# MCA REPORT



Very soon, you will be receiving ballots in your Mustang Times to vote for the next year's MCA National Directors. There are 16 nominations for 12 positions along with photos of those nominees and their bios. Please be sure to take the time to read their bios and vote when the ballots arrive. This is your club and this is your opportunity to make your voice heard. Voting for your National directors is your right and privilege. MCA counts on your input to keep the MCA moving in the right direction which is the direction that they would like to see it continue moving.

Here are more details on the national Mustang Owner's Museum groundbreaking ceremony. More than 100 Ford Mustang cars lined up to park on the dusty strip of land that will soon be home for the Mustang Owner's Museum with car enthusiasts gathering for a groundbreaking ceremony Saturday, July 30th. The groundbreaking ceremony, held at 60 Pitts School Road NW, Concord, featured new and old Mustangs among them, including a 1967 GT500, a 1970 Boss 302 and a 1978 King Cobra, among others. Officials said they expect the Concord museum to have a soft opening in the Summer of 2017 and a grand opening that Fall.

"Ford calls the Mustang its heart and soul," said Cabarrus County Commissioners Chairman Steve Morris

during the groundbreaking ceremony. "So we are incredibly proud that the national Mustang Owner's Museum decided on Cabarrus County to be the right place to call home. More than 9.6 million Mustangs have rolled off of assembly lines and the best of the best will shelter right here," Morris said to the crowd of Mustang enthusiasts gathered at the groundbreaking ceremony. "There's no doubt that the Mustang faithful, like yourselves, will make a special trip to the museum. You will reminisce about the days you dreamed of owning your own and the nights you spent tinkering in your garage, somehow trying to improve on what is already one of the world's top performance machines." The development of the museum here stems from the organizers of the 50th Anniversary of Mustang which was celebrated in Concord in 2014.

While not affiliated with Ford Motor Company, Mustang Club of America or any other Mustang related business venture, the project is the concept of long-time Mustang enthusiasts Steve Hall, from Atlanta, Georgia and Ron Bramlett, from Morada, California. Hall said they look to spend more than \$1 million just in the construction of a new building that will house the museum. That does not include the cost of the exhibits themselves.

The building looks to be in the range of 24,000 to 30,000 squarefeet. The building should be able to house about 50 cars on display at any given time, depending on the size of the plan developers go with. The museum will have rotating exhibits throughout each year. Bramlett said they expect to be able to have a rotating exhibit thanks to the support of Mustang fans in the community, such as the Carolina Regional Mustang Club. "The only one of its kind, this attraction will serve as a gathering place for Mustang aficionados from across the globe," said Donna Carpenter, Cabarrus County Convention and Visitors Bureau

president/CEO. "A place where stories are shared, friendships are formed and memories are made."

The project is coming to Concord thanks to a relationship with the Cabarrus County Convention and Visitors Bureau. The bureau established a relationship with Hall and Bramlett after working to attract and host the Mustang 50th Birthday Celebration held in Concord in April 2014. Bramlett served as the executive director of the event. In addition to Mustang-related driving events and various events at the museum, Hall and Bramlett are also aiming to host a number of yearly Mustang gatherings to benefit the museum which will be announced at a later date.

With the selected location just two miles from Charlotte Motor Speedway, Hall and Bramlett have also started exploring partnership opportunities with track officials. Hall said they chose Concord for the museum, because of the success of the 50th anniversary of the Mustang event held in 2014 with over 4,000 Mustang from around the world were registered to participate at the events at Charlotte Motor Speedway.

"The Mustang is more than a car, it's a part of American culture," Cabarrus County Chairman Steve Morris said. "That is why the national Mustang Owner's Museum will appeal to the millions of people that visit our area each year. The Mustang is everywhere, it is recognizable to all of us. It's the most widely featured car on big and small screens and it's an inspiration for songs, it's featured in apparels, toys and games."

As a member of MCA you receive the professionally written, official club publication, Mustang Times magazine which is included with your membership. In the August issue is a complete guide to the MCA's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with the layout of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, a

picture of the Mustang American flag with 150 participating Mustangs at Carlisle. There are 3 different tier levels you can join online at www.mustang.org. These tier levels were discussed in the June and May issues of our newsletter.

For some of our new members there is another online Mustang club on face book. This club is devoted to just 6 cylinder Mustangs of all years. The nice thing about this club, there are no dues and the newsletter is online. The website is M6A. .

Check our newsletter, club and face book websites for upcoming parades, shows and cruise-ins in the Richmond metro area.

