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance Thursday, the two-seat fastback features the same dynamic underpinnings as the Ford Shelby Cobra shown at the North American International Auto Show in January.

It also shares engineering advances the automaker developed for the 2002 GT40 concept car, which led to the 2005 production Ford GT Supercar.

"The Ford Shelby Cobra concept was a small step in our plans for the Ford GT Supercar architecture," said J Mays, group vice president of design at Ford. "The Ford Shelby GR-1 is a giant leap toward the future."

The automaker hasn't confirmed plans to market a second Supercar. But Ford executives have said the company's investment in the GT warrants at least one more program based on its design.

Ford began shipping the \$140,000 GT to dealers last month and it's already sold out, underscoring the viability of the exotic car market — even during uncertain economic times.

[DaimlerChrysler AG](#) unveiled a two-seat Supercar — the ME Four Twelve — at the Detroit auto show. And there are signs that it will go into production.

"The sports car market is not going to go away, no matter what happens," said George Saridakis, the designer of the GR-1. "You're beginning to see cars which have got a little bit more soul and some history associated to them."

The GR-1, which features a 605-horsepower, V-10 engine, was built atop a spare chassis originally assembled during the Shelby Cobra's development. It's both a tribute to Carroll Shelby and a nod to time-honored sports car proportions, Saridakis said.

"What this car represents is a truly classic sporty proportion — the engine really up front, the wide wheels, the track, the short wheelbase, the relatively short overhang."

Saridakis spent his early childhood in Greece before moving to Scotland.

"I have an affinity to both the vibrant and passionate Mediterranean culture and also the more restrained yet dynamic Scots," said Saridakis, 33, who works out of Ford's advanced product creation center in California.

A graduate of Glasgow University with a degree in aeronautical engineering, Saridakis said the GR-1 "has been in the back of my head" since he was a boy.



"When you're growing up and you have a passion for cars like I do, all you do every day in school is draw cars on your jotter," Saridakis said.

"George produced this completely resolved sketch — the best I've seen in 10 years," Mays said.

Normally, initial sketches are reworked repeatedly before a clay model is made.

## News From MCA

Mustang Club of America National Board of Directors Meeting

President Bill Johnson called the meeting to order. Secretary Beverly Bragg called the roll and announced a quorum was present. Regional Directors and guests were asked to stand and introduce themselves, stating their name, club affiliation and where they were from.

Mr. Johnson welcomed everyone and thanked them for coming. He spoke about MCA's task and goal. MCA is dedicated to helping others. Mr. Johnson asked that we remember in our prayers our members, Randy Jacobson and Kay Kleschka who are recovering from surgery and illness. Congratulations to the folks in Biloxi. They put on a wonderful National Show. Mr. Johnson expressed his appreciation to the entire BOD for their dedication and help during the past several years. Our future tasks for MCA are serious matters and will require just as much if not more effort from the BOD and MCA's members.

Mr. Johnson presented the resignation of Board member, Carol Barker and introduced our newest member, Ken Signor to the BOD for acceptance to fill the position and serve the remainder of the term. Motion was seconded and carried. Mr. Signor accepted. He is an active member of the judging staff.

Mr. Hampton spoke of Roush's 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration, cost reduction for active duty, National Guard and Reserve Status program.

Chuck Brenner made suggestions to the BOD regarding the restructuring of BOD meetings in order to have a more productive end result. The Long Range Planning Committee had taken this under advisement several months ago. The Executive Committee will take the matter into consideration for presentation at the September BOD meeting in Illinois.

Secretary Beverly Bragg presented the minutes from the May 8<sup>th</sup> BOD meeting in Flat Rock, MI for acceptance. With the correction of the word County in regard to the Imperial Mustangs of Polk County, Florida being made, the minutes were approved.

#### Treasurer's Report - Arley Whitsell

Mr. Whitsell gave his report covering the period January 1, 2004 through June 30, 2004. Operating receipts for the six month period amounted to \$283,929 with expenses amounting to \$258,106 for a net gain of \$25,823. If this trend continues MCA's zero based budget will be achieved for the year. He commented that the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event was a moneymaking undertaking. The proceeds will be kept separate of the MCA's operating account in order that the operating budget can be measured against actual for the entire year.

