For Renee Bennett, her little coup was something of a dream. The proud owner of a 2003 Ford Mustang V6 found exactly what she wanted when she stepped onto the auto dealership out in Powhatan. "I just love Fords. I've grown up with Fords, and I love horses too," Bennett said.

It made sense for Bennett to purchase the Mustang. She remembers clearly the day she pulled up to her Chesterfield County home in early June 2004 with her new car. "I had a Cavalier station wagon that was about to fall apart," she recalled before finding the car of her dreams.

So far the, Bennett has netted five trophies, and her husband Bruce, who owns a 1994 Ford Mustang GT convertible, is proud of her accomplishments. "Bruce is very supportive. He'll help clean the engine for me, but most of the time I do it," she said.

Now that she has some experience in the competitive arena, Bennett is more relaxed knowing that sometimes a win is based on popular vote. "Stock is better and values better. The older cars do better," she said. "Each competition is different."

For Bennett, participating in car shows is a stress relief. The Nationwide Insurance administrative assistant looks forward to the shows. "It's my hobby. I'm meeting people from all over the United States," Bennett said.

Some of the additional touches Bennett has added to the 'pony' are the Mustang theme that encompasses the car, which even includes a picture at the trophy table of a rescued horse named 'Cookie', which Bennett has "adopted" to bring awareness for the live colts rescued from abuse or neglect. Her Ford Mustang has opened her eyes to a new world. "I love the Mustang, in general, and I want to thank Ford."

The mom also enjoys the reaction of her three children Nadia, 24, who is currently serving in the Navy; Erin, 22, who lives in Virginia Beach; and Ashley, 13, who attends a local middle school and hopes to someday have a Volkswagen. "She may change her mind," Bennett said.

Classic Design Concepts 1967 Fastback: Flashback

Classic Design Concepts recognizes that Baby Boomers have wants. They want to rejuvenate the past. They want to reap the rewards of their hard work by having the best. They demand quality.

Recognizing this and Baby Boomers' passion for automobiles, CDC has designed and engineered an all-new 1967 Mustang. In fact, they will be building four distinct versions of the '67.

Flashback is not just an exercise; in 2008, CDC will offer complete Flashbacks equipped with an extensive list of base components and options for personalization.

The CDC Flashback starts with Dynacorn's Ford authorized 1967 Mustang fastback body-the base to an extraordinary exterior design-and comes standard with CDC redesigned front and rear fascias. The front fascia includes functional brake ducts, a fog light package and bright mesh grille. The custom rear fascia features openings for dual-dual 2 7/8" exhaust tips fed by 2 1/2" dual exhaust. Functional lower side vents and molded scalloped upper sail panels provide a modern twist to classic fastback styling. Taillights with integrated reverse lights, a high capacity cooling system, external oil filter system, stainless steel brake, fuel and coolant lines and a Ford 9" rear end, not to mention dramatically increased head and leg room and power windows, locks, driver seat and interior trunk release, are all standard.

The interior features stitched leather sport seats and fold-down rear seats. A leather dash pad covers the custom gauge package that includes speed, tach, temperature, fuel, oil, boost, and fuel pressure gauges. An electronic air conditioning system provides comfortable cruising in the dead of summer or in those slow-

moving parades. The CDC designed and engineered modular interior conforms to the 2008 standard of fit and finish and includes door panels, headliner, rear seat panels, rear sail panels and a center console including the shifter, secondary gauges, cup holders and storage, adding the perfect touch of current amenities while maintaining key classic touches. A JVC Bongiovi head unit with Rockford Fosgate components and amplifiers pumps your soundtrack through the cabin.


The extensive list of standard features alone makes the Flashback a high-end package, but there's more.

