MCA REPORT



As I recall MCA's 1st show was in the spring of 1976 at Stone Mountain, GA with only a few Mustangs. The following year there were around 100 Mustangs. Today MCA is a large nonprofit corporation with over 13,000 members worldwide. Here are a few facts from MCA's by-laws, available to you on their website, which applies to our club that you may not be aware of:

CVMC applied and was granted an MCA charter around 1985, which means we have to maintain at least 10 MCA members and all our officers must be MCA members. We have met all those requirements with around 46 MCA members. This requirement is different from Antique Automobile Club of America which requires AACA membership if you want to belong to an AACA regional club and AACA requires full club rosters

- sent to their Headquarters office at the beginning of each year.
- As your Regional Director I am required to submit, by March 1st of every new year a list of our club Officers and a club roster identifying all those MCA members with their MCA membership number.
- Since I am also a member of the MCA national club Board of Directors, about 10 days before the quarterly meeting an agenda is sent to me. I have agenda voting rights "For or against" any item requiring a vote. <u>IF</u> a vote is required then I will contact our officers, and if time permits, our directors for their consensus before I vote.
- There will be a clip board on the table for our MCA members to check and update their membership. Your names are in alphabetical order. If you are a new MCA member and your name is not listed please provide the requested information.

In January's newsletter is a list of 2016 MCA National shows. Since we will be celebrating MCA's 40th birthday at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway there will not be an MCA Grand National show this year. However at the 40th there will be another MORE program like the one they had at the 50th Mustang birthday celebration. MORE stands for Mustang Organizations Rallying Enthusiasts. Participation requires a group must have a minimum of 20 registered 40th MCA Mustangs attendees. I had some questions about the MORE program that is not covered on the Motosho registration site so I emailed the President of the Indianapolis Mustang club and here is his reply.

Good Afternoon Dave, thank you for your questions. I will try and answer them the best knowledge that I know.

 Will the MORE program parking be <u>inside</u> the speedway? Yes

- Will the Mustangs be able to stay in the MORE area over night? Yes
- Will there be security stationed in the MORE area over night? It is in the works on getting setup.

FEBRUARY 2016 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

The General Assembly is in session and the Virginia Association of Car Councils website has the listing of all auto-related bills at http://vaacc.org/legis1.html. I have gone through all legislation to compile the list of the bills. The most interesting bill is HB 1119 sponsored by Delegate Nick Rush. This bill is what I call the freedom of exhaust bill because if it became law you would be able to have aftermarket exhaust parts on your vehicle as long as the police do not think the noise level is excessive. Current law only permits exhaust parts that do not have a noise level above factory exhaust. I spoke with the legislative aide for Delegate Rush who informed me he didn't think the bill had much of a chance. The State Police are against the bill and Rush was contacted by SEMA, who want to bring back the old decibel meter test for exhaust. A decibel meter test bill failed years ago and there simply isn't funding for the meters. Instead legislators are looking at spending money for police body cameras.

I explained to the aide that we car hobbyists would like the current pre-50 exhaust freedom of choice extended to the 1974 model year – before catalytic converters and other federal emissions equipment was required. He asked that I send an email with the details and they will look over after the session. Delegate Fariss and Senator Black sponsored the pre-50 exhaust legislation that became law last year. Neither has responded to my letters or emails about a pre-75 bill. I still remain hopeful that in the next couple of years we will get exhaust choice of freedom in Virginia simply because a lot of people – and people in the legislature – realize that Virginia's exhaust law is outdated.

Now for the fun part as I list the strange and unusual bills that get introduced. Keep in mind that most of the bills get killed and never make it into law (something we can be thankful for).

Bills have been introduced to allow motorcycles to have five instead of four front lights. It is currently illegal to have more than four front lights on a vehicle in Virginia. Also a bill was introduced allowing motorcycles to go over all toll roads and bridges without paying any toll. Another bill would allow people 21 and over to ride motorcycles without a helmet – those bills have been killed in the past.

There must be a dozen or more bills to allow tickets to be mailed to people who pass stopped school buses. There has been a lot of talk about installing video equipment on school buses to stop people from going around the stopped buses. I'd like to hear from the people who pass stopped, lights flashing school buses — I want to know why they go around them.

There are a few bills that would raise the speeding limit for getting a reckless driving ticket from 80 mph to 85 mph. There is a bill to allow a jury to find someone guilty of improper driving for a reckless driving offense.

And the bills to fine people for smoking in a vehicle with a kid are

back – this time for kids 8 and younger.

There are a few bills to prevent a person registered as a sex offender from buying a special license plate from DMV. The license plate in question bears the legend "KIDS FIRST".

I didn't know kids could play with toy cars/vehicles on streets where the speed limit is 25 or less – a bill would end that and prohibit kids with toy vehicles from playing on any street.

Virginia isn't Europe – a bill has been introduced that would require all vehicles to burn headlights at all times including during the day. I've done some research on this and places where they have this law people complain about headlight glare and the fact that motorcycles are harder to notice. Hopefully this bill will die in committee.

There is a bill to repeal the use of the hated photo red traffic light program. In the past bills to repeal have failed, but we can hope.

There are bills that would require a car dealer to disclose that the vehicle for sale has been recalled.

