June 2007 Car Hobbyist News From the Council By Fred Fann

It took over 9 months but we finally have a response from the Attorney General's office on the law that governs the stickers/registration fees for localities. You may recall that we have been discussing this at council meetings for the last couple of years. State law says that localities cannot charge more than the state for sticker or registration fees. Some localities have been not only been charging more than the state does for antique vehicle fees but also they have been doing so every year. DMV, a state agency, only charges a one time fee for antiques. I wrote Governor Kaine in July 2006 requesting that he ask for an Attorney General official

opinion so that we can get this issue clarified. His staff sent a letter to the state transportation secretary who in turn forwarded the request to the AG office.

The AG office didn't do anything with this for months. I contacted the governor's office in November and December, A person with the governor's office told me the AG's office lost the request but would respond within 30 days. Finally I wrote the Attorney General asking that his office issue an opinion. In May I was contacted by the AG's office and told that while the opinion request was not done correctly that we would still get an opinion within 60 days. About 10 days later I got a letter stating that no opinion would be issued because the request was not done correctly.

I have checked the statue cited in the letter and the AG's office is correct; the governor's office did not correctly ask for an opinion. When asked the AG's office could not give me a reason why it took so many months for them to respond.

We do have some choices and I will discuss them at the next council meeting. What I do need is for you to contact me if your city or county charges in excess of \$10 for stickers/registration fees for vehicles registered as antiques. If your city or county charges a fee every year for vehicles registered as antiques I also need that information. This information will help us with making a decision on what to do next. I have seen the draft of the new antique license plate applicant certification. If you would like a copy email me your fax number. There is one part of the form that may be confusing. I am hoping it will be changed before the form goes into use on July 1. As you know the antique vehicle registration law changes on that date. Everyone who owns a vehicle registered as an antique will have to certify that they know the law governing the use of antique vehicles

and that the vehicle complies with the safety requirements for the year of manufacture. If you have any questions or concerns about this please contact me.

After the Supreme Court decision that the EPA can regulate so called greenhouse gases President Bush has ordered several agencies to find a way to regulate vehicle emissions. He ordered this be done by 2008 but since Bush leaves office in January 2009 it is doubtful much will be done. The Bush administration has resisted action on global warming however the 5 – 4 court decision forced a response.

The ethanol craze is driving more demand for corn. More corn is being planted and in Virginia plantings are up 8.3% from last year.

Nationwide the corn crop will be up 15% from 2006. Problems with an increase in corn production include: the planting of other crops will decrease, higher animal feed costs and concerns about pollution especially near the Chesapeake Bay. With gasoline prices increasing by the day we can expect more demand for ethanol.
