2015 ANNUAL LEAF CRUIISE



It was Halloween and forty one Mustangs gathered at McDonald's on Patterson Avenue in western Henrico County for the "Great CVMC Leaf Cruise" to the "Famous Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia". Forty one Mustangs is the largest we have ever had for the Cruise. The weather was fantastic for late October in Virginia.

We gathered all of the Mustang's for the great trek west. We took Patterson Avenue west through the small towns along the James River of Goochland Courthouse, Columbia to Fork Union. Along the way we got stuck behind a

Rubber Tire Front-end Loader which slowed us down quite a bit. The Loader turned off just east of Goochland Courthouse and we thought we were good to go. Unfortunately we got stuck behind a farmer who couldn't or wouldn't go any faster than 20mph. He also would not pull over when he had chances to let the forty one Mustangs and assorted other vehicles pass. We finally had enough and started to pass him when it was safe which ended up breaking up the pack. When we arrived in Fork Union we lost about twelve Mustangs who missed the turn and crossed the James River headed to North Carolina.

We continued on the Scottsville were we stopped to use the restroom, get refreshments and gather up the missing Mustangs.
Scottsville is the same Scottsville that you heard about in the TV show "The Waltons". We also had three more Mustangs join us and brought our total number to forty four, WOW!

We left Scottsville and continued west to Thomas Nelson Highway (U.S. Route 29) were we turned south along the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The locale Sheriffs Department and the Virginia State Police must have heard we were coming through. They kept an eye on everyone and we all behaved ourselves as good

Mustangers always do. We continued south until we reached the Tye Brook Highway (State Route 56) were we turned west and on to the Blue Ridge Mountains.

The Pack of Mustangs stopped at Mac's Country Store close to the intersection of Patrick Henry Highway (State Route 151) and where Route 56, Crabtree Falls Highway follows the Tye River into the Blue Ridge. We swamped Mac's Country Store while people were filling up their Mustang's, using the restroom and getting ready for the trip over the Blue Ridge.

When you get to the bottom of the mountain you have 15 miles of curvy Virginia Mountain Road to look forward to. You will have sharp turns, steep grades with big boulders right at the edge of the pavement and steep drop offs on the other side. The road is not very wide so you have to be careful. Oh yeah in Virginia the un-posted speed limit is 55 mph. I promise you, there is no way you can travel 55 mph the entire length over the mountain. There are some short stretches where you might be able to hit 55 mph but they are few and far between.

After you cross the Blue Ridge Parkway it is down the mountain to the little town of Vesuvius where we gather at Vesuvius Church so everyone can get together and tell stories and take pictures and basically catch their breath. Then it's onward to Lee Highway (U.S. Route 11) and north to Stuarts Draft Highway (U.S. Route 340) then east through the town of Stuarts Draft and on to Waynesboro where we ate. Afterward most people headed their different ways while most traveled back to Richmond via I-64. After all it was Halloween and they had to get ready for the little goblins.

The CVMC Leaf Cruise is a lot of fun and is growing larger every year. We all had a blast and are looking forward to next year!



DECEMBER 2015 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

Some important things are coming up soon. First is the international summit on climate change that begins the last day of November and runs for a few days in December. This may be the largest climate change summit yet. Next month I will report on the decisions made at the summit and how they may affect us. Polling tells us that the things Americans are most worried about are the economy and jobs, terrorism, health care, immigration with climate change not even making the top ten. In fact I'm sure a lot of people would rather see a summit on global terrorism instead of a Paris summit on global warming.

Countries attending have already signed off on the creation of a fund that will raise \$100 billion per year by 2020 (Green Climate Fund). The fund could be used for aid to areas hit by natural disasters – disasters climate change proponents say will be caused by climate change.

There are still many who doubt not only climate change but believe it was invented to redistribute wealth. Dr. David Evans, an engineer with six degrees in applied mathematics, has found errors in climate models that bring doubt that climate change in manmade. Recall the recent hurricane Joaquin models and how wrong they were – only one model, the European model got it right, which was the model that got Sandy right.

Freeman Dyson is a 91-yearold theoretical physicist who was a contemporary of Einstein at Princeton, has received multiple international awards for his scientific efforts, and has published numerous books and papers on a wide range of topics. He is also a democrat who describes what he calls an 'agenda-driven' perspective on global warming. His quotes below:

"It's very sad that in this country, political opinion parted [people's views on climate change]. I'm 100 per cent Democrat myself, and I like Obama. But he took the wrong side on this issue, and the Republicans took the right side."

"What has happened in the past 10 years is that the discrepancies between what's observed and what's predicted have become much stronger. It's clear now the models are wrong, but it wasn't so clear 10 years ago. I can't say if they'll always be wrong, but the observations are improving and so the models are becoming more verifiable."

"Climatic effects observed in the real world are much less damaging than the effects predicted by the climate models, and have also been frequently beneficial. I am hoping that the scientists and politicians who have been blindly demonizing carbon dioxide for 37 years will one day open their eyes and look at the evidence."

