



"Bringing up the Rear: Ford to revive Rear-Wheel Drive in U.S."

Ford Motor Co. is bringing rearwheel-drive development back to the United States from Australia. The automaker also has green-lighted a vehicle platform that will provide the basis for a new generation of rearwheel-drive cars, according to sources familiar with Ford's plans.

Australia, where such vehicles remain popular, had emerged as Ford's center for rear-wheel-drive development. But changing economics have convinced the company to bring the program back to Dearborn.

Sources said the new rearwheel-drive platform will provide the underlying architecture for an all-new Ford Mustang, as well as for new Ford and Lincoln sedans. The same platform will be used for a next-generation Falcon in Australia. Product codes already exist for these cars, but it will still be about four years before they arrive in showrooms.

Ford would not comment on moving the rear-wheel-drive program, but said Australia will continue to play an important role in the company's product development operations.

"On rear-wheel-drive, as we have already stated, we are working on a new platform and portfolio of vehicles," Derrick Kuzak, Ford's global head of product development, said Friday. "We will have more to say in the future."

Analysts say a solid rear-wheeldrive offering is vital to any company that wants to be a truly global automobile manufacturer.

"Americans have had 28-plus years of being hit over the head with the idea that front-wheel-drive is better, but there are segments of the market -- here and abroad -- that want rear-wheel-drive," said Jim Hall of 2953 Analytics LLP in Birmingham. "They need it for China, they need it for the Middle East and they need it for North America if they want to sell to certain enthusiasts."

And he said there are good financial reasons for developing the new platform here -- the weak U.S. dollar, for one.

"You don't save any money with Australian dollars anymore," Hall said. "There are economies of scale in engineering too."

Most cars sold in the United States prior to the 1980s were rearwheel-drive, and fans still believe it offers a sportier ride and the opportunity to design more aggressive-looking cars. But front-wheel-drive, which offers better fuel economy and surer handling, has since become the norm, both here and abroad.

But the success of domestic rear-wheel-drive offerings from Chrysler LLC, such as the Chrysler 300 and Dodge Charger, has convinced automakers that there is still a market for these beefier rides.

General Motors Corp. offers rear-wheel-drive products, too, including the ever-popular Chevrolet Corvette and the new Pontiac G8, and others are under development -- though some executives have expressed concerns about the impact of new federal fuel-economy standards on those programs.

German brands like BMW and Mercedes are big on rear-wheel-drive, as are some exotic European marques like Ferrari.

Ford also sells rear-wheel-drive cars in the United States, including the popular Mustang and the more workaday Crown Victoria and Lincoln Town Car. Production of those big sedans is slated to end by 2011, leaving a gap in Ford's lineup that the company is eager to fill with sportier offerings.

The Interceptor concept that Ford displayed at the Detroit auto show in 2007 could well be the shape of things to come, though not necessarily the size.

The back-to-the-future muscle car was a real crowd-pleaser.
According to Ford sources, CEO Alan Mulally was dismayed to learn that the company he had just been hired to lead had no plans to actually build it. Since then, work began on a production vehicle that will have a similar look, but will be a bit smaller than the concept in order to achieve better gas mileage.

But Hall said Ford could also bring the next-generation Falcon to the United States, given the company's push to simplify its global vehicle lineup.

Product analyst Erich Merkle of IRN Inc. in Grand Rapids hopes the Interceptor look will prevail. He said that aging baby boomers would guarantee a market for such a vehicle.

"Boomers are not going to shoehorn themselves into a Fiesta," he said, referring to Ford's new subcompact. "The Crown Victoria, the Town Car -- those are never going to come back into vogue. A vehicle that draws some retro cues from the past and blends them with a modern look would be a design differentiator -- but it needs to be thoroughly American."

Ford Racing Mustang Challenge Cars Make Big Impression in Competition Debut

TOOELE VALLEY, UTAH (March 18, 2008) – The new Ford Mustang FR500S had a very successful competition debut this past weekend, March 14-16, as nine cars entered the National Auto Sports Association (NASA) Pot O' Gold event at Road Atlanta in Braselton, Ga.

Despite tornados in the area, golf-ball-sized hail and persistent blustery rain and wind throughout Friday and Saturday, the new Mustangs, which were built for the Ford Racing Mustang Challenge for the Miller Cup, made a very positive impression on the large field of racers assembled for the weekend. There were nine FR500Ss entered, which prompted NASA to create a regional Mustang Challenge class to accommodate them.

Jamie Slone, driving the Slone Racing No. 6 Go Pro Ford Mustang FR500S, had the best weekend of all, scoring a hat trick with first overall in the second round of the NASA National Endurance Series on Friday and first in class in 25-minute sprint races on Saturday and Sunday.

