The 2015 MCA President's award application was finished and the US Post Office tracking indicates Headquarters received it 26 June in Pensacola, Florida. Our club needed 100 points in calendar year 2015 to qualify and we earned 227 points. Our June newsletter listed most of the items I needed to track during last year. In calendar year 2014 we earned 251 points which was the highest in the 10 years I have been applying for this award.

Some results of April's Board of Directors meeting in Dallas, Texas:

- MCA President reminded all present that the tiered membership registration was fully up and running and people are beginning to sign up on the different levels.
- Treasurer Lynda Blackstock briefed the Board on our 2016 final Budget, Profit and loss, and Financial Reports.

AUGUST 2016 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

It is the middle of summer and Congress is in recess along with our General Assembly but things are still happening. The Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) is an American federal program that requires transportation fuel sold in the U.S. to contain a minimum volume of renewable fuels. The RFS originated with the Energy Policy Act of 2005 and was expanded and extended by the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 (EISA). The volume of renewable fuel – call it ethanol since no other ingredient is being added to gasoline that is renewable - has to increase under the law each year and this is one reason why the EPA approved E-15 gasoline. And we all know the problems caused by E-10 gasoline are exaggerated by E-15. We know the higher mixes of ethanol and gasoline are not meant for older engines, aircooled engines and small engines. This has not halted the expansion of renewable (increase in ethanol volume) fuel added to gasoline. More than 50 organizations are working to get legislation introduced into Congress to change the RFS. So far not much has happened but if you follow Congress you already know not much has been happening as far as legislation in Congress.

I bet it has been a while since you heard something about the Bonneville Salt Flats – the speed week has been cancelled for the last couple of years because of thinning salt. The deterioration of the salt flats led to the formation of the Save the Salt Coalition. A resolution urging the U.S. Bureau of Land Management to restore the Bonneville Salt Flats was approved by the Utah House and Senate and signed by Governor Gary Herbert. The group is urging Congress to take action to restore the salt flat's 13.5 mile speedway. The Salt Laydown Project is a project designed to add more salt to the speedway. Water from nearby salt lakes is pumped, evaporates and leaves more salt. This has been going on since 1998.

The AG's For Clean Power attorney generals from 17 states and the Virgin Islands sent out subpoenas to over 100 scientists and companies because they denied climate change. Exxon Mobil was subpoenaed to turn over 40 years of internal company documents. The AGs suggest racketeering by so called climate deniers. The leader of the group, Virgin Islands Attorney General Claude E. Walker, has withdrawn his subpoenas because the people and companies that got them fought back. It looks like there was not a strong case against those who don't believe in man-made climate change (plus that freedom of speech thing in the First Amendment to the United States Constitution). Ken Kimmell, president of the Union of Concerned Scientists, insists that the House committee's subpoenas are "harassment" and an "abuse of power." Now that Senator Tim Kaine is the VP pick keep in mind that Kaine joined with other members of Congress to denounce climate denial organizations after the formation of the AG's For Clean Power.

A July 4th report from Rystad Energy tallied up teh world oil resevers and it looks like the USA is number one. The report included proved and probable reserves, discoveries and undiscovered fields. The US led the way due to the shale oil. It breaks down like this:

United States has an estimated 264 billion recoverable barrels

Russia has 256 billion barrels

Saudi Arabia has 212 billion barrels

I was watching TV late in June when President Obama and the prime ministers of Canada and Mexico were together on stage for a news conference announcing the North American Climate, Clean Energy and Environment Partnership. The three leaders stated that North America by 2025 will increase clean energy / electricity production to 50% of the energy used by the continent. There is just a slight problem with this – it just might be impossible to do in less than 9 years. Here are the goals set:

Generating 50% clean power by 2025 Reducing methane emissions from the oil and gas sector by 40% to 45% by 2025

Aligning appliance, equipment, and vehicle fuel efficiency standards
Further integrating the electric grid across borders to build resilience and security

Implementing policies that support the historic Paris climate accords — i.e., limiting global temperature rise to 2 degrees Celsius, and perhaps even holding it to 1.5 degrees Celsius

Phasing out fossil fuel subsidies by 2025, and calling on G-20 to do the same

The big question is what will this cost. No one really knows because we don't know what type of energy will be used to make the 50% clean energy goal by 2025. It certainly will not be wind or solar but whatever is done will be very costly. Electricity generation is going to be very important in the future because of the many things that are powered by electricity including electric vehicles.

THE FIRST-EVER SHELBY COBRA IS GOING UP FOR SALE



Few automotive figures have had a cult built around them quite like Carroll Shelby. Though his company stopped building cars after 1967, and some of his endeavors didn't exactly age well (see: The Shelby Series One), Shelby was a singular force of nature, preaching the gospel of American performance to the point where he's revered on the same level as Henry Ford, Ferdinand Porsche, and Enzo Ferrari. From the late 1960s on, he was an ambassador for his personal brand — a go-to for automakers looking to inject some performance pedigree into their lineups, and a constant presence at car shows, willing to talk to anybody who would listen. By the time he died in 2012 at age 89, it's likely he personally signed the dash or glovebox door of most of the cars that he had a hand in building, from the iconic Ford GT40 to the <u>Dodge-Shelby Omni GLH-S</u> hot hatch. Of course, before all of that, Carroll Shelby was a chicken farmer turned successful racer who was forced from the sport due to a heart defect. And in his forced retirement he set out to create a world-class American sports car. He found a willing partner in the tiny British sports car builder AC, which agreed to modify its Ace roadster to fit Ford's new 289 cubic inch V8 underhood. Of course, that car would become the Shelby Cobra, one of the most iconic cars on the planet.

Any one owner Cobra would be a big deal, but from 1962 to 2012, CSX2000 belonged to the man himself, Carroll Shelby. Matt Stone's 2012 remembrance in Motor Trend recalled how fond Shelby was of the car — and what a show-stopper it was — half a century later:

I spied the unmistakable shape of an early Cobra, and asked Shel' what the story was on this tidy blue roadster. "Oh, that's the first Cobra," he replied, in his gravel-laced Texas drawl.

"First 289, or first production 260?" I probed.

"No, the first Cobra; first one ah built."

"You mean that very first mating of an AC Ace and a Ford V-8-ever?"

"Yup."



CSX2000 went straight from Los Angeles to the 1962 New York Auto Show, where it was a sensation. While it was a deep gold color on the stand, Shelby already had a knack for self-promotion, and sought to get it out to the automotive press as quickly as possible. Over the next few months, the car would go on to be painted red, yellow, and blue to make it look like production had already started. By the time CSX2001 rolled off the production line in May 1962, Shelby made CSX2000 his.



The car sat for decades, was used as a museum piece, and even saw service at the Carroll Shelby driving school, but in its 54 years, Shelby never once thought about selling the car, turning down offers as high as \$5 million — and that was before the collector car market ballooned. "I've been offered a lot of money a lot of times, but it'll never be sold if I have anything to say about it," he told Motor Trend. "I want that car to remain in my family forever. Every time I look at that old car, I think, 'Shelby, you lucky son-of-a-bitch.'"



Now, four years after Shelby's death, the Carroll Hall Shelby Trust is putting the car up for auction at RM Sotheby's Monterey, California auction on August 19-20. No pre-sale estimates are given, but most predict that it'll dwarf that \$5 million offer Shelby personally turned down all those years ago. There may have been more powerful, and even more beautiful, cars that have worn the Shelby name, but none of them would've been possible without CSX2000. This one has the potential to be one of the most expensive American cars ever sold.