#### Membership Committee - Chuck Micele

Membership has taken a slight drop over the last two months. Membership is 10,675.

#### 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary - Jim Chism

Mr. Chism reported on the great success of the celebration in Nashville, Tennessee in April 2004. Progress is being made regarding the production of the DVD. Target time for the completion is mid July. Delay is due to the amount of material being reviewed. Mr. Chism presented the officers of MCA a ceremonial check in the amount of \$304,065.41 - proceeds from the 40<sup>th</sup>. MCA treasurer, Arley Whitsell, received the actual check. Mr. Chism turned over the event books and records to MR. Whitsell. Mr. Whitsell spoke for all of MCA when he thanked Mr. Chism, Art Hyde, Austin Craig and everyone else involved in the 40<sup>th</sup> event. Mr. Whitsell made a motion that having done his job well that at this time the BOD will release him and the 40<sup>th</sup> committee and their show treasurer from their respective duties. Motion was seconded and carried. Letters of appreciation are to be written to April and the State of Tennessee.

Mr. Johnson made a motion to allow Treasurer Arley Whitsell authority to handle part of the proceeds (\$200,000) and split it up as necessary into savings account and other investments. Motion seconded and carried.

Mr. Whitsell made a motion to restrict the \$200,000 from being used in the operating budget account and that MCA continue to be run on the zero based budget system. Motion seconded by Dean Hillestad and carried. The remaining \$100,000.00 will be held to supplement service needs of the growing MCA. Mr. Whitsell made a motion to donate \$10,000.00 of the remaining \$100,000.00 to St. Jude Hospital, Nashville, TN, Music City Mustang Club's children's charity. Motion seconded and carried.

Mr. Prewitt brought up a subject for discussion regarding monies not paid to National Shows held last year due to a sponsorship change. Mr. Prewitt made a motion that MCA make up the difference to the respective clubs that came up short. Motion seconded and carried.

#### Executive Committee Report - Chuck Micele

Mr. Micele presented the Pony Car project to the BOD. The small car is available for sale to the membership. Details are in the Mustang Times. Ad copy sent to Olympia. Price of car is \$8,700.00 and can be financed through MBNA. MCA will receive a commission.

#### Publishing Committee - Austin Craig

In his absence, Beverly Bragg read Mr. Craig's report. Multiple advertisers have come on board the Mustang Times. Look for them. Many are color ads.

#### Marketing & Promotional Committee - Austin Craig

MCA ads are appearing in Mustang Monthly, Mustangs and Fords and Muscle Mustangs and Fast Fords. MCA ads are generating tremendous interest on their web sites. A Trader Publications sponsorship will bring MCA tremendous exposure.

#### Finance Committee - Jim McFarland

Executive Committee approved funds for new software for Mike Keown to develop a program to simplify financial reports, etc. Also the committee comprised of Jim McFarland, Chairman, Greg Sullins, Beverly Bragg and Arley Whitsell as consultant, are looking into the aid of a bookkeeping service and a financial advisor. After program is put in use, we can look at specifics.

#### Long Range Planning - Mike Keown and Laurie Slawson

Mr. Keown gave an extensive report regarding the future of MCA over the next ten-year period. He made a motion that MCA adapt steps 1-6 as written. Arley Whitsell made a motion to amend the motion as to allow the Executive Committee to have time to consider the steps of the program and to then bring their findings before the BOD. Motion seconded and carried.

#### Internet & Web Committee - Mike Keown

Mr. Keown made a presentation regarding MCA having its own software and server, which would be compatible with the office's current program. Chuck Brenner made a motion that the BOD accept the IT upgrade and Mike's proposal at a cost not to exceed \$10,000.00. Motion seconded - 21 yes - 3 no - motion carried.

#### Accessory Report - Beverly Bragg

Mrs. Bragg asked Wanda Whitsell to talk about the new Polonaise hand blown 1964 ½ Mustang Christmas ornament recently acquired for sale through MCA and our web site. Products purchased by BOD are discounted at time of purchase.

