- 2013 Shelby GT500 Launch Control Ensures Smooth Starts Regardless of Surface Condition
- 2013 Ford Shelby GT500 is the first to be equipped from the factory with launch control
- SVT engineers have given Shelby GT500 drivers the ability to fine-tune the launch control settings, spinning wheels for consistent, maximum acceleration

DEARBORN, Mich., May 17, 2012 - Paraphrasing a classic quote -"With great power comes the need for great control" - the engineers at Ford's Special Vehicles Team have stepped up to the plate to manage the massive output of the 2013 Shelby GT500.

Whether a driver is a track-day veteran or getting his first ultra-highperformance sports car, the new launch control system on the 2013 Ford Shelby GT500 will help ensure he gets smooth, consistent and fast starts every time.

Uncontrolled wheel spin is generally undesirable, whether commuting to work or racing away from the Christmas tree on a Friday night at the drag strip. Both safety and performance suffer when the wheels can't get enough grip on the road. However, properly regulated, some wheel slip can be your friend.

"Launch control is essentially a special mode of the traction control system that integrates the brake and engine management systems to keep the tires balanced on the peak of the mu-slip curve in order to achieve maximum thrust," explains John Pfeiffer, senior engineer, SVT Vehicle Engineering. "With so much more power and torque on tap from the new 5.8-liter V8, launch control makes it easier for drivers to take advantage of the performance."

With launch control enabled, the driver just has to press the accelerator pedal to the floor and then smoothly and quickly release the clutch pedal just as he normally would when executing a clean start. The difference is that the electronics will automatically hold the engine steady at the desired speed and manage the rear brakes to allow the optimum amount of wheel slip for maximum traction.

"We recognize not every driver has the same style, and surface, tire and climate conditions vary," said Eddie Khan, SVT Engineering supervisor. "Most of our competitors' launch control systems have a fixed engine launch speed. We've given Shelby GT500 drivers the ability to adjust the engine speed to achieve best and most consistent performance, no matter where and when they drive."

Shelby GT500 drivers can enable launch control in two ways – either through Track Apps™ on the 4.2-inch LCD in the instrument cluster or simply by tapping a switch on the left side of the instrument panel. When using the Track Apps screen, drivers can also adjust the desired engine

speed for the launch in 100 rpm increments from 3,000 to 4,500 rpm. When first getting accustomed to launch control or if the pavement is cooler, a lower speed may be more appropriate. Switching to racing tires or running in an autocross event on a warm Saturday morning may call for a launch speed closer to the upper end of the range.

Once the desired engine speed has been set, launch control can be toggled on or off by tapping the instrument panel switch – more convenient than the intricate multistep process required on many other vehicles. After the launch control has been enabled or disabled, it retains that mode even after the engine has been switched off and restarted, something drag racers frequently have to do as they slowly make their way through the lines to the next quartermile pass.

"We developed this system to enable 90 percent of drivers to be able to achieve very fast, smooth and consistent starts with the Shelby GT500 regardless of their skill level," said Khan. "Experienced drag racers may be able to get away slightly quicker, but chances are they won't be as consistent."

Veteran drag racers will find the Shelby GT500 also gives them extra flexibility. Switching off the traction control while the launch control is on produces an rpm-only mode that engine calibration engineer Tom Siebyla has tuned to keep the engine speed rock-steady with the electronic throttle and ignition without scrubbing off any speed with the brakes. Autocrossers or track-day racers can also mix and match the normal, sport and off modes of the stability control with the launch control to achieve the degree of sliding or control that best suits the conditions or their personal driving style.

For those times when there isn't enough grip to use launch control effectively, such as dust or moisture on the pavement, Ford electronic brake control development engineer Dan Dunn has built smarts into the

launch control that enable it to automatically switch off and revert to traction control.


"It's not as intrusive as some TC systems have been in the past," added Khan. "We wanted to help the driver make consistent starts without getting in the way."

Launch control won't do the driving, but it is a tool to help drivers extract consistent high performance from the most powerful production Mustang ever.

"For drivers who want to have some fun at their local drag strip with a stock machine, the 2013 Shelby GT500 is the ultimate bracket racer," said Khan. "We've given our drivers the ability to exert control over all the power and torque this Mustang can produce."

So Long, Shelby Carroll Shelby 1923-2012

The automotive world's most famous failed chicken farmer, Carroll

Shelby, died Thursday, May 10, at Baylor Hospital in Dallas, 110 miles due west of tiny Leesburg, Texas, where he was born on January 11, 1923. Shelby, 89, had been ill for eight months, and his cause of death was listed as pneumonia.

