

FORD ACCELERATES INTELLIGENT VEHICLE RESEARCH, CREATING 'TALKING' VEHICLES TO MAKE ROADS SAFER

- Ford is rapidly expanding its commitment to intelligent vehicles that wirelessly talk to each other, warning of potential dangers to enhance safety and flag impending traffic congestion to help improve the environment
- Intelligent vehicles could potentially help in 81 percent of all police-reported light-vehicle crashes involving unimpaired drivers, according to a National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) report
- Ford is building the first-ever prototype intelligent vehicles

that will tour the U.S. beginning this spring and will provide additional prototypes for the Department of Transportation's world-first research clinics expected to begin this summer

 Ford is doubling its intelligent vehicle investment in 2011 and plans a new 20-member task force of scientists and engineers to explore the technology's broader possibilities

WASHINGTON, D.C., Jan. 26, 2011 – Ford is aggressively accelerating its commitment to wirelessly connected intelligent vehicles – known as vehicle-to-vehicle communications – becoming the first automaker to build prototype vehicles for demonstrations across the U.S., doubling its intelligent vehicle investment in 2011 and dedicating even more scientists to developing this technology.

"Ford believes intelligent vehicles that talk to each other through advanced Wi-Fi are the next frontier of collision avoidance innovations that could revolutionize the driving experience and hold the potential of helping reduce many crashes," said Sue Cischke, group vice president, Sustainability, Environment and Safety Engineering.

An October National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) report on the potential safety benefits of vehicle-to-vehicle communications estimates that intelligent vehicles could help in as many as 4,336,000 police-reported, light-vehicle crashes annually, or approximately 81 percent of all light-vehicle crashes involving unimpaired drivers. Experts say intelligent vehicles could be on the road in five to 10 years.

Ford's demonstration vehicles will hit the road this spring, starting at major technology hubs across the country.

How it works: Ford's vehicle communications research technology allows vehicles to talk wirelessly with

one another using advanced Wi-Fi signals, or dedicated short-range communications, on a secured channel allocated by the Federal Communications Commission. Unlike radar-based safety features, which identify hazards within a direct line of sight, the Wi-Fi-based radio system allows full-range, 360-degree detection of potentially dangerous situations, such as when a driver's vision is obstructed.

For example, drivers could be alerted if their vehicle is on path to collide with another vehicle at an intersection, when a vehicle ahead stops or slows suddenly or when a traffic pattern changes on a busy highway. The systems also could warn drivers if there is a risk of collision when changing lanes, approaching a stationary or parked vehicle, or if another driver loses control.

Ford hits the gas on vehicle communications: After a decade of research, Ford plans a new 20-member task force – consisting of company planners, engineers and scientists from around the world with expertise in safety, eco-mobility, infotainment and driver convenience – to accelerate development of intelligent vehicles with features that provide a range of benefits to consumers.

Ford also is doubling its intelligent vehicle research investment, building on the company's SYNC® and MyFord Touch™ innovations. The goal is to define the next 10 years of safety, convenience and driver assistance, and strengthen the company's position as the global industry leader in connected vehicle technology.

"While there are challenges ahead, the foundation of these smarter vehicles is advanced versions of technologies that are pervasive – Wi-Fi and crash avoidance systems that Ford has pioneered in mainstream vehicles today," said Paul Mascarenas, vice president, Research and Advanced Engineering and chief technical officer. "Intelligent vehicles could help warn drivers of numerous potential dangers such as a car running a red light but blocked from the view of a driver properly entering the intersection."

Speaking the same

language: Ford is partnering with other automakers, the federal government, as well as local and county road commissions to create a common language that ensures all vehicles can talk to each other based on a common communication standard.

This public-private partnership will include the world's first government-sponsored driving clinics beginning in summer 2011, for which the company will contribute two prototype Ford Taurus sedans. The DOT's Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) will head the research, continuing to coordinate with a coalition of automakers organized by the Crash Avoidance Metrics Partnership (CAMP), which is a joint research group headed by Ford and General Motors. The partnership is working to develop inter-operability standards in advance of completing the research phase in 2013.

"Ford has laid the groundwork to give vehicles a voice with SYNC and Wi-Fi technology," said Jim Vondale, director, Ford Automotive Safety Office. "Now we're working with other automakers and government leaders worldwide to develop common standards globally to bring intelligent vehicles to market quicker and more affordably."

Vondale has been appointed by Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood to represent automakers on the ITS Advisory Committee. Mike Shulman, technical leader, Ford Research and Advanced Engineering, leads the government-industry technical partnership as program manager for CAMP.

Beyond safety, endless possibilities: By reducing crashes, intelligent vehicles could ease traffic delays, which would save drivers both time and fuel costs. Congestion also

could be avoided through a network of intelligent vehicles and infrastructure that would process real-time traffic and road information and allow drivers to choose less congested routes.

