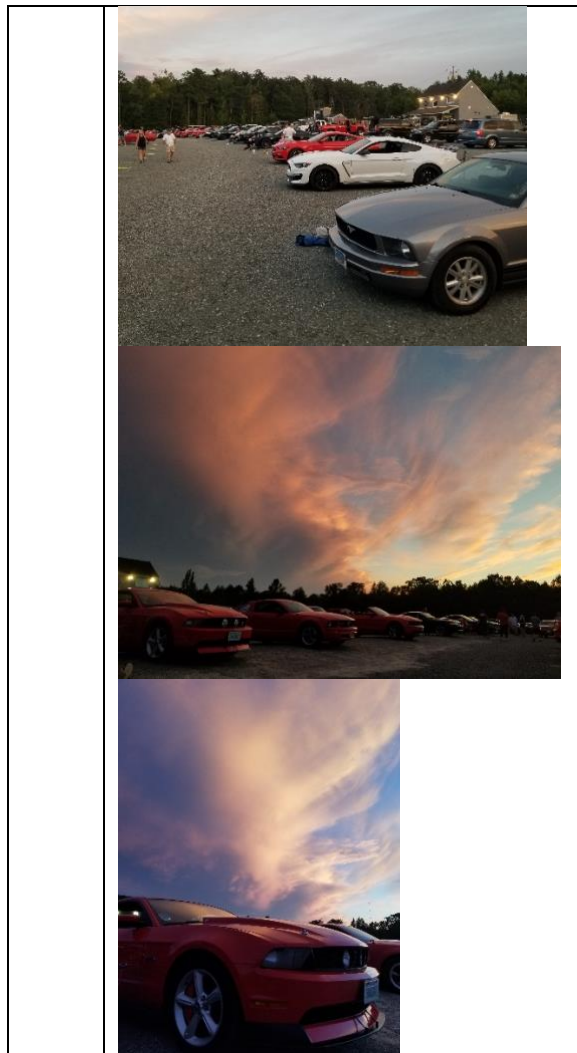

MCA REPORT

2020 has been an unpleasant year for MCA. Most of their major shows were either canceled or rescheduled as was the Spirit of the West National show to October 8 to 11 in Tucson, Arizona. Only 1 major Board of Directors (BOD) meeting was held in Florida in January to install the new board members. Any new business requiring large contracts or money has to be approved by an in person board quorum meeting. Membership and money is down. Ford has funded MCA, which is fantastic. The 1st quarterly BOD's meeting of 2020 is *now* scheduled to be held after the October 8 to 11th show in Tucson. All the other BOD meetings were officially cancelled. There will need to be an MCA in person quorum at the October meeting to vote on any large expenditure's.

After a US Postal delay and resubmitting our Presidents award application it has finally been received at MCA Headquarters the last of July

- The Nominations for the Board of Directors will be published in September's Mustang Times with pictures and their experiences. Please review those individuals that have volunteer their time to help run our million dollar corporation and vote for that individual you believe is qualified to do the job. Last year's experiment with digital voting was a success and I assume it will, again, take place.

In 2021 MCA will celebrate our 45th anniversary April 9 to 11, hopefully, with a celebration at Road Atlanta in Georgia. Stay tuned for more information as it becomes available. There will not be a Grand National in 2021.

- May 28 to 30, Golden Hills Mustang Club, Suisun City, California
- June 4 to 5, Eureka Springs, Arkansas. This is the rescheduled show from May 29 to 31, 2020
- July 23 to 25, at Overland Park Convention Center in Kansas City, Kansas
- September 3 to 5, The Grand Stampede, in Mustang, Oklahoma

Check here or in Mustang Times as more information becomes available.

Registration for the above shows as well as Hotels will be available through the MotoSho system when it comes back on line later this year.

I notified MCA our September 19th fall show listed, in August Mustang Times, has been cancelled. Also our fall show has been cancelled in the Car Club Council of Virginia calendar website.

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SEPTEMBER 2020 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

The General Assembly began their special session called by the governor on August 18. You can view all of the introduced bills and resolutions at this link <https://lis.virginia.gov/cgi-bin/legp604.exe?202+lst+ALL>

I spotted three bills that were auto related. In fact the very first bill introduced was HB 5001 and it deals with the current situation at DMV. Here is the bill summary: HB 5001 Motor Vehicles, Department of; customer service centers hours of operation: Requires all Department of Motor Vehicles customer service centers to be open and accept walk-in customers six days a week between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. This requirement expires upon the expiration or revocation of all states of emergency declared by the Governor related to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

If you have gone to the DMV website and tried to get an appointment then you know why this bill is important. It can take weeks and even months to get a DMV in person appointment. I know of one person who needed to get a title transferred after buying a car and was given an appointment in October. Of course you can mail in a title – and DMV could lose it. DMV requires people who buy a car from a non-title state to mail in the docs and then DMV will process and mail you a title. I know three people who have purchased a vehicle from a non-title state and mailed in the docs. DMV lost ALL THREE of the people's paperwork. And even if you do mail in a title DMV will take at least a month to get to it. Not good if you'd like to get some tags and drive what you just bought. Bottom line if other states' DMV offices can be open then so can Virginia. California, which was

hit harder by the virus than Virginia, actually has some open walk right in DMV centers.

This bill is in the House which has gone to online meetings. There have been some technical problems plus no citizen or lobbyist will be able to contact members about legislation except by email which is easy to ignore. The House leadership – unlike the Senate – decided to do everything online and then voted for \$210 per diem for lodging. That makes sense if they were meeting in person in Richmond but they are on a computer screen at their home. Some members of the House are refusing to take the money. The other two auto-related bills are:

HB 5004 Driver's licenses; discretionary requirement to conduct ceremony when issuing to person under 18: Makes discretionary the requirement to conduct a formal, appropriate ceremony when issuing original driver's licenses to persons under the age of 18.

SB 5011 Motor vehicle safety inspection program; abolishing state program, etc: Abolishes the state motor vehicle safety inspection program.

I find it strange that the inspection bill has been re-introduced right after it just failed in the regular session. I don't know of anyone who supports this measure. Using the link in the first paragraph you can check and follow this special session's bills and resolutions. I encourage all citizens to look at all the introduced legislation to see where the Assembly members want to take our state.

On September 26th we will hopefully have the first Breakthrough Car Show and a celebration of the council's 25 years as an advocate for car hobbyists. The council was formed to monitor the state's clunker bill that allowed the scrapping of old vehicles to allow stationary polluters credits. We got that bill repealed and since then the council has been successful in getting legislation that is friendly to car hobbyists along with having the best calendar of hobbyist events. The council has been instrumental in expanding the hobby and helping hobbyists earn the good reputation they have now and that has certainly helped with getting the legislation we have needed. I invite you to participate in this event. We've missed a lot of events this year due to the virus restrictions and all the rain we've experienced this year. It's time to come out and
