The first cruise for 2010 is planned for Sunday, May 2, 2010.

Here's the tentative schedule:

Arrive at Montpelier approx 11 a.m. Montpelier will have a place for all of the Mustangs to park together.

11:15 a.m. - 15 min. presentation film at visitor's center.

11:30 a.m. - 12:45 p.m. guided tour for groups of 20.

12:45 p.m. - 2:30 p.m. Tour grounds on your own.

2:45-3:00 p.m. meet at parking area to go to restaurant.

3:00 - lunch/dinner at Country Cookin' Restaurant.

We will cruise to Montpelier, President James Madison's home from 1797 to 1812, located in the rolling Piedmont hills of Virginia northeast of Charlottesville. You can also take advantage of the Montpelier Wine Festival, which will be held on the grounds of Montpelier on the same day. The home has been through a \$25 million architectural restoration, which was completed Sept. 27, 2008 by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The estate has been restored to look as it did when James and Dolley Madison lived there. Check out Montpelier's web site: http://www.montpelier.org/

Admission Fees: Admission to Montpelier includes a guided tour of the Madison home; admission to the 2,650-acre gardens and grounds; seasonal and themed tours; the Gilmore Cabin: A Freedman's Farm: the Visitor Center and William Du Pont Gallery; Education Center; Museum Shop; Landmark Forest; Madison Family Cemetery; Slave Cemetery; active archaeological digs; and the Annie Du Pont Formal Garden. Admission also includes an audio quide that allows visitors to take a selfquided tour of the grounds.

Gardens & Grounds Tour

Sundays, 1:00 p.m. - 2:00 p.m. | April through October. This hour-long walking tour explores the ways in which the Montpelier landscape has evolved from Madison's day to the present. In the 20th century, the Du Ponts retained and enhanced basic elements of the Madison landscape

while introducing new features. The tour covers the formal garden and the mansion grounds, including a remarkable collection of mature specimen trees, and the historic social uses of the landscape.

FORD SWEEDS N.A. CAR AND TRUCK OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Ford swept the North American Car and Truck of the Year awards today at the North American International Auto Show (NAIAS), winning both prestigious awards for the 2010 Ford Fusion Hybrid and the 2010 Ford Transit Connect, respectively.

It is the third time in 17 years that one manufacturer has won both awards.

The Ford Fusion Hybrid is America's most fuel-efficient midsize sedan with an EPA-estimated 41 mpg rating in the city and 36 mpg on the highway, topping the Toyota Camry hybrid by 8 mpg in the city and 2 mpg on the highway.

The Transit Connect is an industry-exclusive vehicle developed to be a smart new choice for small business owners; it offers double the fuel economy of full-size vans, generous and accessible cargo space, and the agility and maneuverability to operate in crowded urban areas

DETROIT, Jan. 11, 2010 – Ford Motor Company scored a historic doubleheader today, capturing both the North American Car of the Year and North American Truck of the Year awards for the 2010 Ford Fusion Hybrid and 2010 Ford Transit Connect, respectively, at the North American International Auto Show (NAIAS). It is only the third time in 17 years that one manufacturer has won both titles.

"Winning both of these prestigious awards is confirmation that the ONE Ford plan is working, delivering industry-leading products for our customers," said Mark Fields, president of The Americas.

The North American Car and Truck of the Year awards recognize vehicles based on factors including innovation, design, safety, handling, driver satisfaction and value for the dollar. A jury of 49 automotive journalists in the United States and Canada vote for the vehicles, which must be "all-new" or "substantially changed" from the previous model to qualify for the award.

The Fusion Hybrid edged out finalists including the Buick LaCrosse and Volkswagen Golf/GTI to win the North American Car of the Year award. It is the fourth hybrid vehicle in 17 years to win recognition as North American Car (or Truck) of the Year. It also is the second hybrid win for Ford – the most hybrid wins for any automaker. The Ford Escape Hybrid

was named North American Truck of the Year in 2005.



The Transit Connect bested finalists including the Chevrolet Equinox and Subaru Outback to win the North American Truck of the Year award. It is the sixth Ford truck to win the award – the most wins of any automaker in the 17-year history of the awards program. It also is the second year in a row that Ford has captured the title. Last year, top honors went to the 2009 Ford F-150.

Fusion Hybrid a winner out of the gate The North American Car of the Year award is the latest in an impressive string of awards and accolades for the Fusion Hybrid. Most recently, the vehicle was honored as CAR and DRIVER Magazine's "10Best" Cars for 2010, one of AUTOMOBILE Magazine's 2010 All-Stars, and the entire Fusion lineup captured the acclaimed MOTOR TREND Car of the Year® award.