Owners can choose from a laundry list of high quality suspension options from RRS. This Flashback is equipped with the RRS Phase 4 package, which includes 13.6" two-piece Molycarbide directional vented front rotors, six piston calipers and adjustable performance shocks with fully adjustable ride height. The rear brake kit includes 12.5" Molycarbide rotors. A Watts link rear suspension with extra long torque tube and fully adjustable rear height coil-over shocks allows the Flashback to handle like a modern road racer.



This Flashback is equipped with a 600-horsepower 5.4 liter supercharged V-8 with a 6-speed Tremec transmission underneath a CDC-designed heat extracting cowl hood with built-in turn signal indicators. The 18" Forgeline wheels are color-matched to the stripe on the Sherwin Williams metal flake Pearl Blue custom paint.

510 HORSEPOWER ROUSH P-51A MUSTANG SET TO SAVE THE STREETS FROM THE FOREIGN INVASION

LAS VEGAS (October 30, 2007)
- During World War II, the P-51
Mustang was hailed as a savior of
aviation and certainly played a major
part in ending the conflict. This long
range fighter escorted Allied bombers
over Europe and Hermann Goering,

the head of Germany's Luftwaffe, summarized the plane's role by stating, "The day I saw P-51 Mustangs flying over Berlin, I knew the jig was up."

Today, at the SEMA Show in Las Vegas, the jig is up for the rest of the Ford Mustang tuners as ROUSH Performance unveiled the P-51A Mustang automobile which, at 510 horsepower and 510 lb.-ft. of torque, is sure to be held in as high a regard as the airplane has been in the history books and will help to save the streets from the invasion of the foreign brands.

"I've often said that there was never a Mustang built that I didn't like and that includes both the car and the airplane," said Jack Roush, an aviation enthusiast who currently owns two P-51 Mustang warbirds. "This is the type of product that ROUSH has wanted to produce for at least 10 years but the right platform, the right technology, and the right timing never intersected until now."

The ROUSH P-51A is easily the highest horsepower Mustang that the company has ever produced, and represents the first time that internal engine components have been upgraded by ROUSH technicians in their Livonia, Mich., facility. It was determined that the only way to give the P-51A moniker its due was to completely break into the 4.6L, 3V and rebuild several of the functional internal components, which include a forged steel eight-bolt crankshaft, forged aluminum pistons with increased dish to lower the compression from 9:8 to 8:6, and forged steel H-Beam connecting rods. These upgraded parts were necessary for the stock Ford engine (which comes with 300 horsepower from the factory) to be able to withstand the additional power generated from the newest iteration of the legendary ROUSHcharger* supercharger system.

Additional alterations include a custom aluminum upper and lower intake manifold for the high capacity air-to-water intercooler and ROUSHcharger*. ROUSH installs a

custom fuel rail and high-flow fuel injectors, a high-flow capacity fuel system, as well as a dual electronic throttle body.

The new ROUSH P-51A engine has a preliminary rating of at least 510 horsepower and 510 lb.-ft. torque. It is anticipated that final figures may even be slightly higher than this when final testing and calibration is approved by the ROUSH engineering staff.

The changes to the ROUSH P-51A don't end under the hood. A ROUSH aerobody kit will be installed, which includes a front fascia, chin spoiler, hood scoop and rear spoiler. The ROUSH black high-flow grill is added along with cooling side shields to give the car the aggressive look it needs while stalking the streets.

Internally the car will come with ROUSH sport leather seating and custom floor mats, both with an embroidered P-51A emblem. The white face gauges and billet aluminum pedals will get a lot of use as the driver bangs through the gears with the ROUSH short throw shift lever and retro black ball.

For those who look behind the 18-inch ROUSH forged five-spoke wheels will see the vaunted Stage 3 suspension underneath this vehicle. Designed to handle even the tightest twists and turns, this suspension includes specially-engineered and tuned front struts, rear shocks, front and rear springs, front and rear sway bars and jounce bumpers. The front brakes are also upgraded with 14-inch front two-piece rotors and four-piston calipers. Each component was specifically engineered so that ride comfort was not compromised at the expense of the tremendous gains in performance.

