



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News From The Blue Oval



THE TALE OF THE DRINTER AND THE TWO-SEAT "SHORTY" FORD MUSTANG

Back in the early 1960s, as Ford Motor Company product planners, designers and engineers were brainstorming ideas for a compact sporty car, there were numerous proposals for two-seaters. Most of those concepts never got any further than sketches, but at least one running prototype of a two-seat Mustang was built and survives today thanks to the devotion of Bill Snyder of Hudson, Ohio.

The "shorty" Mustang, as it is often called, was designed by Vince Gardner and built in 1964 by long-time Ford supplier Dearborn Steel Tubing for a traveling custom car show. Now known as DST Industries, the company still builds and prepares many Ford prototype, concept and show vehicles.

"I saw the shorty Mustang during one of the stops of that traveling car show and decided I had to have one," said Snyder. "I told a Ford rep I wanted to buy a two-seat Mustang to go along with my then 10year-old Corvette, but he said it was a one-off that they were never going to build."

The owner of Ohio-based screen printing company Nordec Inc., Snyder has always been a sports car fan. Although Snyder was hugely disappointed, he nevertheless kept an eye out in case Ford ever did produce a similar car. It turns out patience truly is a virtue, and several years later Snyder ended up owning exactly the car he saw on that show stand.



How did this car come to be?
After choosing a Gale Haldermanpenned two-door hardtop as the basis
for the production Mustang in the fall
of 1962, the Ford design team
continued to look at possible
alternatives for expanding the lineup.
A convertible joined the hardtop at
Mustang's launch in April 1964, with a
fastback coming a few months later.
Body styles that were considered and
rejected included a four-door sedan
and even a two-door station wagon.

Early on in the program, twoseaters were frequently pitched as potential replacements for the late, lamented first-generation Thunderbird, which by that point had grown into a luxury four-seat coupe. However, twoseaters then and now are niche products and Ford wanted its new car to have a broader appeal including young families, so the decision was made that the car would have four seats.

Despite that, when an opportunity arose to build a custom Mustang for an upcoming traveling car show, DST brought in freelance designer Gardner to take another shot at a two-seat Mustang. It's not known

if Gardner ever saw or had access to rejected Ford design studio sketches, but the concept crafted by the DST team bears a strong resemblance to at least one sketch from February 1963.

The resulting car is a Mustang fastback with 16 inches removed between the rear edge of the door and the rear axle. Working with one of the preproduction 1965 Mustangs that otherwise would have been sent to the crusher, the DST fabricators created unique rear bodywork from fiberglass and new outer door skins that incorporate the classic Mustang side scoop.

When the tour where Snyder had seen the shorty ended, the car, which was rejected for production, was set to meet the same fate as most such cars – the crusher. Not wanting to see this unique Mustang destroyed, Gardner stashed it away in a nearby warehouse.

Several months later, after Ford reported it stolen and received an insurance payout, the warehouse owner discovered the car. Since Gardner had apparently not paid any rent, the insurance company that paid out the claim took possession of the car and later sold it to one of its executives.

Shorty finally finds a home Four years after he first saw the shorty Mustang at the car show, Snyder spotted it once again, this time listed in the for sale section of Hemming's Motor News.



"I contacted the seller and immediately sent a driver from my printing business to Connecticut to

pick up the car," said Snyder. "I've owned this one-of-a-kind Mustang for the last 46 years."

Over time, the original auto show lacquer finish cracked and the car was sprayed with body primer as Snyder accumulated about 15,000 miles on the car. Before it went on the show circuit in 1964, Ford engineers installed a special engine. The original 260 cubic-inch V8 that was available in Mustang was bored out to 302 cubic-inches and a trio of two-barrel carburetors were installed, making this effectively a prototype for one of the most beloved engine configurations in Mustang history.

When Snyder decided to restore the car several years ago, his wife found some of the original color under the hood and worked with a paint supplier to match it exactly. Since it was a concept car, the original builders had used plexiglass for the quarter windows and backlight rather than cutting custom glass. Despite being heavily fogged after nearly 50 years, the restorers were able to buff the windows back to their original clarity.

Looking as good as or better than it did in 1964, the one-of-a-kind, two-seat shorty Mustang made its debut at the 2013 Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance in Florida. This year, Snyder has been taking it to a variety of events celebrating 50 years of Mustang.

News from the Car Club Council

January is the month that the General Assembly begins meeting and working on legislation. As always we monitor legislation to make sure the rights of car hobbyists are protected. As I write this we are weeks from the first session of the assembly. There have been some pre-filed bills and a bill of interest that was carried over from last year. Also the EPA dropped a bomb on everyone about a month ago when the agency announced it is going to lower the ozone standard from 75 ppm to 70, 65 or even 60. The agency says the lowering of the standard will save lives. More on whether that is true or not later. First let's look at the General Assembly.

HB 714 was continued from 2014 to the new General Assembly session by the Senate Transportation Committee. In its original form this bill would have exempted antique vehicles from the state's antiquated exhaust law. Virginia is one of the few states that does not allow aftermarket parts for exhaust systems unless they produce the same or less noise than factory parts. The bill has been amended to include "and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual levels of noise". This means is it now the same as the current law. SB 702 has been pre-filed for the 2015 session by Senator Richard H. Black. This bill "Exempts antique motor vehicles with exhaust systems in good working order from the requirement that motor vehicle exhaust systems "prevent excessive or unusual noise."