According to Texas
Transportation Institute's (TTI) 2010
Urban Mobility Report, traffic
congestion continues to worsen in
American cities of all sizes, annually
wasting nearly 3.9 billion gallons of
fuel in 2009 and costing the average
commuter \$808 in additional fuel.
Leading factors in traffic delays are
caused by accidents, breakdowns and
road debris, TTI maintains.

"The day is not far off when our vehicles will operate like mobile devices with four wheels, constantly exchanging information and communicating with our environment to do things like shorten commute times, improve fuel economy and generally help us more easily navigate life on the road," said Mascarenas.

Laying the connectivity groundwork: Many of Ford's current technologies show how intelligent vehicles will be able to help drivers. For example, features that alert drivers to approaching hazards, such as Ford's collision warning with brake support and Blind Spot Information System (BLIS®) with cross-traffic alert rely on radar sensors to detect vehicles or objects close to the vehicle.

"Ford has pioneered connectivity in modern vehicles with SYNC," said Shulman. "We believe advanced Wi-Fi for intelligent vehicles could be added to smartphones or GPS systems and simply connect to SYNC like today's phones."

FORD V-8 GOES SUBMARINER IN FINAL DD TEST

Daytona Beach, Fla. — With more than 13 hours of testing spread during five days of testing that all but bookends the month of January as the Rolex Sports Car Series makes its way to the season-opening race, the Rolex 24 At Daytona nonetheless remains the year's only race for which the allotted practice hours are fewer in number than the race itself.

Still, than number of hours won't be enough.

However, with wary, cautious eyes nervously glancing at the clouds in the sky's far northern reaches, rather than practice many teams were just as apt to pack and flee in an effort to outmaneuver the winter storm now gripping the mid and northeastern United States.

While it could be said that diverted were the attention spans of those hitting the road, working on race setups and completing full fuel runs, Starworks Racing's No. 8 Ford-Riley nonetheless pinned their collective ears back and set a record: a Daytona Prototype's first "sub-40" lap around Daytona International Speedway's 3.56-mile road course.



And they said it'd never be done when the Daytona Prototype first hit the sportscar racing scene in 2003.

Given that Ford powered the Multimatic-built DP victor in the 2003 Rolex 24 At Daytona it only seems appropriate that a Ford engine would likewise power a DP below a mark many felt would never fall.

Scotsman Ryan Dalziel was at the wheel of the Starworks car, which posted the 1:39.973 lap (128.195 mph).

"I could tell it was a quick lap," Dalziel said afterward, "But I didn't know how fast, of course. The car felt good and my Ford V-8 was humming. It didn't strain even a bit."

The next-highest Ford on the final-practice time sheet was that of Michael Shank Racing's No. 6 Ford-Dallara, shared by AJ Allmendinger, Michael McDowell and Justin Wilson.

"First, I want to congratulate a fellow Ford team in scoring that important mark but, at this point, we're paying attention to two things," team owner Mike Shank said.

"Jan. 29 [start of the Rolex 24 At Daytona] and getting our crew back home so that we can begin the process of tearing down the cars and reassembling them for that. Trust me, we're not going to leave anything on the table come the Rolex 24."

The Chevrolet Camaro of Lawson Aschenbach and Kirk Spencer managed to claw its way to the top of the Continental Tire Sports Car Challenge's final day at Daytona International Speedway's Roar Before The 24.

Then again, such may have occurred simply because many of the teams, including that of Roush Performance, had pretty well packed the haulers long before the final session had concluded.

Nonetheless, the Camaro team posted the best time of the test with a 1:57.826 lap at an average speed of 108.771 mph.

The fastest Ford Mustang on Sunday was the No. 21 FR500C of Scott Panzer and Todd Snyder, formerly of the Roush Performance shop, which sat at the top of the CTSCC's third test session at The Roar and remained the fastest Ford Mustang on hand by besting its own previous hot lap with a 1:58.317 (108.319 mph).

"We're kind of proud to see it do so well," Jack Roush Jr. said with a broad smile.

"As for our new Boss 302R we found a number of problems that we're trying to iron out," Jack Roush Jr. said. "But it's a new race car and that's to be expected."

The No. 120 Ford Mustang Boss 302R's co-driver, Billy Johnson, could hardly contain his enthusiasm.

"Insofar as speed, it didn't disappoint us. It was very fast," Johnson said. "I can hardly wait for the next couple of weeks to go by." **Photos & Articles from Ford Racing**

News from the Car Club Council

It has been so far so good with the 2011 General Assembly session. Although no bill has been introduced that would negatively affect the old car hobby there have been several bills introduced that could affect you and your driving experience. Bills were introduced that would make it illegal to use a cell phone while driving. And I bet the members of the assembly who introduced these bills will still use a cell while driving even if their bill becomes law. There are a couple of bills that would increase the state tax on gasoline by ten cents a gallon. I

don't expect these to pass. There are a number of bills dealing with how to pay for road improvements and repairs. There are even bills making photo red easier for communities to approve. The open alcohol container bills are back with a \$25 fine just for having a container of alcohol in your vehicle that has been opened. It could be a half empty closed container but since it has been opened you would be fined. The primary seat belt bill has already failed.

