My proxy vote discussion at CVMC's October business meeting resulted in a unanimous yes vote to add a change in the MCA bylaws to add a youth enrollment membership category to the other membership classes. The Proxy was email and received on 11 October in time to be counted at the quarterly MCA Corporate Board of Directors meeting being held in Dallas, Texas.

The electronic on line Board of Directors voting was a huge success. Last year's mail in (snail mail) voting was only 882 votes. This year 1,856 votes were cast and MCA thanks you.

The quarterly MCA Corporate Board of Directors meeting was held on August 3 in Dallas. The meeting opened with a welcome to all National and Regional Directors with attending Officers and Directors roll call, and approval of May 11th minutes. NOVEMBER 2019 Car Hobbyist News From the Council

Be sure to vote on November 5th because elections have consequences. Both houses of the General Assembly are controlled by Republicans but both have razor thin margins. In fact one house race was decided by coin toss and that gave control to the Republicans. A federal court has redrawn 11 districts which favored Republicans but now favor Democrats. This is the reason you are seeing so many TV ads as the Democrats are predicting a "blue wave" to take the General Assembly. Speaking of TV ads, some of the ads are just plain false. It worries me when people will do or say anything to get into public office.

As car hobbyists we have worked with members of both parties to get what we need. The success of the exhaust bill in 2018 is a prime example. All members of the General Assembly

voted for the bill and the governor signed it into law. When you have a good bill with really good reasons to support it you can get everyone to agree.

There are also local elections for offices like Commonwealth Attorney, Sheriff, Commissioner of the Revenue, Treasurer and school board. You should check to see who is running in your locality and decide who you wish to support. And again, be sure to vote!

Last month I wrote about car and truck sales. The figures for the first six months of this year show that sales are down 2.4% from last year. In August sales rebounded some but annual sales could finish the year at 16.9 million. If they do it will be the first time since 2014 that new vehicle sales fell below 17 million. The high cost of new vehicles along with interest rates that are higher than they should be have hurt sales as most people get a loan for new vehicles.

From the Internet: Compact crossovers cool off What's been the hottest segment in the industry for years is on track to shrink in 2019. Sales of compact crossovers are down 4 percent through June. It's still the largest segment in the U.S., but automakers are up against increasing competition for a pool of customers that's no longer growing, which is a potentially troublesome combination. The Nissan Rogue, Ford Escape and Jeep Compass have been the segment's biggest decliners this year.

Pickups picking up steam

There's no sign of slowing momentum for pickups. Full-size pickups rose 1.5 percent in the first half of the year, with Ram taking share from most of its rivals, and the Ford Ranger and Jeep Gladiator pushing midsize pickups to a 15 percent gain.

Subaru's success

The margins haven't been all that big lately, but Subaru has stretched its streak of year-over-year gains to 91 months as of June. If that's not impressive enough, Subaru is now the industry's largest brand that's still growing in the U.S., as all six brands with more market share posted declines in the first half of the year. It's up 5.2 percent on the year.

Korean brands rebound

The Detroit 3's sales declined 3 percent in the first half. Japanese brands were down 3.5

percent, and European manufacturers dipped 1 percent. But Hyundai and Kia, the Korean brands that were struggling mightily as car sales began to plummet in recent years, are up in 2019. And Genesis, Hyundai's luxury spinoff, is the fastest-growing brand in the country, up 38 percent on the year. Hyundai mostly has the Kona subcompact crossover to thank for its resurgence. Kia's three-row Telluride has quickly put up big numbers, and the Genesis G70 is off to a fast start.

Last year

June marked the 12th consecutive month of year-over-year declines for two brands: Chevy and Mazda. Both makes also posted their lowest sales totals in the first half of a year since 2011. The only brands that have posted negative numbers for more than a full year are Mini, Fiat and Smart.

The GM strike has been going on for over a month. There is hope that it may end soon. Some are worried that this will delay production of the new Corvette. From Hagerty: Multiple media outlets have reported that the current United Auto Workers strike will delay the production and launch of the eighth-generation Chevrolet Corvette Stingray. When General Motors and UAW finally reach an agreement, GM will be playing catch-up on current C7 orders; then, its Bowling Green (Kentucky) Assembly Plant will have to be retooled for the C8.

Dealers could submit orders for the C7 through July 18 if the dealer had allocation available, and Bowling Green Assembly was scheduled to begin C8 production later this year. Although a person familiar with the Bowling Green operations told the Detroit Free Press that "this strike is directly going to affect the start of regular production for the mid-engine Corvette," a GM spokesman would not confirm a delay.

"As we've previously stated, Chevrolet Corvette Stingray production begins in late 2019 and convertible production follows in late first-quarter 2020," the spokesman told the Detroit Free Press. "It's too early to speculate on production timing impacts on any of our vehicles due to the UAW work stoppage."

In other bad news NASCAR is looking at running hybrids by 2022. In fact, they are also looking at electric racecars for the future. "We travel the

world visiting other sanctioning bodies and are not ignorant to the fact that the world's going towards more hybrid technology," NASCAR's senior vice president for racing development John Probst told TechCrunch. Probst said NASCAR is "pushing to go full electric," too. But the association is taking things one step at a time. Its Next-Gen race car just completed its first on-track tests and is set to debut at the 2021 Daytona 500. It will release its Next-Gen race car guidelines in 2021. Then, we'll likely see some type of hybrid tech. NASCAR isn't alone in this push. IndvCar is planning to switch to 900-horsepower hybrids in 2022 as well. The bottom line is enjoy those ICE (internal combustion engines) as long as you can. Keep in mind president candidate Bernie Sanders has stated he wants to establish a \$2.09 trillion grant program for low- and moderate-income families and small businesses to trade in used internalcombustion engine cars for new electric cars. The program would limit participants to electric vehicles built in America.
