TIME TO BRING YOUR
CLASSIC CAR OUT OF THE
GARAGE? FORD HAS TIPS
TO MAKE SURE IT'S DONE
RIGHT

SUMMARY:

- Classic car cruising season is upon us, and Ford has tips to make sure your cruiser is in tiptop shape for the summer
- Owners should do an inspection of all fluids and hoses, as well as a thorough cleaning of the car – both inside and out – before taking it out for a cruise

CONTEXT / BACKGROUND:

Summer is here, and for many people that means classic car cruising is about to begin. Taking your car from winter storage to the street is no easy task – things like checking the fluid and hoses, hooking up the battery and, of course, washing every inch of your beloved car are just a sampling of what the job entails. Ford has compiled a list of tips from a variety of sources to make the task a little simpler and get you closer to dream cruising in your classic car.

DETAILS:

It's that time of year when car shows and cruise events are popping up all over and you're itching to get your classic car out of storage and ready to shine. Here are some tips to help show you the best way to get your car ready for cruising season.

First things first: Assuming your car was stored with a full tank of gas and fuel stabilizer, you can skip this step. If not, you must drain the old gas and replace with new.



Spots give it away: Look under the car. If there was a problem, spots on the ground would be a giveaway. Color or location of the spill is helpful in finding out where the leak is coming from.

- Red fluid usually indicates the transmission is leaking.
- Green-blue fluid means the radiator might be leaking.
- Oil on the floor under the front seal indicates your oil seals should be checked.
- Brake fluid under the master cylinder indicates a brake issue. Pop the top: Once you've

inspected the floor, pop the hood. You'll then want to check the wiper fluid, brake fluid, radiator fluid and oil. The oil should be down as low as it can go; the brake fluid should be high. If the brake fluid is dark brown, that's an indication it's dirty and needs to be changed, or the brakes need to be bled. With the hood still up, check the hoses:

- Pinch the heater hoses to ensure they don't show cracking or hardness.
- Squeeze the radiator hoses to make sure they haven't rotted.
- Check the fan belts try twisting them left and right to check for cracking.
- If the antifreeze hasn't been changed in the last 24 months, this is the time to do it.
- Also, as the car has been sitting for months, change the oil and filter.

Spark it: If your car has been stored for more than four months, next on the list is to remove the spark plugs. Be sure to mark the order when removing. Then spray oil into the cylinder walls, lubricating them so when you start the car, the walls won't get scratched.

Fully charged: Place the fully charged battery back in the car. The ideal way to store a battery is outside the car, somewhere off the ground where it's not cold.

Get it started: Now comes the fun part – put the key in and turn the engine over until the oil heats to temperature. Then put the spark plugs back in place. Once that's completed, get back in and start it up. After checking all lights and the brake pedal,

back out of the driveway and take it for a loop around the block. Listen for squeaks or rattles. You will also want to check the defroster, fan, heater and radio to make sure everything is in working condition.

Shiny clean: If you don't see any problems, park it in the driveway and give the car a thorough cleaning – wash and vacuum the interior, remove and clean floor mats, shine the windows and wax the car.

Sit back and cruise: After putting air in the tires, you're officially ready to head off to the first car show of the season to show off all your hard work. Enjoy!

New NASCAR Nationwide Mustang 'Wicked Fast'

The new NASCAR Nationwide Series cars will make their debut Friday night at Daytona International Speedway for the running of the Subway Jalapeño 250.

There were several changes made to the new racecars, but the most popular one seems to be the ability for manufacturers to create a better brand identity especially at the front of the car.

For Dodge the new car resembles a Challenger, Chevy the Impala and Ford the Mustang.

While all the makes are popular, the biggest splash seems to have been with the Mustang. The Ford Mustang has been one of the most popular muscle cars on the street for decades with a subculture that has been buzzing about the new NASCAR racecar since it was announced.

Tuesday I got a chance not only to see the new NASCAR Nationwide Series Mustang up close, but took a few laps in the new machine.

We were at the Walt Disney World Speedway in Orlando, a one mile tri-oval that has been the site of several NASCAR Truck Series and IndyCar races in the past. I had been around the track before; several years ago as a passenger with Carl Edwards behind the wheel of a Richard Petty Driving Experience car and in an open wheel two seater with Davey Hamilton, which was not an experience for the faint of heart.

Last year the old racer in me got a chance to get back behind the wheel when I was given the opportunity to take one of the RPDE cars for a few laps as part of a media event.