A study by NASA found that temperature rise took a pause of 17 years 11 months and NASA can't explain it. And why does this matter to car hobbyists? Like the ozone standard this indirectly affects us because our vehicles produce carbon dioxide and use hydrocarbons for fuel. Both of which governments want to regulate and by regulate I mean make more expensive.

The General Assembly will begin meeting in January and already some bills have been pre-filed. I will report on any bills that could affect the car hobby. As usual you can expect bills on things that have been popular in the news recently. Expect about 3000 bills and resolutions to be introduced and also expect few to pass and become law.

You've been paying too much at the pump. No one complains about the price of gasoline when it is below \$2 a gallon but maybe we should. Many experts believe that the price of gasoline should be much lower since the price of crude oil has dropped so much. A couple of the experts think we have been overcharged more than a billion dollars in the past few months. When the price of crude drops the price of gasoline should drop but what actually happens is the drop takes much longer than it should. There has been no word from anyone in the government about price gouging and the feds are not issuing a cost of living increase to those on social security due to the "low" price of gasoline. We just can't win.

WOOD BROTHERS TO RETURN TO FULL 36-RACE SCHEDULE IN 2016

Wood Brothers Racing announced today that it will run a full, 36-race schedule in 2016 with Ryan Blaney continuing as the team's driver contending for a NASCAR Sprint Cup championship with Motorcraft/Quick Lane and Ford Performance returning as anchor sponsors.

"We are beyond excited to make this announcement about going back to full time competition," said Eddie Wood, team co-owner, at a press conference at Homestead-Miami Speedway during Ford Championship Weekend. "It has been something we've worked toward since 2009 when we started running limited schedules.

"I have to thank Ford's Dave Pericak and Raj Nair, Edsel Ford, our technical alliance partners Team Penske and Roush Yates Engines, as well as everyone at Motorcraft, for working with us to make this day possible," Wood continued. "It'll be fun to see just how good Ryan Blaney, Jeremy Bullins and our team can be over a full season.

"Lastly," he added, "it'll be great not to have to worry about rain anymore on qualifying day."



Due to their limited schedule and the current point system, inclement weather prevented Wood Brothers Racing from qualifying for three races in which they were slated to run this season.

"We are proud to have played a role in helping get the Wood Brothers back on the track full time for 2016," said Pericak, global director, Ford Performance. "These guys have been Ford's most loyal team for 65 years, and they deserve the chance to show how they can perform when they are at every race. They've earned a full-time slot by running strong all year, even under adversity. We plan on

being part of this when they capture their 100th Cup victory."

"This is a day everyone has looked forward to," said Edsel B. Ford II, board member, Ford Motor Company. "The Wood Brothers represent everything that is great about this sport -- tradition, family, loyalty, competition. When we asked them to regroup and consider going part-time in 2009, it was always with an eye on getting back to this day. And we are thrilled it is finally here."

Thus far in 2015, the Wood Brothers' iconic No. 21's best finishes were fourth in the spring Talladega race, 12th at the Brickyard, 14th in the fall Charlotte race and seventh in the most recent Kansas race. Even in the four races when the team had engine problems, the Motorcraft/Quick Lane Ford Fusion was running toward the front of the field when the trouble arose.

"This is every driver's dream come true," Blaney said, "Getting a chance to run for the NASCAR Sprint Cup. I'm really looking forward to running a full schedule with this historic Wood Brothers team and hopefully get them their 99th and 100th wins sooner rather than later."

Motorcraft's partnership with Wood Brothers Racing began in 2001 and quickly bore fruit by winning the Food City 500 at Bristol Motor Speedway with Elliott Sadler behind the wheel. The Motorcraft-Wood Brothers pairing had its greatest triumph in 2011 when rookie driver Trevor Bayne captured the Daytona 500.

"We are thrilled to have been able to work with Ford Performance to make the Wood Brothers' a full-time race team for the 2016 NASCAR season," said Mary Lou Quesnell, director of marketing for Ford Customer Service Division. "Wood Brothers Racing has been an excellent representative of our brands for 15 years and we look forward to seeing the famous No. 21 Motorcraft/Quick Lane Ford Fusion on the track week after week."

In addition to Motorcraft and Quick Lane Tire and Auto Centers, the team will look to add additional sponsors to the roster during the 2016 NASCAR Sprint Cup season.

Wood Brothers Racing was formed in 1950 in Stuart, Va., by Hall of Famer Glen Wood. Wood Brothers Racing is the oldest active team and one of the winningest teams in NASCAR history. Since its founding, the team won 98 races (including at least one race in every decade for the last seven decades) and 117 poles in NASCAR's top-tier series. Fielding only Ford products for its entire history, the Wood Brothers own the longest association of any motorsports team with a single manufacturer. Glen's brother, Leonard, who still can be found in the team's pit, is known for inventing the modern pit stop.