Shelby often said that if he had been better at raising chickens, he never would have had to resort to his career plan B: building and racing cars.

That the automotive icon lasted as long as he did surprised no one more than Shelby, who was first diagnosed with heart problems 52 years ago, which effectively ended his race-driving career—near the end he was downing nitroglycerin tablets while he drove. One year earlier, he had won the 24 Hours of Le Mans, but he did not complain about the cards dealt to him, so seamless was his transition to car designer and builder.

"We are all deeply saddened, and feel a tremendous sense of loss for Carroll's family, ourselves, and the entire automotive industry," said Joe Conway, board member and president of Carroll Shelby International. "There has been no one like Carroll Shelby and never will be. However, we promised Carroll we would carry on, and he put the team, the products, and the vision in place to do just that."

Shelby's path to sports cars was a typical one for the era. He began as a hobbyist in 1952, dragracing hot rods. By May of that year, he had won his first road race, driving an MG TC in Norman, Oklahoma, beating faster, more powerful cars.



Not surprisingly, he soon sought more powerful cars to drive, building a reputation that led to an invitation in 1954 to drive an Aston Martin DB3 at Sebring and then an Aston DBR1/300 at Le Mans.

Three years later—the chickenraising business forgotten—he founded Carroll Shelby Sports Cars in Dallas.

In 1960, Shelby was preparing to race a Maserati 250F, but everything changed a month later when he experienced chest pains, and a doctor confirmed he had angina pectoris, a heart condition. His final professional race was in December 1960.



One year later, though, Shelby set in motion the sort of innovation and entrepreneurship that made him a legend. In 1961, he made a deal with British firm AC Cars to install a new, compact Ford V-8 into its tiny sports car at his shop in California. He called it the Cobra.

Shelby's new outfit—named Shelby-American—began a racing program for the Cobra in 1962. The car would record a DNF in its first race in October 1962, but in January 1963, Dave MacDonald and Ken Miles took first and second at Riverside, beating the Corvette Sting Rays. Racing continued with drivers like Dan Gurney and Phil Hill.

Then, in September 1963, Shelby began the Daytona Cobra coupe project for Le Mans, and in June 1964, the Cobras and Shelby-American won the GT class and placed fourth overall at the 24 Hours. That same year, Shelby began work on a Ford Mustang hot rod, resulting in the 1965 Shelby GT350.



Based largely on that success, Ford handed over development of the GT40 to Shelby. In 1966, GT40s took first, second, and third at Le Mans, achieving Ford's central goal: beating Ferrari.

It was about that time that Carroll Shelby began to assume a larger-than-life persona in the automotive media. His first Texas chili cook-off took place in 1968, in part to enhance the value of some wasteland-caliber property he owned in Texas. The car magazines loved the brash, outspoken Texan, and everyone loved his cars, which tended to follow his simple mantra: little car, big engine. "It's as simple as that," he once told Car and Driver.

Ford and Shelby soon parted ways, but he continued to build cars and wheels and became a successful tire distributor;

Shelby had a way with money. In 1982, Lee Iacocca (the first executive at Ford who really believed in him) was running Chrysler, a company that badly needed to develop credibility with the performance crowd. Shelby lent his talent and, more important, his name to the four-cylinder Dodge Shelby Charger and Dodge Omni GLH and GLHS, among other Chrysler products.

Shelby helped develop the Dodge Viper and made multiple public appearances on its behalf. But finally, his fickle heart caught up with him. In June 1990, he received a heart transplant. In May 1991, less than a

year later, he paced the Indianapolis 500 in a Viper. His own heart problems led him to found the Carroll Shelby Foundation that funds heart transplants for kids.

His health failed again in 1996, at which time his son Michael donated a kidney to his father. The next year, his relationship with Chrysler over, Shelby partnered with Oldsmobile on the Shelby Series 1 sports car.



By 2003, though, Shelby had returned to Ford, working on the Ford GT project that would help the company celebrate the Ford centennial. That August, Chris Theodore, Ford's vice-president of advanced product creation, announced that the company would, once again, manufacture a line of "Shelby-Ford" vehicles. In December, Shelby Automobiles was founded (the name was changed to Shelby American in 2009). In March 2005, the 2007 Shelby GT500 Mustang made its debut at the New York auto show.

Over the past few years, Shelby continued to make appearances for Ford and for his charities, despite declining health.

