Ford Atlas Concept Hauls Away Autoweek Magazine's Most Significant Vehicle Award

The Ford Atlas Concept made its worldwide debut at NAIAS on Tuesday, Jan. 15. A design and engineering study inspired by decades of listening to customers in the places where they work and play, the concept has tomorrow's pickup buyers in mind.

Breakthrough features include active aerodynamic elements in the grille, front air dam and wheels that reduce wind resistance to save gas. Truck-specific features that improve capability, durability and productivity

include a Dual-Purpose Tailgate Step that integrates with a roof cradle to become a rack for long objects like ladders, Hidden Cargo Ramps to load ATVs and motorcycles, Trailer Backup Assist to enable accurate reversing with a trailer via the simple twist of a knob, and more.

Near Perfection In BMW Performance 200

For the second consecutive year the Roush Performance No. 61 Mustang Boss 302R, piloted by Billy Johnson and Jack Roush Jr., was in Victory Lane at Daytona.

Going into the Jan. 25
Continental Tire Sports Car Challenge
BMW Performance 200, the spotlight
shined brightest on an armada of
Aston Martin Vantages. The cars,
mostly in livery of Multimatic
Motorsports, had dominated Roar
Before the 24 testing earlier in the
month.

But – really, to no one's surprise – it was Roush Performance's No. 61 Mustang Boss 302R that went to Victory Lane for the second consecutive year. Veteran pilots Billy Johnson and Jack Roush Jr. – the latter making his return to the series after breaking his wrist in an incident last September at Mazda Laguna Seca Raceway - led 29 of the 62 laps around the 12-turn, 3.56-mile speedway road course.

Roush Jr., who has driven to eight GS victories with Johnson, was pleased to be back in the seat – especially with his father, Jack Roush, watching from pit road.

"It's so great for him to have a chance to be here considering how busy his schedule is," said Roush Jr. "It is a big deal given what he's accomplished here and to have this victory. There's a lot of internal pressure to win and perform. Bringing home a win is exactly what we shoot for."

The team recovered from an early race flat tire with Johnson finally reaching the lead on the 33rd lap.

"I was trying pretty darn hard the last few laps," said Johnson. "Those Astons and Porsches were pretty quick."

Rum Bum Racing's No. 13
Porsche 997, helmed by Matt Plumb
and Nick Longhi ran second with
Multimatic's Nos. 15 and 16 Aston
Martins of GS champions John
Farano/David Empringham and Nick
Mancuso/Frank Montecalvo occupying
third and fourth. With CKS Autosport's
No. 01 Camaro GS.R of Eric Curran/Lawson Aschenbach taking fifth, it
appears at least four manufacturers
are early contenders for the 2013
championship. Each automaker
enjoyed at least one lap at the head of
the GS field.

The Street Tuner portion of the race was a coming out party for Nissan, which had introduced its Altima Coupe to the class a year ago with mixed results. What the automaker and Skullcandy Team Nissan learned and applied to this year's effort more than paid dividends as Lara Tallman and Vesko Kozarov drove the No. 33 car to victory. The team's second entry, co-driven by Chris Lock and Tim McIntosh, placed ninth for good measure.



The victory is the first in CTSCC for Tallman and Kozarov. Tallman, a mother of two sons from Salt Lake

City, became the series' first female race winner since 2011.

"Winning at Daytona is simply awesome. There's no feeling in the world like being on the banks," said Tallman, whose best finish a year ago was a seventh – with Kozarov – at Watkins Glen International. "We've worked tremendously hard to build this team and the Altima coupes but we needed a win to establish ourselves as serious competitors.

"We knew we were capable but that's not always enough in racing. It all just came together – perfectly."

As in GS, three different brands scored finishes in the top three. Tyler Cooke and Greg Liefooghe finished second in the No. 81 BimmerWorld Racing BMW 328i with Kyle Gimple and Ryan Eversley third in the No. 75 Compass360 Racing Honda Civic Si.

