Ford mourns 'Whiz Kid' CFO J. Edward Lundy

He's credited with helping turn automaker around after WWII, giving it financial vision.

J. Edward Lundy, a former Ford Motor Co. chief financial officer and one of the "Whiz Kids" who famously saved the Dearborn automaker in the wake of World War II, died Tuesday night at the age of 92.

Lundy, a long-time resident of Dearborn, was part of a 10-member Army Air Force statistical analysis team led by Charles "Tex" Thornton that offered their services to a struggling Henry Ford II in 1946. The group, which also included Robert S. McNamara and Arjay Miller, saved the company and went on to provide it with two presidents and six vice presidents.

"Ed Lundy was a true pioneer in business and is a celebrated figure in Ford Motor Co. history," Executive Chairman Bill Ford Jr. said. "He was a consummate professional, role model and leader. During his 33 years of

service, Ed Lundy re-wrote the rules of finance in the auto industry. He will be missed."

A former member of the economics faculty at Princeton University, Lundy was initially put in charge of financial planning at Ford.

He is credited with developing financial forecasting as a critical planning tool at Ford, as well as in the broader automotive industry.

He was also known for his ability to identify and develop young talent.

According to the Automotive Hall of Fame, he "brought discipline and accountability" to Ford and "is credited with re-writing the rules of finance in the auto industry."

He was promoted to CFO in 1967 and retired in 1979, but stayed on as a member of the board of directors until 1985.

Lundy's name remained part of the Ford vocabulary long after his departure. He established a set of grammatical and formatting conventions for reporting financial results and related information that Ford financial staff still use and refer to affectionately as "Lundyisms."

Despite early exit, Hight advances to final four

Richmond, Sunday: A clutch malfunction ended Robert Hight's hopes of succeeding the late Eric Medlen as Funny Car champion of the Torco Racing Fuels Nationals at Virginia Motorsports Park Sunday but the driver of the Team Castrol/Automobile Club of Southern California Ford Mustang still managed to lock up a starting spot in the Countdown to One which will crown the 2007 POWERade World Champion.

After dominating the preliminaries and earning the Full Throttle Pit Crew Challenge bonus money for qualifying consistency, Hight fell to Ron Capps when the clutch activated prematurely, causing his 8,000 horsepower Mustang to inexplicably lose traction several hundred feet into the run.

The upshot was a quarter mile time of 7.447 seconds at only 107 miles per hour, far off the 4.790, 4.814, 4.822 qualifying pace that had stamped him as the pre-race favorite.

"It was really a surprise," Hight said. "The clutch just came in quicker than it had all weekend. We don't know why, but we're going to test tomorrow and then we're going to Vegas and test next week. We've got good sponsors and a good team and (the championship is) still ours to win".

Hight, the 2005 winner of the Auto Club's Road to the Future Award as the NHRA Rookie-of-the-Year, now will vie with Tony Pedregon, Ron Capps and Gary Scelzi for the \$500,000 championship, trying to become the third different Team Castrol driver to win the title in the last six years.

"Our job was to get one of these Ford Mustangs in the Countdown to One for Auto Club, Castrol and Ford," team owner John Force said from Baylor University Medical Center where he is recovering from injuries suffered in a Sept. 23rd crash. "Robert will carry that banner for us in the last two races. He and (crew chief) Jimmy Prock earned the right to race for the championship."

October 2007 Car Hobbyist News From the Council By Fred Fann

There is still a lot of talk about the DMV certification form for antique vehicles. Some people have gotten forms for all their antiques while others have not. Also DMV apparently is not going to send the new form if they already send the old form that had errors. The forms have to be into DMV before January 1st so you still

have time. Give DMV a few more weeks to get your forms to you. If you don't get all the forms you can download Form VSA 10B at the DMV website. Here is a direct link to the form:

There have been some complaints about the part of the new law that allows police officers to impound or remove from the highway a vehicle that is unsafe. These people are crying that their rights could be violated. They have "right" and "privilege" confused. Driving a vehicle is a privilege and therefore can be taken away much quicker and easier than a right. The following laws in the Code of Virginia were passed many years ago:

46.2-103 (http://leg1.state.va.us/cgibin/legp504.exe?000+cod+46.2-103)

- allows police to stop and inspect vehicles to see if they are safe to operate
- 46.2-609 (http://leg1.state.va.us/cgibin/legp504.exe?000+cod+46.2-609)
- license plates, registration can be revoked 46.2-1001

(<u>http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/leap504.exe?000+cod+46.2-1001</u>)

- police officers can remove unsafe vehicles from the road

These laws have been in the code for a number of years. The new law doesn't change anything about removing an unsafe vehicle from operation on the highways. I have a feeling that the people who are upset about police officers being able to remove unsafe vehicles from the road may have vehicles that have missing equipment or equipment that is not working correctly. We know people registered vehicles as antiques to avoid inspections because his or her vehicle would not pass. Now that the law has changed it is time to fix any missing or nonfunctional equipment.

We've heard about DMV informing Cobra car owners about their vehicles not being titled and registered correctly. This happened quite some time ago. Now we are hearing that DMV has contacted

antique owners stating that the antiques were not titled correctly. We will monitor and see what happens. As I have said in the past always be alert when you get anything done at DMV. Check everything carefully and don't let a clerk talk you into registering or titling something incorrectly.