Shelby American headquarters, next to Las Vegas Motor Speedway, is a frequent tourist destination. This summer, the 662-hp, 200-plus-mph Ford Mustang Shelby GT500 will debut, and Ford executives insist that Shelby had more than a little input into its development.

None of this is to say, though, that Shelby and Car and Driver always saw eye to eye. In March 2008, the magazine published a story on the various lawsuits that involved Shelby—some filed by him, some filed against him—as well as referencing an exposé by another publication that suggested that the Carroll Shelby Foundation had taken in far more than it had paid out. It also covered the ongoing disagreements between Shelby and the Shelby American Automobile Club.

Most of the controversies were resolved by the end of the year, though, and Car and Driver published that story, too, following a lengthy discussion with Shelby, then 85. The way he characterized many of the issues, he knew his time left was limited, and he wanted to make sure his legacy was in order and in the hands of people who had his best interests at heart.


"I don't care how people remember me," Shelby told Car and Driver then. "But I just want to make sure they have the story straight". **Article by Car & Driver**

News from the Car Club Council

There are a number of things I want to share with you this month.

Local Registration Fees: I always get questions during the spring about local registration fees. Someone gets charged a fee from a city or county for their antique vehicle. The localities may charge a fee of up to \$50 for an antique vehicle because the locality cannot exceed what the state charges and current antique registration is \$50. Although they can charge up to \$50 many of them charge a fee of \$5. The locality may only charge the fee once because the state only charges it once. However I suspect there are localities that are charging a fee every year because they believe the law is the same for all vehicles when it is not. The real problem is there is no penalty for a locality to violate this law. Sure they may refund your \$5 fee but there is no real punishment for the violation. I requested a state Attorney General's opinion on the law through Governor Kaine a few years ago and got nothing. The AG at the time is now our governor.

producers and the federal government (EPA mainly) are doing their best to bring E15 gasoline to market. Blender pumps are in our future. It's tough for me to see why anyone would buy gasoline that yields less power and performance while reducing gas mileage but the government wants you to buy E15. It's "green" and is renewable. And I think it's going to be a tough sell. Mix in that equation the fact that the government is leaving gas stations on the hook for any lawsuits that occur due to mis-fueling,

mis-labeling or engine damage and I can't see why any station would sell E15.

The Coordinating Research Council commissioned a two-year study on engine durability when using E15. The study was done by FEV, a long time consultant to the EPA. The EPA approved the use of E15 before studies were completed. Below are the results of the CRC study which were released in May.

"The CRC study released today showed adverse results from E15 use in certain popular, high-volume models of cars. Problems included damaged valves and valve seats, which can lead to loss of compression and power, diminished vehicle performance, misfires, engine damage, as well as poor fuel economy and increased emissions.

"Clearly, many vehicles on the road today are at risk of harm from E15. The unknowns concern us greatly, since only a fraction of vehicles have been tested to determine their tolerance to E15," said Mitch Bainwol, president and CEO of Auto Alliance. "Automakers did not build these vehicles to handle the more corrosive E15 fuel. That's why we urged EPA to wait for the results of further testing."

The potential costs to consumers are significant. The most likely repair would be cylinder head replacement, which costs from \$2,000 (to) \$4,000 for single cylinder head engines and twice as much for V-type engines"

The study included 2001 through 2009 year cars.

Vapor Recovery Systems:

The federal government is considering the phase out of the vapor recovery systems for gas pumps. These are the hoses that cover the pump nozzle at gas stations. Vehicles have had recovery systems since 1998 so the systems at gas stations are no longer needed.

NASCAR and Green Energy:

NASCAR has used E15 gasoline in some race vehicles. Now NASCAR is teaming up with the government (the EPA) by signing onto an agreement to raise awareness of environmentally friendly products. This isn't the NASCAR of the 50s or 60s. What was ignored about using E15 in race engines is the fact that these engines are rebuilt after each race and that negates any damage caused by E15.

Car Show Mass E-Mailings:

There are a few people who think copying emails off the council website - and other websites linked to the council site - and sending mass emails including flyers and registration form attachments is the "right" way to advertise their car show or event. There are warnings on the calendar and member pages on the council website but they still do it. And usually they don't use the blind copy box, they paste the emails into the "to" so that everyone can copy the emails and place on a mailing list. This ignores the fact that we get thousands of hits on the calendar each month and many from people not in clubs. The height of this nonsense was reached recently when someone sent an email about a show and included a registration form. This was emailed THE SAME DAY THE SHOW WAS CANCELLED. And of course he didn't email again to say the show was cancelled. If you get an email asking you to attend a show you need to exercise caution.