As an interesting side note, the yellow and red accent colors on the vehicle come from those used by the 357th Fighters Group, Eighth Air Force ETO (European Theater Operations) who were unofficially known as "The Yoxford Boys" after a village near their base. Its victory totals in air-to-air combat are the most of any P-51

group in the Eighth Air Force and third among all groups fighting in Europe. The 357th flew 313 combat missions between February 11, 1944 and April 25, 1945 and is officially credited by the US Air Force with having destroyed 595.5 German airplanes in the air and 106.5 on the ground. Pilots in this group included Captain Clarence E. "Bud" Anderson who flew a P-51 named "Old Crow." One of Roush's personal P-51 fighters is painted as a replica of this airplane.

Pricing for the ROUSH P-51A Mustang has not been set, but will be announced shortly. The vehicle is slated to begin production in the first quarter of 2008 and will be limited to 100 vehicles. As with all ROUSH vehicles, the P-51A will carry an industry-leading 3 year/36,000 mile warranty.

Based in Livonia, Mich., "The Art of Performance Engineering" takes place at ROUSH Performance. Ford Racing Mustang FR5008 2008 Spec Series Racer

The all-new Mustang FR500S is the cornerstone vehicle of the Ford Racing Mustang Challenge for the Miller Cup racing series, which debuts on racetracks across North America in 2008.

The FR500S joins other Mustang racecars that are available for sale through the Ford Racing Performance Parts catalog.

For the first time in its history, Ford Motor Company has built racecars at a vehicle production facility intended for sale to racers through Ford Racing dealers.

Building on the rich and successful racing history of Ford's iconic pony car, Ford Racing Performance Group is giving customers an affordable way to go racing with the introduction of the allnew 2008 Mustang FR500S.

The FR500S will be the heart of a new Mustang spec series, the Ford Racing Mustang Challenge for the Miller Cup, which will make its debut on racetracks across North America in 2008.

The limited-edition FR500S is the first racecar in Ford Motor Company's history to be built at a production facility and then made available for racers to purchase through the Ford Racing Performance Parts catalog and at authorized Ford Racing dealers. "There aren't very many manufacturers that can say they build race cars right off of the production line, and we are very, very proud of this achievement," said Dan Davis, director, Ford Racing Technology. "This new pony car gives customers and racers a chance to get into a high-performing vehicle that is durable, reliable and competitive."

The 325-hp Ford Mustang FR500S was co-developed by Ford Racing and Miller Motorsports Park (MMP) in Tooele, Utah, and is based on the Mustang GT used by the track's high-performance driving school. Powered by a 4.6-liter 3-valve, fuelinjected V8 production engine and featuring a Ford Racing cold-air intake, the FR500S includes a 6-speed transmission with an upgraded clutch and Ford Racing short-throw shifter. The FR500S features the same braking utilized on the FR500C along with unique two-way adjustable front dampers with coil springs and an adjustable anti-roll bar in both the front and rear suspension.

"The new Mustang FR500S is the result of Ford Racing working with Miller Motorsports Park, the Auto Alliance International production facility and everyone with Team Mustang to produce an affordable race car that is durable and lives up to the powerful reputation of the Mustang," said Jamie Allison, manager, Ford Racing Performance Group. "We were able to use production racing parts out of our own catalog to ensure this car handles and performs with the power and aggressiveness the Mustang is known for."

With the addition of the Mustang FR500S to its current stable of Mustang racecars, Ford Racing now provides customers a racing ladder – all within one manufacturer – to climb up through the ranks of professional racing. The Ford Racing ladder begins with the Ford Racing High Performance Driving School at Miller Motorsports

Park featuring specially prepared school Mustangs.

The next step on the ladder is the Mustang FR500S, which is delivered as a race-ready vehicle complete with a racing seat and safety harnesses, and provides competitors with a base to hone their driving skills and an exciting year-long schedule to race against other semi-pro drivers.