The all-new Fusion Hybrid arrived in dealers in March, complete with a powertrain system that combines the best attributes of the gasoline engine and electric batterydriven motors to deliver the optimal experience for the customer in terms of driving performance and fuel economy. The Fusion Hybrid also offers drivers a way to be more connected to the hybrid driving experience thanks to Ford's SmartGauge™ with EcoGuide, a unique instrument cluster execution that helps coach them on how to optimize the performance of their hybrid.

Other class-exclusive technologies and features that set the

Fusion Hybrid apart from the competition include Blind Spot Information System (BLIS®), Ford SYNC®, SIRIUS Travel Link™ and more total passenger and luggage capacity than the Toyota Camry.

Despite the slump in overall industry sales, 2009 was a recordbreaking year for the Ford Fusion. Sales are at an all-time high, with the Fusion Hybrid accounting for almost 20 percent of total Fusion retail sales. Perhaps even more significant, more than 60 percent of Fusion Hybrid sales have been to customers coming from import brands – mostly Toyota and Honda.

2011 FORD MUSTANG GT NAMED DAYTONA 500 PACE CAR; FIRST FORD TO PACE DAYTONA 500 IN 40 YEARS

The new 2011 Mustang GT, powered by the all-new 412-horsepower 5.0-liter V-8, will serve as the pace car for this year's Daytona 500 at Daytona International Speedway on Feb. 14. This will mark the first time in 40 years that a Ford has served as the pace car for 'The Great American Race,' with the last time being in 1970 when a Ford Torino GT convertible did the honors. It is Mustang's first time as pace car for the Daytona 500.

Fifty special pace car editions of the 2011 Mustang GT will be built and sold to the public.

The actual Race Red Mustang will be auctioned at the 39th Annual Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale Collector Car Auction on Jan. 23, with the help of Richard Petty, the newest member of the Ford Racing family.

DEARBORN, Mich., Jan. 19, 2010 – For the first time ever, American's favorite muscle car will pace 'The Great American Race.'

For the first time in 40 years, a Ford Motor Company car will be pacing the field for the NASCAR seasonopening Daytona 500 when the 2011 Mustang GT, powered by the all-new 5.0-liter V-8 engine, officially starts the race on Feb. 14 at Daytona International Speedway.

"Having the opportunity to pace America's biggest auto race with a Ford icon like the 2011 Mustang GT is truly an honor," said Jamie Allison, director, Ford North America Motorsports. "And to have the new 5.0-liter engine powering the car will be a great way to demonstrate its power and class-leading fuel economy."

This latest version of Ford's legendary muscle car will be a Race Red glass roof coupe with an all-new 5.0-liter V-8 engine capable of producing 412 horsepower, while delivering a class-leading 25 mpg on the highway.

The one-of-a-kind model will feature a special Daytona 500 paint scheme, Ford Racing suspension, strut tower brace and mufflers, unique painted wheels, and special interior treatment, including specially branded lit sill plates.

The 2011 Mustang GT Daytona 500 Pace Car model is one of only 50 special editions that will be built and sold to the public.

"Everybody loves Mustang," Allison continued. "That was evident last year from the fan reaction when we announced it was going to be our new model in the NASCAR Nationwide Series starting later this year. This is just another way to showcase a true American icon in its most natural environment."

The last time a Ford served as pace car for the Daytona 500 was 1970 when a Ford Torino GT convertible led the field to the green flag.



And while Mustang may be a rookie when it comes to pacing the Daytona 500, its 45-year history is firmly entrenched in racing and winning championships. Mustang captured championships last year in the Grand-Am KONI and SCCA SPEED World Challenge, in addition to leading Robert Hight to his first NHRA Funny Car championship.

Another element that makes this year's pace car even more unique is that it will be auctioned off for charity before the actual race. Later this week (Jan. 23), the Mustang GT Daytona 500 Pace Car will be offered at the annual Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale Collector Car Auction, which is taking place in Scottsdale, Ariz. Seven-time Daytona 500 champion Richard Petty, the newest member of the Ford Racing family, will be on site to help hand over the car to the winning bidder.

All proceeds over the manufacturer's suggested retail price from the pace car auction will go to help cure childhood diabetes through a donation to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation.

