We will be stopping at Golden Corral for lunch.




There will be a few stops along the way to stretch our legs and enjoy the view.

SEPTEMBER 2015 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

"The EPA has personally put more pollutants into the ecosystem this year than all other businesses, organizations and people combined." That is a quote I spotted on the allknowing Internet. I'm not sure if that is true or not but it certainly seems appropriate after the toxic spill in the Animas River in August. Apparently the EPA (charged with keeping our water, soil and air clean) bulldozed toxic sludge from a mine that hadn't operated since 1923 and then orange became the new "green" of the Environmental Protection Agency. Cleanup costs for this toxic spill are estimated at \$30 billion. And by the way the EPA waited 24 hours before

notifying anyone about the toxic mess in the river including people who live along the river. That's how they protect the public.

Remember the BP oil spill? At the time head of the EPA Lisa Jackson misled the public on the scope of the spill claiming most of the spill was gone out of the system. Jackson also used pseudonyms on government accounts to get around public disclosure rules that allowed the agency to come up with climate change policies.

The EPA's highest paid employee and a climate change expert was recently sentenced to 32 months in prison for lying. He told the EPA that he was also working as a CIA spy so he could avoid doing his job beginning in 2000 and got away with it until recently. "Why did I do this? Greed – simple greed – and I'm ashamed of that greed," John Beale told the court. He also said it was possible that he got a "rush" and a "sense of excitement" by telling people he was worked for the CIA. "It was something like an addiction," he said.

And then there are the EPA sex scandals. An EPA official sexually harassed 16 women and got promoted to assistant administrator for the EPA's Office of Homeland Security. After that promotion he harassed 6 more women. Plus there were two EPA employees caught looking at porn on their agency computers. Kids spotted the porn on one computer during "Bring Your Child To Work Day". That employee was allowed to retire with full benefits. Another employee caught looking at porn during work hours is currently suspended with \$120K yearly pay.

The bottom line is the idiots working at the EPA should not be in charge of anything. Under the influence of lobbying from the ethanol industry we now have E-15 gasoline approved for use in vehicles despite the manufacturers of those vehicles

stating that E-15 usage will damage the vehicle engines. Now the EPA has announced a goal of using more ethanol for next year. Could this be the beginning of requiring E-15 be available at gas stations?

We are waiting for the ozone standards and report on fracking from the EPA this fall. No one knows how low the EPA is going to go on the ozone standards but one thing is certain it will be one of the most costly regulations ever in the history of America.

Let's shift gears to gasoline and the Keystone XL pipeline. The State Department review needed for approval of the pipeline has been completed and it was found that the pipeline would not increase greenhouse gas emissions significantly. President Obama has said that review was needed before he would approve the pipeline but months later no approval. Not approving this pipeline means that instead of the US getting that oil China and India will get it.

What is up with gas prices? If you've been watching the market you know that oil prices continue to fall but gasoline prices stay relatively high. I think gas prices should be well below \$2 a gallon. Yes, I know about that Mid-West refinery but it doesn't supply the entire country and gasoline usage has dropped. Some experts say that there is lag time between the oil prices dropping and gasoline prices dropping. I say something else is going on to keep the prices high. Another thing I want to know is why do the media keep saying gasoline station owners are making only 2 or 3 pennies on a gallon of gas? I've seen stations less than 20 miles apart selling the same brand of gasoline with more than 20 cents a gallon price difference. I'd like an explanation from those politicians who sponsored bills to prevent price gouging at the pump.

Drunk driving has always been a problem and harsher penalties along with stepped up enforcement have not worked. In California drunken driving arrests are down and the reason is the introduction of UberX, a low cost version of Uber ridesharing. A study found this:

"Economically, results indicate that the entrance of UberX results in a 3.6 percent – 5.6 percent decrease in the rate of motor vehicle homicides per quarter in the state of California. With more than 13k deaths occurring nationally each year due to alcohol related car crashes at a cost of 37 billion dollars, results indicate that a complete implementation of UberX would create a public welfare net of over 1.3 billion to American taxpayers and save roughly 500 lives annually"

Uber has become the enemy of drunken driving and not taxi companies. People who have been drinking are more likely to call a low cost taxi service if one is available. Uber even teamed up with MADD – the mothers against drunk driving. Uber claimed that MADD would not admit that its service greatly reduced drunken driving.

If you're out there driving you need to be extra careful. Fatalities from car crashes are up from last year in Virginia. In Chesterfield County fatalities are up 186% from last year. There were 7 fatal crashes in Chesterfield at this time last year and 20 so far this year. Look for more police presence on the roads Labor Day weekend.

First-Drive Reviews of the Shelby GT350 Mustang

The first-drive reviews are starting to roll in for the Shelby GT350 Mustang. In news that will be a surprise to no one, the automotive journos love it.

Apparently, Jalopnik is somewhat impressed with the Shelby GT350, modestly calling it "the best performance car Ford has ever built." That is some lofty praise indeed. "If an engine can win an award just for sound this one would be in the Hall of Fame tomorrow. It's unlike anything I've heard and is probably the single best exhaust note on a new vehicle. It. Is. Awesome.," writes Robb Holland in his review.

"The 526-hp Ford Shelby GT 350 Mustang coupe lived up to its billing as the most track-capable, best-handling Mustang ever in its first drive along the Pacific Coast Highway and at the legendary road course at Laguna Seca race track," begins Mark Phelan's review in the <u>Detroit Free Press</u> of the pony car's latest iteration.

"In that great racetrack in the sky Carroll Shelby is smiling. The GT350 not only lives up to his name, it promises a car as comfortable on the street as it is fearsome on the track," writes Henry Payne in The Detroit News.

Patrick Carone, the deputy editor of Scout.com, was one who got to test-drive the Shelby GT350 at Laguna Seca. He filed a video review that appeared on MSN.com and Scout.com, calling the GT350 "clean, nimble ... a pure driver's car."

We'll keep looking around for more reviews and update this article as they roll in.

BRISTOL BELONGS TO LOGANO

Joey Logano won the IRWIN Tools Night Race at Bristol Motor Speedway for the second straight season.

Logano led 176 laps and held off a hard charging Kevin Harvick in the closing laps to score his third win of the season and second consecutive in the annual Bristol summer race. It was the Team Penske driver's 11th career Sprint Cup Series win.

"It was kind of interesting to watch it in the mirror," Logano said of Harvick trying to pass him in the closing laps. "I was watching him drive in and I was like, 'He's going to get me eventually,' so I just wanted to make sure I stayed at least three or four car lengths up on him so he didn't get to me."

Harvick came back from a pair of pit road miscues for the second-place finish.



"Yeah, we had an interesting night," Harvick said. "We went to the back twice and passed a bunch of cars. I think all in all, it's just a huge credit to the team.

"They just keep bringing fast cars to the racetrack, and we're able to overcome a lot of things and everybody just keeps grinding away at whatever the circumstances are, and we're able to overcome things, and that's really what it's going to be about over the last 10 weeks."

Denny Hamlin, Jimmie Johnson and Clint Bowyer rounded out the top five.

"Could hang with them for the first part of the run, but then I couldn't work traffic that well and those guys were able to get away," said Hamlin, who started the race from the pole. "Just a decent average day. Definitely not what we expected."

Brad Keselowski, Carl Edwards, Kyle Busch, Dale Earnhardt Jr. and Ryan Newman completed the top ten finishers.

The NASCAR Sprint Cup Series takes next weekend off before returning to action on Sunday, September 6 for the Bojangles' Southern 500 at Darlington Raceway.