The fate of both bills will be decided after the session begins. HB 714 could be killed in committee as could SB 702. What we really need is to update the current exhaust law to allow for aftermarket parts and to leave it up to police to determine if a vehicle's exhaust system is excessively noisy. The state cannot afford decibel meters or other expensive equipment and we don't want time consuming testing. Permit vehicle owners to have aftermarket exhaust equipment and let the police officers make a determination if the exhaust noise is excessive. This is the simple solution. What we have now with a ban on aftermarket parts - unless they have the same noise level as factory parts -

cannot be enforced fairly especially with antique vehicles. There is no way to side by side test the exhaust noise of antiques with their factory new counterparts and car hobbyists have to rely on aftermarket exhaust parts since many parts are no longer manufactured for older vehicles.

The EPA has decided to update the ozone standard. The current standard is 75 parts per million for ozone. Ozone is a combination of three oxygen molecules that occurs when there is sunlight and temperatures in the 90s or above. Virginia for years did not even monitor ozone levels during colder months. The EPA says the standard needs to be lowered to 70 or 65 and is taking comments on 60 ppm. The agency claims the health benefits from the new standard will make up for this being the **costliest pollution rule ever!**

You may recall years ago when we fought emission testing of vehicles in the Richmond (and other) areas. You may recall years ago when we got vehicles 25 years and older exempt from emissions testing. We will fight

those battles again if the ozone standard is lowered.

Plus this new expensive standard will be a business and iob killer. And the EPA's data on saving lives appears not to be accurate. This is from a report from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality: "Only 1 out of 12 studies considered by the EPA showed an association between long-term exposure to ozone and early death (after considering other pollutants). This single study is used by the EPA as evidence that longterm exposure to ozone causes mortality. Interestingly, this study did not show higher mortality in Southern California, where some of the highest ozone levels in the country are measured."

Others have also claimed the EPA is exaggerating claims on prevention of early death and the claims about preventing asthma. How can the EPA say that lowering the ozone standard would prevent asthma when the cause of asthma is unknown? From that same report: "Exposure of human volunteers to ozone showed similar lung effects in asthmatics and in non-asthmatic subjects."

Another problem is background ozone or ozone that is just there no matter what actions man takes. Because of this background ozone some areas will be in non-compliance. But if no action man takes will lower the ozone levels then why punish the people who live in these areas?

BULLINS TO RETURN TO WOOD BROTHERS AS CREW CHIEF

(Motorcraft/Quick Lane/Wood Brothers Racing Press Release)

Wood Brothers Racing has announced that Jeremy Bullins will rejoin the No. 21 Motorcraft/Quick Lane Ford Fusion team next season to serve as the crew chief for Ryan Blaney in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series, beginning with the 2015 Daytona 500. Bullins returns to the Wood Brothers organization following a successful three-year tenure with Team Penske's No. 22 NASCAR Nationwide Series team that produced 21 wins and two consecutive NASCAR Nationwide Series Owners' Championships.

Bullins first worked with the Wood Brothers in 1999 on the Pro Cup and Late Model cars driven by Jon Wood. In 2000, Bullins became race engineer for the iconic No. 21 Ford in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series, a position he held until June of 2002. Bullins moved on to work with ST Motorsports, Robert Yates Racing and Richard Childress Racing, where he helped drivers Kevin Harvick and Clint Bowyer claim a total of nine Sprint Cup Series victories as a race engineer.

A native of Walnut Cove, N.C., Bullins joined Team Penske in 2012 to serve as the crew chief for the No. 22 car in the Nationwide Series, earning three wins in his first full season at the helm. In 2013, Bullins led the team to 12 wins with four different drivers and the team's first Nationwide Series Owners' Championship. The No. 22 Ford team won the Owners' Title again this season behind six series victories. In total, Bullins earned 21 wins, 14 poles, 57 top-five and 79 top-10 finishes in 99 starts with the No. 22 Team Penske Nationwide Series program.

"This is a great opportunity for me at this point in my career to move to a great organization with a solid driver, while still getting the chance to work with the people that I've come to know and respect at Team Penske," said Bullins. "Everyone in the sport knows about the Wood Brothers and recognizes that No. 21. To get a chance to work for Eddie and Len and the entire organization and to have Ryan behind the wheel, is pretty much everything I could have asked for."

Eddie Wood, co-owner of the No. 21 Ford Fusion, said he's looking forward to resuming his working relationship with Bullins, who studied mechanical engineering at North Carolina State University before joining the Wood Brothers.

"I feel like he's coming home," said Eddie Wood. "He worked with us when we were still at our shop in Virginia and he was just getting started in NASCAR. Now he's a proven winner. It's an honor to have him back with us. We're anxious for him to get his first Sprint Cup victory, as a crew chief, which will be No. 99 for us."

Bullins joins the No. 21 Wood Brothers team at the same time Blaney makes the transition as the Motorcraft/Quick Lane team begins its alliance with Team Penske. Bullins and Blaney worked together through all three years of Bullins' tenure at Team Penske. The duo produced two Nationwide Series wins along with eight top-five and 16 top-10 finishes in Blaney's 19 starts driving the No. 22 Team Penske Ford Mustang. Len Wood, who owns the Motorcraft/Quick Lane team with his brother Eddie, believes that bringing Bullins on board will pay immediate dividends.

"Jeremy coming over from Team Penske to help us out will help in the transition from our past alliance to our new alliance with Team Penske," said Len Wood. "Because he's worked with Ryan in the past, and knows the Team Penske system, Jeremy should be able to get Ryan on the right track and running competitively right out of the box, without a long development period."
