







# Assembly Line Realized at Highland Dark

In 1908, Ford Motor Co. developed plans for a new facility, one that had a worldwide impact on manufacturing. It was Ford's Highland Park Plant, which still stands at the corner of Woodward and Manchester. Legendary architect Albert Kahn created the factory. He had built a modern plant for Packard using many of the same materials and concepts later employed in the Highland Park Plant.




Kahn used reinforced concrete for the construction, which allowed for large, open rooms that could efficiently accommodate machinery. More importantly, he included large windows and louvers that admitted fresh air and sunlight into the work spaces. This allowed a much more pleasant environment for Ford workers. Kahn also designed the building to be easily expanded to add additional capacity. "It was called the Crystal Palace because of the use of plate glass," said Ford corporate historian Bob Kreipke. "It was the largest, most modern factory in the world at its time."

According to Kreipke, Ford put the factory in Highland Park because it was outside of the city and more or less on the outskirts of the urban area. This was also an attempt to avoid Detroit's extremely high city taxes. However, Ford almost immediately realized it had made a mistake in locating the factory there. It was landlocked, with the only real shipping

access to the site being via railroad. A railroad strike soon after the plant opened convinced Ford it was important to have water access as well for shipping purposes (this predated the prevalence of trucks as a shipping medium). That led to the construction of the Rouge Plant less than a decade after the Highland Park plant opened.

The Highland Park Plant was not only notable for its architecture. It truly made its mark in history as the site where Ford introduced the moving assembly line. This reduced assembly time for a Model T from 728 minutes to 93 minutes and allowed Ford to produce vehicles in great volume and at ever more reasonable cost. The modern plant also saw the inauguration of Ford's sociology department. With many immigrants coming in to work at Ford plants, the sociology department oversaw English classes that would run during lunch hour.



The sociology department would even make visits to workers' homes to ensure they were keeping a properly run household. "Henry Ford was quite fanatical on living the clean life and having a nice place to live," Kreipke said. Although the sociology department is considered paternalistic and intrusive by modern standards, thousands of people learned English that might otherwise have struggled. Charles Berlitz, of the famous Berlitz language schools, said that Ford Motor Co. was responsible for more people learning English than any other institution.

Ford's interest in his workers' home lives had a positive, lasting impact on Highland Park as well. Blocks north and south of the plant are lined with beautiful, well-built old homes that the company helped fix up for its workers. Kreipke notes with a laugh that Ford was instrumental in closing down many of the bars in the town as well. At the time the plant was built, there were four times as many bars as there were churches in Highland Park, which was an affront to teetotaler Ford.

The Highland plant included a factory hospital to treat on the-job injuries, a film plant to document the manufacturing process, and a tunnel that until quite recently ran underneath Manchester Street to the bank across the street. The tunnel facilitated the movement of tens of thousands of dollars in cash every day. The plant was visited by President Woodrow Wilson, who spoke to more than 20,000 Ford employees gathered at the plant. Tours were also offered to the public.

After completion of the Rouge plant in the 1920s, the plant was used for trim fabrication and tractor assembly. It gained National Historic Landmark status in 1978. Ford sold the building in 1981 to a management company, but Ford still rents space for storage. A large shopping center called Model T Plaza opened in the 1990s on several acres of the land.

# Hiryonen claims second for Ford in Rally de Portugal

BP Ford Abu Dhabi World Rally Team drivers Mikko Hirvonen and Jarmo Lehtinen maintained their perfect record of podium finishes this season when they finished second in Rally de Portugal today. It was the fourth consecutive podium for the Finns and their Ford Focus RS World Rally Car and keeps them in second place in the FIA World Rally Championship after four of the 12 rounds.

The rally, returning to the series after a vear's absence, was the first all-gravel event of the season and

was based in the Serra do Caldeirão hills, above the Algarve holiday resort of Faro. It mixed fast, open roads with narrow, more technical sections and there were many blind crests hiding sharp turns ready to trap the unwary. Hot and dry weather left the road surface coated by loose stones, while underneath the hard bedrock posed tough challenges for Pirelli's tyres.

Hirvonen led by 15.0sec after Friday's opening leg but as a result the 28-vear-old Finn was first in the start order yesterday. He faced the unwelcome task of sweeping the loose gravel from the surface, leaving a cleaner and faster line for those behind. He knew he would lose time and ended the day 26.8sec from the lead. Today's final leg was the shortest of the three and Hirvonen quickly accepted there was no point in risking second place in an all-out attack that was likely to prove fruitless.

