40th ANNUAL MUSTANG AND FORD FALL SHOW

Out of 158 available spaces, we had only 4 unfilled empty spaces at the time of the show. They were quickly purchased as cars began to roll in. The weather was fantastic, certainly not as warm as last year. It was a bit humid, becoming cloudy in the late afternoon, with thunderstorms and sprinkles inching closer as the show ended at 4 PM.

Jason Wood returned as our DJ for the show. We experimented with a new location for his trailer and sound equipment placing it along the curb parallel to the street. He was in what were spaces 67, 68, 69 and 70. Those spaces were relocated in the center area in front of the registration tent. Jason relocated the speakers along the curb with extensions further into the parking lot. It is difficult to set the sound loud enough for folks to hear far away without being extensively loud to those closest to the speaker(s).

We had a full vendor area that included our regulars of Bass Pro Shops (hot dogs, chips and soda), Bright Mod Auto Detailing, Shenandoah Diecast and Sprouse Concessions. First-time vendors included Richlands Creamery, Cub Scout Pack 706 and Aimee Malloy State Farm Insurance.

Former CVMC member Doug Andrews from the Virginia State Police coordinated the presentation of the new Ford Mustang State Police Car with State Trooper Brooke Martin. She provided highlights of the vehicle and its use with the car being assigned to her. A Ford F150 was emblazed with HEAT for Help Eliminate Automobile Theft. Ben, Doug and Brooke toured the show field whereby Brooke selected a 1968 Shelby Mustang GT500 KR Candy Apple Red fastback in space 105 as her "Trooper Favorite." She congratulated the owners of Jack & Carolyn Sarver during the awards ceremony.

The Ford Merchandise Trailer returned this year. Suzi drove the truck herself and solely sold the merchandise. I thanked her for her dedication, we really enjoy having <a href="https://doi.org/10.108/j.com/no.108/

I offer my gratitude to the volunteers who supported setup, registration, parking, judging and cleanup! I am duly proud of the show that our club presents. I had several friends visit during the day who were very happy with the show. I received several emails and text messages stating they will come again and bring their families too.

In recognition of the club's 40^{th} anniversary, Sharon Hazelgrove purchased a sheet cake from BJs that was truly delicious. A plethora of memorabilia was presented on a table protected with plexiglass for everyone to review. Items included printed materials, tee shirts, dash plaques, a trophy and magnets.

The CVMC member designed and produced show shirts were very successful. We sold 91 shirts, and had a few orders taken at the show. Show shirt orders can still be ordered on our merchandise site: https://cvmc-merchandise.cheddarup.com

This year's 50/50 raffle was a gigantic success. Jason Wood, our DJ, continued to inform the crowd of the rising amount during the day. In the end, the total was \$1,330 which yielded a prize of \$665 to the winner during the awards ceremony.

Chris Evans and his fellow volunteer judges scored twelve (12) cars with zero deductions. This made the selection of the 'best of show award' challenging. After reviewing the best six, Anthony Cruz's 2006 Black Ford Mustang GT Convertible took home best of show.

Mustang Club of America report:

We have received the MCA 2024 Presidents award which can be viewed on our website.

I hope the full MCA directors report gave you a better idea of how our elected officers and directors conduct our quarterly business Board of Directors meetings. The next quarterly meeting will take place in Las Vegas, Nevada on October 18, 2025

The pictures and bios of those volunteer members who have chosen to run are in August's issue of Mustang Times on pages 30 to 33. This is your club, please review the bios and decide who you think is best qualified to help run our large organization and cast your vote. Those MCA club members should have received their ballot via September's email with voting instructions stating that the ballots MUST be turned in by midnight September 30th, 2025.

In 2005 I was asked to take over as CVMC's Regional Director (RD) as he, I believe, was leaving town. I had absolutely no training except having attended many MCA shows with Judi's 1967 Mustang and earning many MCA Gold/Silver awards in the late 1980-90's to the last one at Fredericksburg's Grand National in 2019. I have been creating the MCA Presidents application and earning that award for the club for the last 19 years. I believe CVMC has a member more capable of doing the same thing and I would enjoy teaching that individual how to do it. It's not hard, just remembering to document all our clubs activities for the entire year. The required documentation makes it easy to answer the 17 items that require at least the 100 points on the application template. I have really had fun documenting all our clubs awards and listing all our clubs events thru the years. If I am able, with the clubs help, to earn the 20th continuous award, that will be the last club award for me.

