



Ford Racing Performance Parts announces three performance packs for upgrading 2005-2006 Mustang GT coupes and convertibles.

'FR1 - Power Pack', 'FR2 - Drag Pack', and 'FR3 - Handling Pack' add credible performance gains in both acceleration and handling.

Ford Racing 'Performance Packs' were engineered as part of Grand-Am Cup championship-winning Mustang FR500C race program.

DEARBORN, Mich., Oct. 25 - Turn your Mustang into the king of the road using Ford Racing Performance Part's new line of Mustang 'Performance Packs' being introduced at the 2005 Specialty Equipment Market Association (SEMA) Show on Tuesday, Nov. 1. Mustang was the talk the show last year, and that will only continue with these new speed parts developed by Ford Racing.

Developed by the same race engineers that tuned the FR500C race car, "FR3" features a unique suspension set-up including dampers, springs, anti-roll bars, and a strut tower brace. NEWS FROM THE CCCCVA

Gasoline continues to be a hot topic with our politicians. During the only televised governor candidate's debate both said they were in favor of studying exploring the Chesapeake Bay for oil. Last General Assembly session the assembly passed just such a bill and it was vetoed by Governor Warner. After gas hit \$3 a gallon things have changed. What hasn't changed is the fact that there are already pollution problems in the bay and drilling for oil sure won't make them better.

In fact many politicians favor drilling off-shore for oil. They ignore the fact that Big Oil doesn't really want to find more oil that would lower prices and therefore their big fat profits.

Sparks flew in the House recently as a bill was passed that would have helped build refineries. We know that there is still plenty of oil but that refinery capacity is limiting production. We learned the hard way about that fact when two hurricanes hit the Gulf coast. This bill would streamline permits for building refineries, open federal lands for building refineries, limit the number of gasoline blends (including those that reduce pollution). There were many in the House opposed to open aid to Big Oil because the oil companies are making record profits in the billions of dollars. In fact the House leadership had to suspend the rules and keep the voting open for 40 minutes while they gathered the needed votes for this measure. They won 212 to 210.

Many House members are worried about how they will explain to their constituents how they could vote to give Big Oil so much when gas prices are high and Big Oil is making billions.

This year we had 6 bad ozone days. This summer was much hotter than the past few ones. Weather conditions drive ozone more than any other factor. DEQ knows that fact and was happy that there weren't more ozone days. What will the EPA do about this? We'll have to wait and see. And keep in mind this was the new ozone standard.

Have you been getting those emails that say we will all boycott gas stations on a certain day and that will cause prices to fall? Most experts agree this won't work and of course you can't get everyone to go along with the plan. Want to know what you can do to the gas stations?

First buy gas at the cheapest station you can. It makes no sense why one station is 20 cents a gallon higher than one a block away. It make less sense why stations owned by the same company have a wide difference in prices.

Second pay at the pump using your credit card. Sure most of us are cash boys and girls but there are a couple of reasons to buy with credit. One the credit companies have upped the rates they charge oil companies to accept credit cards. Two - most stations are set up for you to come inside and pay - and buy their food and drink. That's why you see so many gas stations that sell food, drink, etc. In fact many depend on food sales. So don't buy food there. And if they ask you to prepay before buying - find a station that doesn't make you prepay. The purpose behind this is psychological. They want you to think gas is so valuable you will stand in line twice to buy it once.