While all the previous laps I had turned on the speedway were fast, nothing compared to the speed the Mustang showed Tuesday.

The car is actually one owned by Roush-Fenway Racing, and unlike the previous racecars, this was an actual racecar that the team had simply bolted a passenger seat and belts into.

My driver for the ride was rookie Rickey Stenhouse Jr. who will race a similar car Friday night at Daytona. Stenhouse had never turned any laps on the track, but his lack of experience didn't show. The laps turned in the Mustang were easily the fastest I had ever experienced on the track, bar none. The only thing that kept flashing through my mind as we rocketed around the track was 'this thing is wicked fast'.

Indeed several of the RPDE employees agreed and although there were no times or speeds recorded, several of the employees seemed to think the lap speeds were in the mid 130's. Compare that to my low 120's, Edwards mid 120's and the IndyCar's high 120's and Friday night's race with the new cars looks to be 'wicked fast'.

"It's gonna be awesome,"
Stenhouse said. "Obviously, the night race at Daytona is a cool race anyway, and to have the new Mustang come out, which I think is the best-looking car out of the new Nationwide cars, I think the fans will agree and there's just gonna be a lot of excitement going into it."

Stenhouse also said he was surprised at the Mustang subculture he

discovered after the car was announced.


"I was at an appearance a few weeks ago and there were some members of the Mustang Club there and they were all excited," he said. "They told me that the whole Mustang Club was excited about it, so that's cool that the Mustang Club is back into NASCAR. We've had the Fusion for a few years, but now that you can get Mustang back into the sport, it might invite fans that weren't fans before. There are a lot of people and kids that are a fan of Mustang, but maybe not a fan of NASCAR. Now, I think we'll be able to draw them in and turn them into big fans."

News From The Car Club Council

After the Clean Air Act passed in 1990 car councils starting springing up to fight the crushing of old cars for the sake of clean air. It was as stupid as it sounds – haul an old non-running car out of someone's backyard, give them some money for it, crush it and then allow a big corporation to continue to pollute because that old car doesn't anymore. It took years to convince politicians that this didn't do anything to make the air cleaner. But then, they are politicians.

Today we have five car councils in Virginia. There are many councils in the United States and Canada. There have been attempts at getting together a national type of car council. Local councils seem to be better

because local representation is what car hobbyists want.

SEMA has been around for a long time. Specialty Equipment Market Association (SEMA) is a trade association that consists of a diverse group of manufacturers, distributors, retailers, publishing companies, auto restorers, etc. In other words SEMA represents those who sell us stuff. Years ago SEMA started SAN - the SEMA Action Network is a nationwide partnership of car clubs, and individual enthusiasts who work together to impact legislation that affects car and truck hobbyists of all kinds. By joining the SAN you will receive up-to-date alerts on hobby-related legislation in vour state and across the country. SEMA SAN follows legislative at the national and state levels and if you sign up with them you will get email alerts to legislation that could affect the car hobby. You can visit their website at

Then there is FIVA - Fédération Internationale des Véhicules Anciens – an organization dedicated to keeping yesterday's vehicles on tomorrow's roads. It is an international organization and you can visit the website at

Following the lead of FIVA is the newly formed HVA – Historic Vehicle Association – that is dedicated to keeping yesterday's vehicles on tomorrow's roads just like the international organization. HVA was formed by Hagerty Insurance. Hagerty, like SEMA SAN, sends out emails about legislation. The company has taken a big step and formed this new organization. You can check out the website at

http://historicvehicle.org

So in addition to being a member of a car council you can also join – for free – SEMA SAN and HVA and get alerts about legislation and other things that could affect the car hobby. Now understand that these people have a financial stake in the car

hobby. Hagerty sells us insurance and SEMA collects dues from companies that sell us car parts, magazines, service, etc. The only downside to this arrangement is if legislation would help a member of SEMA or help the insurance industry while hurting us. This is one of the reasons the car councils exist. Plus with a car council you can get local help with concerns. The council recently got the counties of Powhatan and Nottoway to end the property tax on antiques. The council answers lots of questions from hobbyists and has represented the hobbyists in meetings with DMV and members of the General Assembly as well as local governments.

The old Tip O'Neill saying all politics is local is very true. This council lists car events, helps with communication between clubs and is there to help you with concerns about the car hobby. So feel free to join one of the national organizations that help car hobbyists but keep in mind what happens locally is what can really count.