# SEPTEMBER 2016 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

The EPA has released new medium and heavy duty truck fuel efficiency standards. These standards claim to reduce greenhouse gases while increasing fuel mileage. The EPA claims that 1.1 billion tons of carbon pollution will be kept out of the atmosphere, 2 billion barrels of oil will be saved, \$170 billion will be saved in fuel costs and there will be \$400 a year saved in household costs by 2035. These new standards will cover tractor-trailers, heavy-duty pickups and vans plus these trucks - delivery, refuse, utility, dump, cement, and these buses transit bus, shuttle bus, school bus, along with emergency vehicles and recreational vehicles. They will be phased in over the next few years and be completely in place by the 2027 model year.

You may wonder as I do exactly what is going to be done to these large vehicles to achieve these savings. I have searched the EPA and federal documents hoping to find something similar to the fuel economy standards for light duty vehicles. I could not find

anything such as "school buses will achieve a set number of miles per gallon". Instead the reports are full of all the wonderful results that will occur in the future. This is the closest I could find to exactly what will be done in an EPA document: "different combinations of improvements like advanced aerodynamics, engine improvements and waste-heat recovery, automated transmission, lower rolling resistance tires, and automatic tire inflation can be used to meet standards. For tractors and vocational vehicles. enhanced test procedures and an expanded and improved compliance simulation model enable the vehicle standards to encompass more of the complete vehicle than the Phase 1 program and to account for engine, transmission and driveline improvements." I got that from a document that had 1690 pages! After looking through that document I can honestly say I am glad I don't work for a company that builds heavy trucks. Of course no one knows what costs these new regs will have on the trucking and bus industries. Hopefully the EPA and NHTSA will send out easier to read and understand information.

The EPA and the IRS must be the two hardest working federal agencies. The EPA has press releases almost daily and most of them are about cracking down on those who pollute. A recent release was about Harley-Davidson motorcycles super tuners. The company has been fined \$12 million and must buy back the super tuners because once installed on the bikes they produce more pollutants than allowed by EPA regs. Assistant Attorney General John C. Cruden, head of the Justice Department's Environment and Natural Resources Division states "Anyone else who manufactures, sells, or installs these types of illegal products should take heed of Harley-Davidson's corrective actions and immediately stop violating the law."

Recall that the EPA went after

vehicles being built into racecars because emissions devices would have been removed. The EPA is very aggressive in pursuing those who do not follow the agency's rules.

You may be wondering what is up with self-driving or autonomous cars. After years of research and development there are some of these vehicles on the roads. This summer Uber is testing a self-driving Volvo in an area of Pennsylvania. These vehicles are still in the process of being tested and developed. The Uber vehicle has a chime go off when it approaches a bridge because the camera and computer systems cannot "see" where the vehicle is when over water. From Wiki:

"Autonomous cars can detect surroundings using a variety of techniques such as radar, lidar, GPS, odometry, and computer vision. Advanced control systems interpret sensory information to identify appropriate navigation paths, as well as obstacles and relevant signage. Autonomous cars have control systems that are capable of analyzing sensory data to distinguish between different cars on the road, which is very useful in planning a path to the desired destination.

Some demonstrative systems, precursory to autonomous cars, date back to the 1920s and 30s. The first self-sufficient (and therefore, truly autonomous) cars appeared in the 1980s, with Carnegie Mellon University's Navlab and ALV projects in 1984 and Mercedes-Benz and Bundeswehr University Munich's Eureka Prometheus Project in 1987. Since then, numerous major companies and research organizations have developed working prototype autonomous vehicles."

Several companies and auto manufacturers are working on selfdriving cars and the equipment used to make them autonomous. Nevada was the first state to authorize the

operation of autonomous vehicles in 2011. There are now seven other states: California, Florida, Louisiana, Michigan, North Dakota, Tennessee and Utah plus Washington D.C. that allow the use of autonomous vehicles. Arizona's governor issued an executive order to allow autonomous vehicles. Our Virginia governor Terry McAuliffe announced in early June a partnership allowing research and development for autonomous vehicles to take place in the state with "Virginia Automated Corridors." If you are wondering about those corridors here is the answer from Virginia Tech:

"The Virginia Automated Corridors were established by the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute in partnership with the Virginia Department of Transportation; the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles; Transurban; and HERE, a high-definition mapping business. This new initiative was created in answer to Virginia Governor Terry McAuliffe's recent proclamation supporting the transportation institute in automated-vehicle research endeavors under the guidance of the Center for Automated Vehicle Systems.

The corridors feature more than 70 miles of interstates and arterials in the Northern Virginia region, including Interstates 66, 495, and 95, as well as U.S. 29 and 50. These roadways compose one of the most congested corridors in the U.S., with multiple transportation challenges that could be mitigated through the use of automation, including congestion. The corridors also include two test-track environments: the Virginia Smart Road, located on-site at the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute; and the Virginia International Raceway."

And that is what is happening this summer – more regulations from the EPA on the reduction of greenhouse gases (medium and heavy truck fuel efficiency standards which are really a part of the Obama Administration Climate Action Plan) and continued,

even accelerated, development of selfdriving cars (or cars that take all the fun out of driving).