The following long email (I edited to shorten it) was sent to CVMC by MCA's National Office Administrator to explain some of the duties of the Regional Director (RD) that are not covered in the MCA By-laws, or CVMC By-laws, at this time, that I was not unaware of:

A Regional Director's (RD) primary duty is to function as the liaison between the Regional Club and the National Organization (MCA):

(RD) is responsible for providing the National club the yearly updates of members of the local club. This update is required by March 1st of each year and should include the names of all local club members whether they are MCA members or not. Local members that also belong to MCA should have their membership number included in this report.

(RD) should know that if his/her club update is NOT complete <u>and</u> approved by the MCA office by March 1st their club will NOT receive any regional benefits for the current year. Yearly benefits include insurance certificates for car shows, show kits, and President Award

(RD) should know that his/her regional club must update every year to ensure that their regional club can remain in good standing with the MCA. Good standing means that your club update includes at least 10 VALID/CURRENT MCA members that are included in

their club roster that is due in the MCA office by the March 1st deadline.

(RD) should make every effort to become informed about issues with the National club. The Regional Director's report on National items of interest should be a part of the agenda for local club meetings to keep the general membership informed.

(RD) should promote membership in the MCA at each local meeting and every local show and keep the club informed of the 4 tiered MCA membership structure and the benefits they can receive as an MCA member. (RD) should be instrumental in preparing the application

(RD) should be instrumental in preparing the application for the MCA President's award each year.

(RD) is also a member of the National Board of Directors

of the Mustang Club of America and has the same rights as a National Director in the conduct of business of the Mustang Club of America to include presenting motions and voting.

(RD) to regularly attending National Board of Director meetings and take an active part in the running of the Mustang Club of America. To that end the Regional Club should support their Regional Directors' effort to fill the role. This includes monetary support where possible such as helping defer cost of attending the National Board of Director meetings, and the annual Regional Directors' Summit. (In 2013 I traveled to Texas and acquired a lot of knowledge.)

(RD) should be the main contact to submit requests for insurance for the regional club's car shows. (CVMC has always purchased their own event (show) Insurance policies. I do not do this.)

(RD) must be a current <u>digital</u> or <u>standard</u> MCA member and can vote for their regional club in the MCA <u>Executive Election</u> (President, V.P., etc.) which happens every 2 years. Also <u>all club</u> officer's need to be a current MCA member with a <u>digital</u> or <u>standard</u> membership.
(RD) is responsible for training the new director if your term is ending. Maintain good records including procedures and contacts to pass on to the new director.

September's issue of "Mustang Times" covers the MCA National show in Cincinnati, Ohio with beautiful colored pictures, commentary, and award list, pages16 to 27 in addition to several human interest stories.

For our new members you can join MCA on line. There are 4 different tier levels (1 for overseas country membership) discussed in MCA's website www.mustang.org. "Mustang Times" magazine is the official club publication, for members only, and included with your membership. The only way you can obtain this distributed magazine is with your membership application. Worldwide membership is over 15,000 and growing. When you join MCA please email me at (67sprint@comcast.net) or Sandy Robbins at (sprobbins57@gmail.com) so we can keep up-to-date on new MCA members for our club President's award of the past 19 years. The magazine has beautiful colored pictures, great stories, Mustang modifications, and information from our President, Jeff Mays; editor, Donald Farr; and the Judges Corner, pages 4, 6 and 8. As a member you can advertise your Ford parts you want to discard, list your Mustang for sale (no charge for advertising) or buy another Mustang listed on pages 78 to 79.

As always check our newsletter, CVMC events calendar, Facebook, and Car Club Council of Central Virginia (CCCCVA) for any upcoming shows or activities.