Nevertheless he won two of the five speed tests today, finishing 24.3sec behind Sébastien Loeb after 18 special stages covering 361.36km, all held in glorious sunshine and in front of huge crowds. It was his 19th consecutive points finish.



"It was incredibly dusty this morning," said Hirvonen. "I started the day thinking a win was possible but the dust hung in the cool air and I realised after the opening stage that in those conditions I had no chance of catching Loeb. I hoped to win here but it wasn't meant to be. I think second place was the maximum I

could achieve. Eight points is good for me because many drivers scored zero.

"It's frustrating to see Loeb on top again but I'm not giving up on the championship title just yet – we are only a third of the way through the season. I go to every event hoping to win and without him I would do that! The car was excellent here and I really enjoyed the rally, although it was tough yesterday when I had to clean the road at the front," he added.

Khalid Al Qassimi and Michael Orr finished eighth in their Focus RS WRC on the Abu Dhabi driver's debut in Portugal. It was his third consecutive points finish. "This was my best gravel rally. Friday was hard because I slid off the road and then lost time with a turbo boost problem. The team did a great job in fixing it and I stepped up my pace as the weekend continued. My times steadily improved and I'm really happy with this result," said 37-year-old Al Qassimi.

Team-mates Jari-Matti Latvala and Miikka Anttila crashed out of the lead during Friday's opening leg, their Focus RS WRC rolling almost 20 times as it plunged 150 metres down a hillside. Both escaped injury, testament to the strength of the Focus RS WRC, which was destroyed.

BP Ford Abu Dhabi team director Malcolm Wilson was full of praise for Hirvonen. "It was another terrific performance by Mikko, especially as he was put under pressure again following Jari-Matti's accident on Friday. He claimed more valuable points in the drivers' championship. Jari-Matti will be back in a rally car tomorrow for a sponsor passenger ride event and that should help him regain his confidence. I'm confident he and Miikka will go on to deliver a solid and sensible drive in Argentina," he said.

Ford of Europe motorsport director Mark Deans said: "Clearly it was a mixed weekend for the team's fortunes. Jari-Matti's early exit, whilst proving the inherent strength of the Focus RS WRC, dealt our championship aspirations a blow on an

event where a double podium was our target. Mikko took the fight to the world champion, securing valuable and well-earned points and we will now assess the situation and our strategy ahead of the next round in Argentina."



#### News from other Ford teams

Henning Solberg and Cato Menkerud came out on top in their battle with Stobart team-mates Matthew Wilson and Scott Martin. Solberg's Focus RS WRC moved ahead of Wilson to claim fifth on the penultimate stage when the Briton suffered brake problems and rolled near the end of the test. He regained the track, but in doing so his car's clutch burned out and he retired just a few hundred metres from the finish. Munchi's drivers Federico Villagra and Jose Diaz finished seventh in their Focus RS WRC, despite struggling with their pace notes in the dusty conditions.

#### Next round

Round five takes competitors outside of Europe for the first time this season. Rally Argentina, one of the championship's classic fixtures, is another gravel event and is based in Carlos Paz on 23 - 26 April.

# 1978 Ford King Cobra Mustang Owned Since New By Jeff Ford Photography by Bill Erdman

The new King of the road! Presenting...the King Cobra. Unmistakably bold. The ultimate in flair. A car designed to rule its class. So said Ford in its 1978 brochure. Oddly, at least in its day, the Mustang II was doing just that. Lee Iacocca had seen the writing on the wall and, in a stroke of good fortune, had redesigned the Mustang just in time for the fuel crunch that struck in 1974. The new Mustang flew off the floor--even without an available V-8. Ford zipped together 338,136 hatchbacks and hardtops in the first year's production and never looked back, though it did return the V-8 to the engine bay in 1975.


Beginning in 1977, Dale Rabe of Bellville, Michigan, was there to see it all happen. He was even involved in designing several components for the Mexican Mustang II. During that first year, Dale took a shine to the II--so much so that he ordered the King Cobra you see here. His intentions for the car? The show field. There would be no modifications, no 6-71 blowers or fats and skinnies. Instead, he would be showing the car just the way Ford

built it. That's why the little Cobra has only 10,000 miles on the odometer today.

"I bought the car to show-that's why I picked the color combination that I did," says Dale. "I felt the silver paint with black and red accents and red interior would really do well."

When he ordered the car, he left almost nothing off that was an option. The list is quite substantial and lacks only three items that were available on the King Cobra: the clock, four-way seat, and leather-wrapped steering wheel.