About the 2011 Mustang GT. The new Mustang GT continues Ford's powertrain offensive with an all-new 5.0-liter V-8, which uses advanced technology to deliver 412 horsepower and projected unsurpassed highway mileage of 25 mpg.

The 2011, Mustang GT adds specially tuned Electric Power Assist Steering (EPAS), 11.5-inch front and 11.8-inch rear vented disc brakes, and an enhanced suspension featuring an improved rear lower control arm and stiffened rear stabilizer bushings.

For enthusiasts, a Brembo brake package, with larger rotors and

calipers from the Ford Shelby GT500® Mustang, unique 19-inch wheels and summer performance tires, is offered; new fender badges herald return of the 5.0-liter engine.

Recardo Ashton's 1990 GT Welcome To The Daily Driver!

The starter makes that latemodel whine and the engine catches then fires. Even in the wee hours of the morning, it satisfies one's heart and soul to hear that noise. The garage door opens, shaking the rails and creaking ominously nothing unusual there. You click the automatic overdrive into the "R" gate and back out into the early morning light. Blasting free of the neighborhood, you scoot onto the highway and stop, then start, and then stop. For excitement, you have a uniform truck decide that where you are is where he needs to be now! Welcome to the daily driver.


Looking at Recardo Ashton's 1990 GT, it would be easy to surmise that the red convertible is a show car. What is most stunning is the fact that Recardo drives the slick little pony to work every day. In Tacoma. In Washington State. Where it rains?a lot.



What prompted our intrepid road warrior to buy the GT was that he likes the late-models. This becomes obvious when you check the list of other Mustangs he has owned. At present, his stable houses an ?86 LX 5.0 convertible and an ?88 LX 5.0L sedan. What's funny about this purchase is that Recardo didn't want it. Candice, his wife, saw the red GT on a used car lot on her way home one night and told Recardo about it. ?I said that I didn't want a red car,? Recardo admitted to us. But Candice persisted. While chatting with another Mustang fan, she managed to pique Recardo's interest with mention of the white leather interior. Before seeing the car, Recardo thought that white would give him free rein he could repaint the exterior any color he wanted. That was until he saw the car.

News From The Car Club Council

The General Assembly is in town and already over 2000 bills plus resolutions have been filed. All the bills of interest to hobbyists are listed on the www.vaacc.org website – just click on legislation.

This year there are a lot of bills on texting while driving, DUI, carbon and greenhouse emissions, gasoline tax, transportation funding and of course vanity license plates. Early in the session two bills attracted the attention of car hobbyists.

The first bill was HB 462 that would have made it illegal to sell any

exhaust part that would produce more noise than a factory part. If this bill would have became law it would have made all aftermarket exhaust parts illegal, would have shut down all muffler and exhaust shops in the state and would have made it impossible for antique hobbyists to replace their old exhaust parts. Only factory exhaust parts would have been allowed to be sold. This was not a good bill for anyone. I'm sure the delegate who sponsored it wanted to eliminate loud exhaust systems but this was not the way to do it. The bill was placed in the House Transportation Committee and was eventually withdrawn.

Again this year a bill was filed to allow Virginians to only display one license plate on cars and trucks. SB 519 was introduced - like past one plate bills - to save money. In 2002 a study found that going to one plate would save almost \$2 million the first year and then about a million each year afterwards. All one plate bills have failed because the police are against them, toll monitors take photos of front plates, security concerns and the state is just not interested in saving that "small" amount of money. SB 519 was killed in the Senate Transportation Committee.

Along the lines of the exhaust bill there is a growing movement of the "right to repair". People want to be able to repair their own vehicles or take them to a shop that has cheaper labor rates and parts than a dealership. Previous right to repair bills have been left in Congress and never voted on. You can learn more at www.righttorepair.org.

The EPA has announced new, more strict ground level ozone standards. These new standards will put many localities into noncompliance. This is more government interference into our lives for little gain. These new standards could mean more vehicle emissions testing, mass transit requirements, restrictions on the use of small engines such as ATV's and lawn mowers and even chemical restrictions on things like charcoal lighter fluid. Every time we achieve the

ozone target, the EPA moves the target and it's not fair to people.

More bad news for supports of global warming – a 2007 United Nations report on glaciers in Himalayan Mountains was found to be copied from an article that appeared in the popular science magazine New Scientist in 1999. In other words no research was done on the glaciers – the UN people just copied something written in a magazine. The UN admits the error but the UN's climate chief is not going to resign because of this. Makes you wonder why the UN is pushing global warming and climate change.