A motor vehicle bumper bill would reduce the required bumper height from 14 to 9 inches from the ground. If this becomes law then vehicle bumper heights must be from 9 to 22 inches from the ground.

A bill has been introduced for a new special license plate with "STOP GUN VIOLENCE". As you know there are many bills in the Assembly this session that are both gun control and pro-gun. Another license plate bill would allow the use of a logo or emblem on the Sons of Confederate Veterans special license plates. "PROTECT POLLINATORS" – this bill changes the special license plates for Protect Pollinators from nonrevenue

sharing to revenue sharing and provides for the moneys to be allocated to the Virginia Department of Transportation to aid in the Pollinator Habitat Program.

Civil asset forfeiture is coming under fire in Virginia. This program allows the police/government to seize property even if a person has not been charged with a crime. Bills have been introduced to prevent the forfeiture unless the person has been found guilty of a crime.

There are a lot more bills of interest. As a citizen of this state I think you should go to http://lis.virginia.gov and click on all bills and resolutions – take a look at what those who are supposed to represent you have introduced and wish to become law. I'm sure you will find several bills of interest.

THIS SHELBY GT350 IS A FOUR-CYLINDER MUSCLE CAR KILLER

When it was introduced in 1965, the Shelby Mustang GT350 kicked off the muscle car era with a bang. For \$4,311 — nearly twice the price of a base Mustang (three times the price in full-on competition spec) — you got one of the most track-ready road cars in the

world. In its May '65 issue, Car and Driver said: "Basically, what Shelby has done is to convert the Mustang fastback coupe into a road-going version of a NASCAR stocker." Road & Track declared: "For the racing driver, it will also be a source of great amusement, as it should enable him to laugh all the way to the winner's circle in SCCA's class BP racing."

And why wouldn't they heap praise on such an incredible performance car? It had a 305 horsepower 289 cubic inch V8 mated to a four-speed manual transmission. It could sprint from zero to 60 in 6.5 seconds, and run the quarter-mile in 14.9 seconds at 95 miles per hour, and top out at 126, though according to Car and Driver, its "special, semi-racing Goodyears, with low-angle nylon cord; [are] safe at sustained speeds up to 130 mph." It was seriously impressive stuff for 1965. Today? Not so much.



Half a century after the GT350, Ford introduced an all-new Mustang lineup, including the EcoBoost, which has exactly half the cylinders the Shelby did. With its 2.3-cylinder turbocharged inline four and six-speed manual, it's anything but a consolation prize; in fact, its 310 horsepower and 320 pound-feet of torque take the car from zero to 60 in 5.2 seconds, run the quarter mile in 13.9 seconds at 98 miles per hour, and top out at an electronically-limited 149 miles per hour. And for the icing on the cake, it gets a combined 26 miles per gallon.

So from a pure performance standpoint, the \$27,000 EcoBoost would roast the 50-year-old GT350s, which are now worth just under \$300K on average. The vast majority of us will probably never own one of these mid-century gems, but that doesn't mean that there aren't millions of gearheads out there that still lust after them. So if you're in the market for a relatively affordable Shelby, but don't want to be embarrassed by a well-equipped Camry at a stoplight, Oklahoma-based Classic Recreations has the GT350 for you.

In early December, Congress passed The Low Volume Motor Vehicle Manufacturers Act of 2015, part of the larger Surface Transportation Reauthorization and Reform Act of 2015. It opened the door for companies that build replica cars to now begin selling them as turn-key vehicles. Until the law passed, these cars needed to be sold as rolling kit cars for customers to finish. Now, as long as the engines meet current EPA standards, these boutique manufacturers can stuff whatever they want under the hoods of their cars.

Enter Classic Recreations. The only licensed manufacturer of replica GT350s, the company has announced that alongside its current range of available Ford V8s (ranging from 420 to 1,000 horsepower), it will offer both the EcoBoost four and V6 engines in its tribute Shelbys.

"For years we have proudly hand-built the only officially licensed Shelby Mustang continuation cars in the world, but that doesn't mean we are stuck in the past," said company owner Jason Engel. The V6 engine may have been new to American cars when Carroll Shelby and his team were developing the GT350, and it's not likely they would've ever considered one for any of their '60s-era cars. But the 3.5-liter EcoBoost six shares its bones with the one powering the 2017 Ford GT supercar, so it isn't

likely to disappoint. According to the company:

And if the idea of a GT350 with a four-banger still scares you, don't worry; Classic Recreations is reserving it for the Chinese market for now. And while the current-generation EcoBoost Mustang is the closest analogue to the small-motor Shelby, its engine will be sourced from the Focus ST, not the current Mustang.



While Classic Recreations's continuation GT350s are a bargain compared to the real deal, the process starts by meticulously restoring an original Mustang Fastback, then works largely in the same way Shelby American did back in the '60s. As a result, its current crop of V8-powered cars doesn't come cheap — in fact, they start at \$139K. So if you want the classic Shelby attitude mixed with modern-day track presence, you could pick up a brand-new 2016 GT350R at the Ford dealership for less than half the price. But if you want the oldschool looks and attitude with more performance than the original, but don't care for that intoxicating V8 burble. Classic Recreation's retrofuturistic Shelbys could be the dream car for you.

Open Track


- -We have sold 25% of the open track spaces, once we reach 100% of the open track spaces sold, that track day will no longer be open for additional registrations.