- People who elude police could have their vehicle confiscated and sold
- License plates "In God We Trust" and "Don't Tread on Me" and "A Life Like Yours" and "In Remembrance April 16, 2007"
- Failing to stop for a school bus would be reckless driving
- Lose your driver's license for not paying child support
- Required to wear a helmet when riding a moped
- No one under the age of 8 can be a motorcycle passenger
- Prohibits big trucks from using the left lane of some highways
- Motorcycles can go through red lights under certain circumstances
- On the road emissions testing
- Permanent registration for daily drivers
- Department of General Services to purchase natural gas and electric vehicles
- No smoking in cars with a minor present
- Limit speed limit to 60 miles per hour
- Required to remove snow and ice from vehicle
- Prevents DEQ from regulating carbon dioxide
- Allows ads on sheriff office vehicles
- Vehicles passing bicycles must pass by no closer than three feet

- Cannot use a credit report to determine auto insurance cost
- Increase threshold for water damaged vehicles
- DUI ignition interlock for first offense

I suggest you not only look at the auto related bills but also all of the bills. There are a number of strange bills in the assembly and some of them will certainly affect you in some way. There is a link on the VAACC website to track legislation which leads to the GA website where you can search for all bills introduced. The good news is most bills fail to become law.

Now the bad news on E15 gasoline: on October 13, 2010 the EPA approved the use of E15 in vehicles back to the 2007 model year. On Friday January 21st the EPA issued a wavier for the use of E15 in cars and light trucks model years 2001 – 2006. The EPA – on its website – says that E15 should not be used in vehicles older than 2001, any heavy duty vehicle, any motorcycle, any lawn mower, chain saw, ATV, boats, etc. Severe engine damage could occur if used in the prohibited vehicles.

I'm not sure I want to use E15 in anything if the EPA strongly says do not use it in so many vehicles. Reading the EPA reports on E15 it appears to me that the EPA testers were more worried about damage to emissions equipment and changes in tailpipe emissions with E15 and not about how the gasoline makes the vehicle run.

Even on the EPA website the EPA admits the approval of the E15 was at the request of Growth Energy – a group that lobbies for ethanol producers. There have been several old car hobbyists who have voiced that changing gasoline to something older vehicles cannot use is a way to get those vehicles off the road. My opinion is this is just old fashioned greed – the ethanol producers want to make more money.

There are a number of problems with producing more ethanol including higher food costs; fewer corn exports when the US needs to export more and import less plus Congress

just approved the extension of \$6 billion a year for ethanol subsidies at a time when the government needs to spend less.

There are some serious questions about using E15 gasoline: Who would buy a fuel that could cause engine damage and will cause an engine to get less miles per gallon while giving lower performance? The gasoline stations that sell E15 can be sued if the mix causes damage – the EPA gave them no wavier of immunity. Why would they sell it? The EPA expects to take months to figure out how to label E15 so it will not be pumped into the many vehicles that cannot use it.

Let's think about that last one for a moment. Recall the mid 70s when catalytic converters and unleaded gasoline were introduced? The automakers had to change the fill pipe on the unleaded vehicles to insure no one put leaded gasoline into those vehicles. How can the EPA keep people from putting E15 into vehicles that shouldn't use it?

E15 has the potential to be a real problem for the Obama administration and the EPA. What if stations start selling E15 and in order to sell it the price is lower than regular? People might buy it just because it's cheaper than other gasoline. How else could anyone sell this stuff? And if people have serious problems because of E15 how will the news media react?

We have been through this before with MTBE – another gasoline additive that has poisoned ground water in several states and Canada. It has been replaced with ethanol. How much did you hear about MTBE on the news? There are still many pending MTBE lawsuits.

This is from Wikipedia on MTBE: "Subsequent U.S. findings indicate tens of thousands of contaminated sites in water wells distributed across the country. As per toxicity alone, MTBE is not classified as a hazard for the environment, but it imparts an unpleasant taste to water already at very low concentrations.

The maximum contaminant level of MTBE in drinking water has not yet been established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)."

The EPA still does not classify MTBE as the poison it is yet the agency wants to control carbon dioxide – the substance we exhale and plants take in to produce sugar.

The EPA has made a big mistake with E15 and SEMA SAN, the Historic Vehicle Association and many others have asked the EPA to rethink the approval of E15. One thing is certain – we will have to live with the consequences of this decision.