On Friday, Slone teamed up with KONI Challenge Series driver Billy "Big Time" Johnson to win the rainshortened three-hour enduro, besting a field of 25 cars to claim the distinction of taking the first-ever race win for a Ford Mustang FR500S. Finishing second overall was Slone's teammate, Mike Harvison, co-driving his No. 111 US Test Management FR500S with Formula D drifting star Tyler McQuarrie.

In Saturday's rain-shortened and aptly-named Thunder sprint race, Slone placed fourth overall and first in class. Harvison was second in class and sixth overall, one position ahead of Ford SVT development engineer Gene Martindale, who finished third in class and seventh overall test-driving the No. 554 Mustang FR500S for Jim Click Racing. Jeff Humberson was fourth in class and 14th overall in his No. 43 StableOne Racing Mustang FR500S, followed by his teammate, rookie Andrew Hendricks, who was fifth in class and 15th overall in the No. 05 StableOne Racing Mustang FR500S. Since the race was held in wet conditions, drivers chose to use the series-spec BFGoodrich KDW rain

On Sunday, the storms had ended and racers were greeted with blue skies and dry track, which prompted a switch back to the seriesspec dry tires, the BFGoodrich g-Force R1s. Slone again took the class win with a fifth-place overall finish. KONI Challenge Series regular Dean Martin took over the testing duties for the Jim Click Racing No. 554 and finished second in class and ninth overall. Harvison was third in class and 12th overall, just ahead of Hendricks, who was fourth in class and 13th overall in the No. 05 StableOne Racing Mustang FR500S. George Winkler, driving his No. 541 Mustang FR500S, was fifth in class and 15th overall.

"The weekend really couldn't have gone any better," Slone said. "Pulling off the hat trick was a first for me. It was particularly gratifying considering that almost half of the Mustang Challenge field was here, and some of the drivers I was competing against are very experienced professionals.

"The Mustang FR500S is very well balanced, and was a blast to drive in both wet and dry conditions. The BFGoodrich tires also performed brilliantly, giving me the confidence to drive to the limit on both the KDWs and the R1s. I'd like to thank Rehagen Racing for their engineering support this weekend; they truly are Mustang experts! I'm really looking forward to the Ford Racing Mustang Challenge for the Miller Cup this year!" The Ford Racing Mustang Challenge for the Miller Cup is a professional road racing series, sanctioned by the Grand American Road Racing Association, that utilizes the new Ford Mustana FR500S racing on BFGoodrich g-Force R1 tires. The inaugural season will kick off at Road Atlanta on May 3, 2008 for the first of eight races.

April 2008 Car Hobbyist News From the Council

HB 52 has now been signed by the governor and will become law on July 1st. This means that you will no longer have to have your signature notarized when you register a vehicle as an antique. It was a common sense measure as having to go out and get your signature notarized wasted your time and did nothing to improve the safety of your vehicle.

The General Assembly could not come up with a transportation plan before the end of the session. They will meet in a special session to work on transportation funding. A blow was struck to the assembly approved transportation districts when the State Supreme Court found it unconstitutional. If we are to be taxed it must come from our elected officials and not appointed ones. Delegate Bob Marshall filed the lawsuit that ended the special transportation districts that had been created last year for Northern Virginia and Tidewater. One for the Richmond area had been proposed.

The big news is that the EPA has lowered the ozone standard from 0.08 parts per million to 0.075. It doesn't seem like much but it takes much of the state out of compliance. This of course is not good. It's not

good for businesses hit hard by the economy that will now have to pay more to control pollution. In our area there is talk that we may have to go to a different kind of paint that produces less pollutants but will cost more. It seems everything is costing more and more.

From Wikipedia here is the definition of ozone: Ozone (O3) is a triatomic molecule, consisting of three oxygen atoms. It is an allotrope of oxygen that is much less stable than the diatomic O2. Ground-level ozone is an air pollutant with harmful effects on the respiratory systems of animals. Ozone in the upper atmosphere filters potentially damaging ultraviolet light from reaching the Earth's surface. It is present in low concentrations throughout the Earth's atmosphere. It has many industrial and consumer applications.

Ozone is good in the upper atmosphere but bad at ground level. Ozone forms when pollutants react in the atmosphere. Ozone is at the highest levels during the hot stagnant weather of summer. From September to May ozone is well below the EPA standard. In fact if we have a cool breezy summer we won't have to worry about ozone reaching high levels.

Ready to win a \$10 million contest? The X Prize foundation is offering \$10 million for the most production ready vehicles that get 100 miles per gallon or more. Over 60 teams from 9 countries have already signed up for the contest. Vehicles will be judged in cross-country races in 2009 and 2010 on speed, distance and performance. The categories are mainstream and alternative. All vehicles must have a top speed of at least 80 mph. Mainstream vehicles must have 4 wheels, carry four or more people, have climate control and audio (you want to be comfy even with 100 mpg) and hit 60 in less than 12 seconds. It will be interesting to see what vehicles win the contest. And if you still have that 200 mpg carburetor collecting dust in your garage you might want to put a kit in it.