#### Administration Committee - Lark Bragg

MCA has leased under a 36-month contract a Panasonic DP2010E copier for the MCA office.

#### Annual Banquet - Chuck Micele

Mr. Micele moved that MCA deviate from the By-Law provision that requires the annual meeting of the MCA in January 2005 be held in the State of Georgia so that MCA is allowed to hold the annual meeting in any state of choice. Motion seconded and carried.

Annual meeting is January 7, 8, and 9, 2005, in Ocala, Florida in conjunction with the Silver Springs Car Show. Rick Schmidt at National Parts Depot is going to provide the BOD with a trip through the theme park and a box lunch. This will be a two-day event and a registration form will be published in the Mustang Times with details.

#### By Laws Committee - Pete Roberts

The proposed By-Law changes are expected to be available for the September BOD meeting in Springfield, Illinois. The format will show existing By-Law and proposed change for easier comprehension.

#### Club Charter Committee Report - Jim McFarland

1. The Saddleback Mustang Club of Mission Viejo, CA, applied for a Regional Charter; however it was not received in time to be brought to the May BOD meeting. They have requested that we suspend until next year. They will again consider if they want to renew the request.

Committee recommends that the Mustang Wranglers of Oregon be chartered; therefore, it is motioned to charter Mustang Wranglers of Oregon as a MCA Regional Club. Motion seconded and carried.
6. The Hoosier Mustangs Car Club has requested that their rejection to become a chartered MCA Regional Club be reconsidered. Their meeting place continues to be in the heart of the Michiana Mustangs club territory. The Michiana Mustangs club contests their charter. The Committee recommends that the Hoosier Mustangs Car Club be rejected as a MCA Regional Club; therefore, it is motioned that the Hoosier Mustangs Car Club not be granted a charter. Motion seconded - vote 14 yes - 12 no. Mr. Micele suggested that request for approval be resubmitted with different meeting location specified.

Motion to accept Mustang Club of Central Iowa's request for insurance only for their event July24-25, 2004 at Mid America Motionplex, Council Bluffs, Iowa was presented. Motion seconded and passed.

We can't predict the future so we do not know if any bills will be introduced that would be bad for the car hobby. But we do know that we should keep in touch with our legislators just in case we need them to fight against or for a measure in the Assembly. Details on the forum will be out next month. Keep October 25th open on your calendar.

I've warned people about this one before. A bar in Newport News is in trouble for playing songs. BMI, Broadcast Music Inc., has sued because the bar is playing music without paying for the licensing rights. Other

restaurants in the area have also been in trouble. If you download music off the Internet without paying you can get in trouble. The average fine has been in the \$3500 range. If you have a car show and you are playing music, have a band or a DJ you need to be careful. I have learned from an event my wife chairs every year to NOT ADVERTISE that you are having music at the event. Your ad gets on the Internet, in the newspaper and other places and you could end up in trouble. My wife's organization got out of paying a fee but your group or club might not be as lucky.

The federal agency that oversees auto safety has decided that we don't need to know about warranty info, customer complaints and info about defects in vehicles. Why would we need to know that the new car or truck we just bought is unsafe?

VDOT is under going a major reorganization. This change is due to the long delays and cost increases for projects. Hampton Roads has the highest cost overruns in the state. Its overruns average 17.2% and the state average is 9.7%. The same area also has the longest delays. The average project in the Hampton Roads area was 137 days behind schedule. The agency is going to put one person in charge of a project from start to finish and other changes will be made to make sure projects are done on time with no cost overruns.

We've all heard about the haze over the Shenandoah Parkway. Now a half a million bucks has been budgeted for a federal agency to work with state agencies to find out why the air is hazy. Although power plants in the Ohio valley have been blamed for the foul air apparently the experts aren't sure where the pollution is actually coming from. Air quality monitors are going to be set up so that the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration can find the source of the pollution. Keep in mind that the Shenandoah Valley exceeded the new ozone standards while producing no pollution of its own in the area.

Why the high oil prices? There are several reasons but the one that bothers me the most is lack of refineries. A refinery has not been built in the US in the last 28 years. A combination of government regulations and the fact that more refineries mean more oil and lower prices have kept construction from taking place.