All MCA shows for 2013 were listed in CVMC's Forums website and on our Face Book website under Forums.

The MCA club membership incentive drive for <u>each new member</u> has been reinstated. I have the forms for you to take advantage of this offer and help our club.

If you are planning on attending any of the two 50th Mustang anniversary celebrations in 2014, one in Las Vegas, Nevada and the other in Charlotte, N. Carolina I would like to give you a **heads up** on the advantages to becoming a member of MCA:

- Every Mustang entering any of the celebrations will be awarded a Mustang 50th award. Those awards are not MCA awards. They are only Mustang 50th Birthday Celebration awards.
- MCA award winning Mustangs, including Gold, Silver, Bronze, 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Conservators classes **are special** and will also be awarded an **MCA Mustang 50th** award in addition to the other. News from the Car Club Council

The General Assembly is in session and we are watching the bills that could affect the car hobby. All bills that pertain to vehicles are posted on the Virginia Association of Car Councils website at

http://vaacc.org/legis1.html. I suggest you take a look at all the bills in the Assembly as there are always bills that will affect you in some way. Just go to http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?131+men+BIL and click on All Legislation. I can assure you that among the nearly 3000 pieces of legislation you will find several that will in some way affect your life if they become law.

Vehicle legislation this session is concerned with cell phone use while driving, penalties for multiple DUI offenses, a few special license plates, one plate bills and how to pay for road building and maintenance. There are many bills in many different transportation areas but these are the major ones.

There are many bills on cell phone use and texting while driving. Some even make it a primary offense which means a police officer can stop and charge you if seen calling or texting from a phone while driving. At the time of this writing the bills are in committee.

There are several bills that increase the penalty for multiple DUI's. As has been done for many years the penalty for conviction of a DUI or multiple DUI convictions is under consideration to be increased, in some cases to a mandatory prison term.

There are a few special license plate bills. Fewer of these bills are being introduced each year. The state

currently has well over 200 special license plates plus vanity plates so the market for special plates may be getting saturated.

The session began with four one license plate bills. Then the three carried over from the last session were killed and SB 771 sponsored by Senator Wagner was withdrawn. The State Police, some local police administrators and the Department of Corrections (makes plates and will lose money with one plate) were against SB 771. The members of the Senate Transportation Committee have gotten hundreds of emails, calls and letters from citizens that want the one plate bill to pass. Apparently the voices of the few against the bill - all public employees, were greater than those of many citizens. The state would have gained about \$2 million in additional money if the one plate bill became law. The savings is from charging the same fee for one plate that is charged for two plates currently.

There are several bills in the Assembly that deal with funding road maintenance and construction. There are bills to prevent tolls being placed on I-95 and other roads. There are bills that would increase the gasoline tax using different methods. There is the governor's plan to get rid of the gasoline tax and replace it with a higher sales tax, higher vehicle registration fees and some other changes. It will be interesting to see what is decided. Many states are trying to find ways to fund roads. The combination of a poor economy and vehicles getting greater gas mileage have led to less money generated from the gas tax. This has led to some really strange ideas on how to fund roads. Six states are looking at monitoring the miles driven by vehicles, charging for those miles and sending a bill to be paid every month or two. A device in your car would track your miles driven. As you can imagine this isn't going over very well with the public.

Delegate Sickles put in a bill that we pushed last year; it passed and ended up being vetoed by the

governor. This year the same legislation is in HB 1990. The aim of the bill is to fine people \$250 who live in Virginia but register their vehicle in Maryland to avoid the higher personal property tax in Virginia. The part of the bill car hobbyists like is the removal of a possible \$100 fine for storing a vehicle for parts or a project. It reads "Nothing in this section shall be applicable to motor vehicles that are stored on private property for the purpose of restoration or repair or for removing parts for the repair of another vehicle." That line would remove any fine for the storage of vehicles. The bill is currently in committee.

I have sent out some notices about the one plate bill. The councils will continue to monitor legislation in the General Assembly and inform car hobbyists of anything of importance.