One of the most intriguing options on Dale's King Cobra is what Ford termed the "T-roof convertible." This option was made available for the first time on any Mustang in 1978, allowing a semblance of the bygone convertibles. Between 1973 and 1978, the sunroof had been the only option for those of a "sun-worshiper" persuasion. Also interesting are the optional "big" tires--whopping P195/70R13 tires mounted on Lacy Spoke Aluminum Wheels. Other notable bits are air conditioning, console, power steering, power disc brakes, and AM/FM/cassette (for the first time ever). The King also has the Convenience Group, which packed in the interval windshield wipers, day/night mirror, and passenger-side vanity mirror. It also has a convenience panel that has low oil, fasten belts, and brake warning lights.



Dale is the first to admit the performance features are slim, though the car packs a 302 2V, four-speed, 3.00 rear gear, and Rallye Package,

which gave the car stiffer springs, adjustable Gabriel shocks, and a rear sway bar. "I had to do something to cut the cost down, so the leather [steering] wheel, clock, and [four-way] seat were left off," Dale told us. Even on the Ford A-Plan (the discount Ford gives to its employees), the total was a stiff \$6,500. Without his employee discount, the King would have cost a princely sum in the mid-\$7,000 range.



Does Dale still show the King? You bet, and he even manages to squeeze a few drives out of His Majesty every once in awhile. "I can't drive it too much," says Dale, "because of the potential hazards." Still, we'd like to borrow the keys and go for a spin to find out if it really is good to be the King.

# News From The Car Club Council

It's back. Yes, cash for clunkers is back with a vengeance. Money for clunkers was left out of the stimulus package but it has been introduced into Congress and is expected to pass although some think is doesn't do enough to protect the environment. Since the bill is still being debated we do not know for certain whether it will pass or what the final version will be. Right now it appears that vehicles eight or more years old would be able to be traded into a new car dealer for

a vehicle that gets better mileage. Depending on the vehicle traded and the vehicle purchased the voucher could be \$3500 or \$4500. The dealer would get the money, not the purchaser. Environmentalists don't like the measure because it would be possible to purchase a vehicle with the government money that is not very much cleaner in emissions than the vehicle traded in. The program could cost between \$2 and \$4 billion dollars. A survey of potential new vehicle buvers found that the program would not be much of an incentive. Other factors are more of an incentive for the purchase of a new vehicle. This program is modeled after one in Western Europe. Cash for clunker programs in the US states and Canada have either been killed or are considered failures.

Also back is the right to repair bill in Congress. These bills have been introduced in the past and have never made it out of Congress. Right to repair requires automakers to make the tools and diagnostic information needed to repair their vehicles available to independent repair shops just like they do for their own dealers. Trade secrets would not be revealed. There is a new push for this because of the "take over" of automakers by the government with the federal government backing warranties along with the demise of hundreds of dealers. The bill has 13 sponsors in the Congress including one member from Virginia. Two of the sponsors are Republicans, the rest are Democrats. The automakers have been able to defeat right to repair in the past and the bill's passage is doubtful.

New emissions and gas mileage standards have been announced by the Obama administration. Several states sued the Bush administration asking that their states be able to set their own emissions and mileage standards. The Bush administration refused as making the same model of vehicle with different emissions and mileage for different states would not be practical or cost effective. The Obama administration allowed the

states to go forward with their own standards and has now announced that that would not be practical so the entire country has adopted the California standards. You remember California - it's that state on the left coast that is near bankruptcy due to its "efficiency". By 2016 emissions will have to be 30% improved and even light pickups will need to average 30 or more miles per gallon. There is criticism that with the bad economy and all the problems of the automakers that this is not the right time to require expensive retooling. Currently automakers build the vehicles that consumers will buy. This new plan will force automakers to build cars to government standards that consumers may not want - in other words very small vehicles with small engines. The new standards will make vehicles more expensive - also not good in an economy where the automakers are struggling to sell vehicles.

Virginia finishes dead last. The other 49 states, DC, Puerto Rico and various U.S. territories, have already taken action to obligate stimulus transportation funds. Recall that Virginia had three special sessions of the General Assembly to work on our transportation and road building woes - with no real result. The state finally certified \$160.1 million in road, bridge and tourism trail projects to the Federal Highway Administration. The state can get as much as \$694.5 million in federal stimulus money for road improvements. Let's hope our state leaders can "get it together" and use the transportation money soon to help fix those potholes.

Gas prices have been going up recently and again that is not good news for the ailing economy. Many experts think that if gas prices continue to raise it will be very bad news for economic recovery. Speculators are being blamed for the price increases. Experts believe regular gas will not increase past the \$2.50 - \$2.75 range because the oil companies know consumers will buy

much less gasoline at prices above that range.