Moving further up the ladder puts racers behind the wheel of the Mustang FR500C, which competes in the Grand-Am KONI Challenge Series, and the FR500GT4, which competes in the GT4 European Cup Championship. Both Mustangs are proven winners with each car having won championships in its first year of competition.

At the top of the ladder sit both the Mustang FR500GT and FR500GT3, which represent the ultimate race-bred Mustang. The FR500GT is being homologated for Grand-Am Rolex GT and other applications, while the FR500GT3 has already competed in select FIA GT3 European Championship races and will be campaigned full-time in 2008.

November 2007 Car Hobbyist News From the Council By Fred Fann

I attended a meeting on October 9th in Lynchburg. It was called by car hobbyists in the area to get answers about the new antique registration law from two members of the General Assembly (Delegate Danny Marshall – sponsor of the bill and Delegate Kathy Byron), DMV head of vehicle services Jim Gurney and representatives of the State Police and local police and sheriff departments.

I learned some interesting things have been going on with the new antique law. Antique vehicle registrations are down 90% so the new law is working - only "real" antiques that are treated as antiques are being registered. There were 118,000 letters sent out to antique owners. Over 8,000 were returned because the person had sold the vehicle or the owner was deceased. DMV found there were 3700 antique vehicles with two or more sets of plates registered to those vehicles. Apparently when registration was only \$10 people registered black and white plates and year plates to the same vehicle.

As a result of this DMV now estimates there are only 80 to 90,000 antique vehicles in Virginia. There are 6 million vehicles registered in Virginia.

DMV has discovered "fake" antique plates. If you have looked through automotive magazines you may have seen ads for reproduction year of manufacture plates. I've seen some of them on vehicles. These plates sell for much less than actual

antique plates. DMV must inspect any year of manufacture plates before registering them to your vehicle. There can only be one set of plates with a set of unique characters. In other words you can't have an antique plate and a daily driver plate with the same set of characters. To make sure you don't buy a year of manufacture plate with characters that are already taken go to the DMV website and put that set of characters into the DMV vanity plate check. If those characters are on a plate it will show up.

There were a lot of questions at the meeting about changing some of the language of the antique vehicle registration bill. Some people are worried that if they have a taillight out then the police will take the tags off the car and the owner will have to pay a big fine, etc. The police representatives stated that they are after the real law breakers and not out to hassle true hobbyists. Some were also worried about other parts of the bill. When the bill was in the Assembly I was informed that they wanted to give the law 5 years to see if it would work. Apparently it is working and doing what it was intended to do. The problem with introducing this legislation again is that any thing can happen with it. We found out have easily the bill was amended last session.

Delegate Marshall still wants to do away with the 250 miles of pleasure driving – just the 250 mile part. I agree with everyone else that it is unenforceable and if the vehicle is safe what difference does it make to drive 250 miles or 251 miles or even 1 mile. The real fear is that changes could be made to the law that would hurt the hobby and we car hobbyists.

Our Senator John Warner and Senator Lieberman of Connecticut have proposed a bill to cut vehicle and power plant greenhouse gases by 70%. They are hopeful the bill can get the needed 60 votes in the Senate. President Bush opposes the bill and any bill that would create mandatory limits on greenhouse gases.

Think about this - Al Gore has won a Nobel Peace Prize and an academy award for his work on global warming. He is a career politician and not a meteorologist or scientist. A British judge ruled on his "movie" and stated there are 9 factual errors. One of the world's top meteorologists William M. Gray, professor emeritus of atmospheric science at Colorado State University, who has stated that global warming "is one of the greatest hoaxes ever perpetrated on the American people." Also has said when speaking on global warming "We'll look back on all of this in 10 or 15 years and realize how foolish it was."

Apparently Congress is listening to politicians like Al Gore instead of real scientists. And they are not taking into account the cost of making these changes.
